As expected with Jupiter being so far off axis, there's not much differentiation between RCP and LCP.

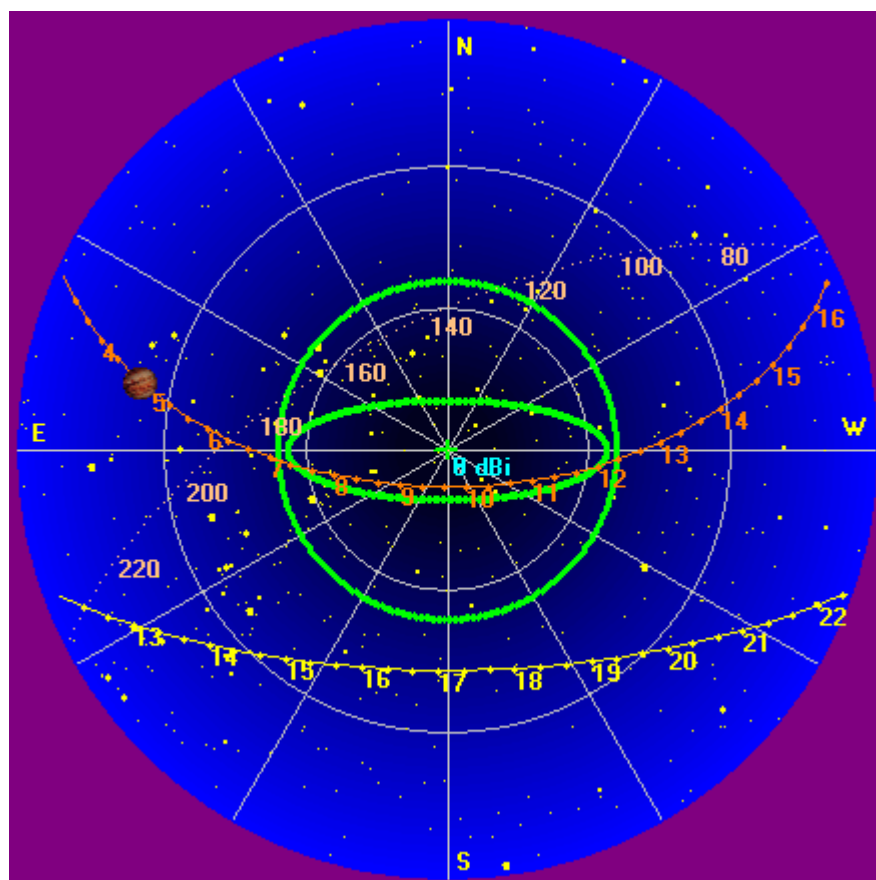
Jupiter was 60° to 70° off axis.

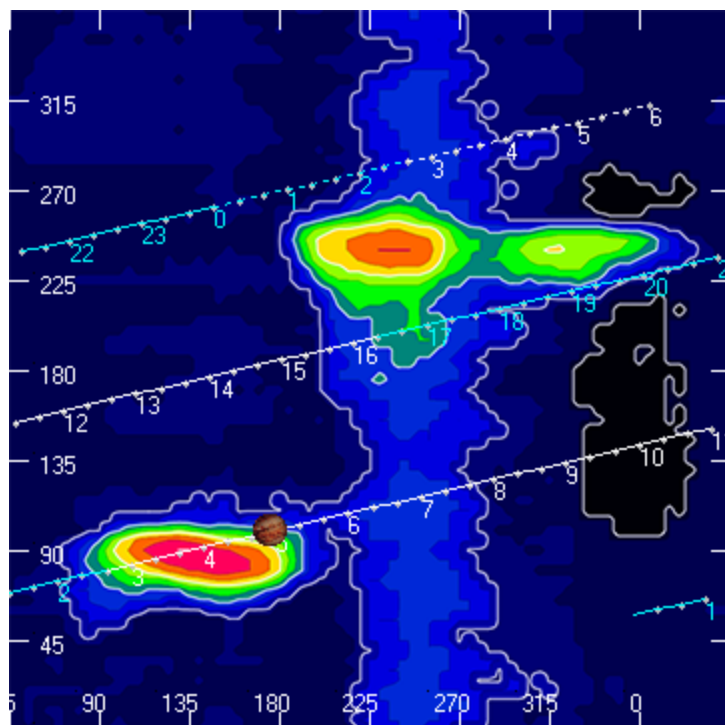
Jupiter was leading the Sun by 116°.

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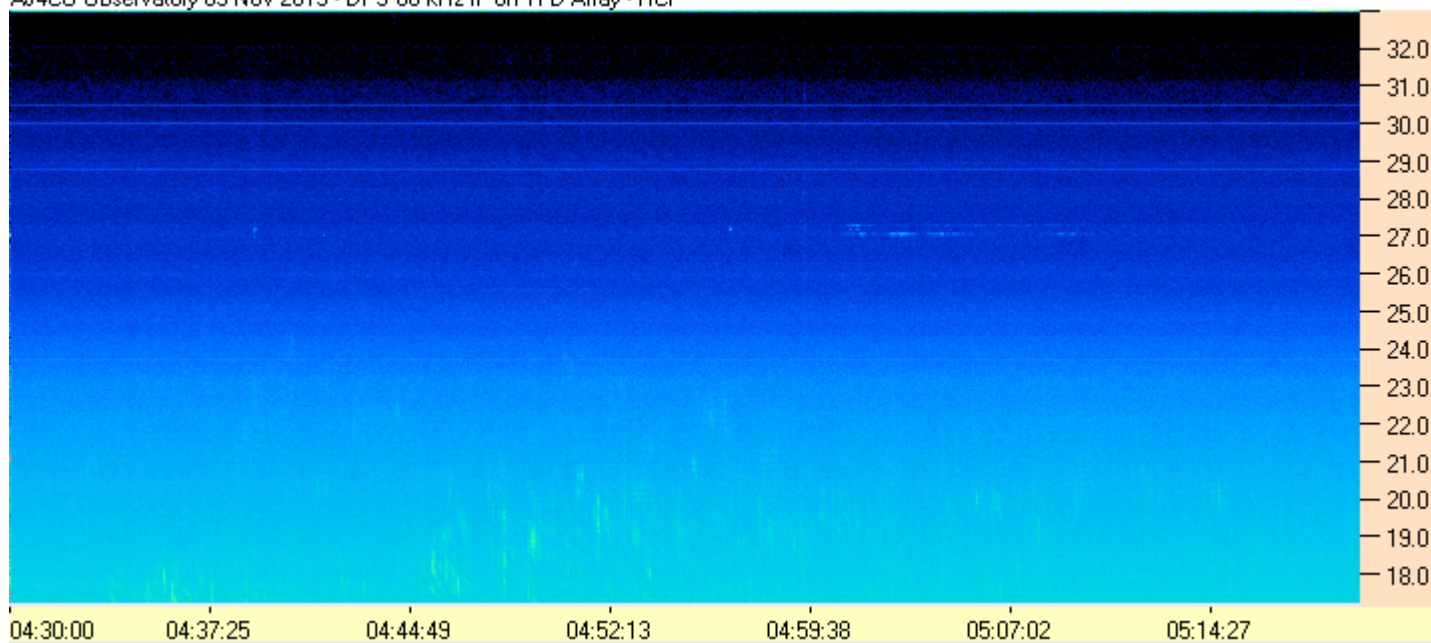

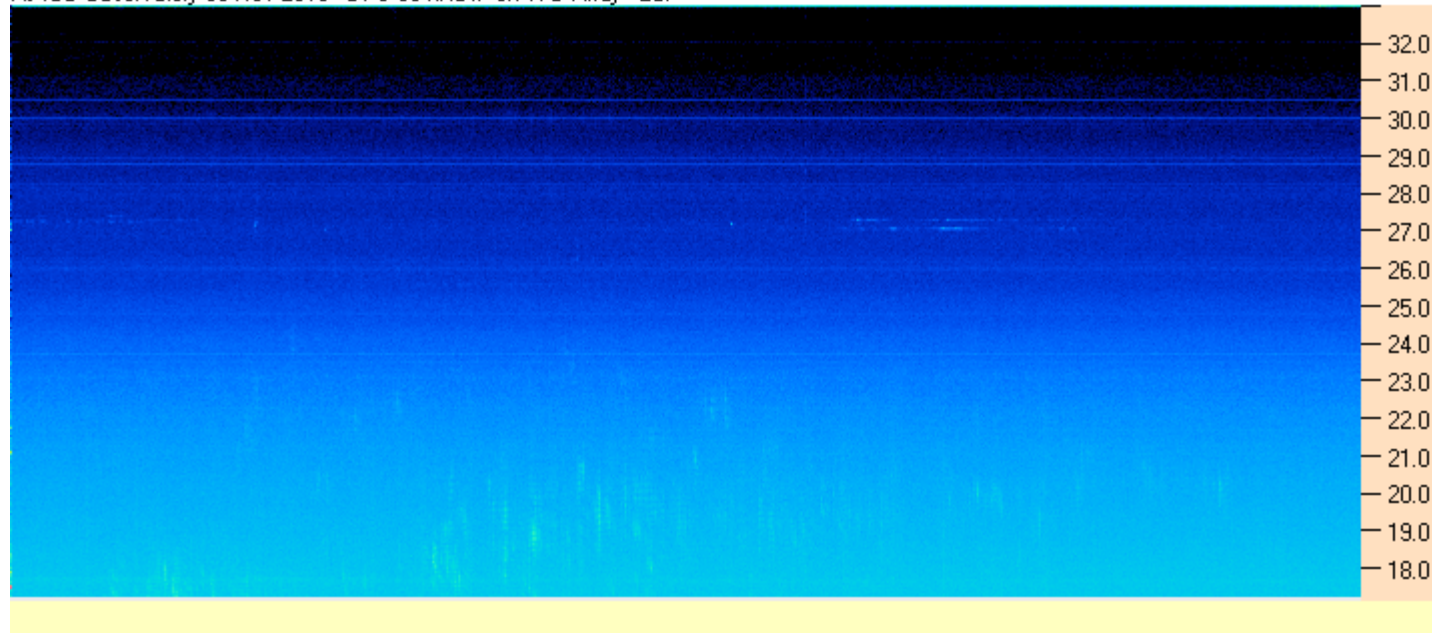




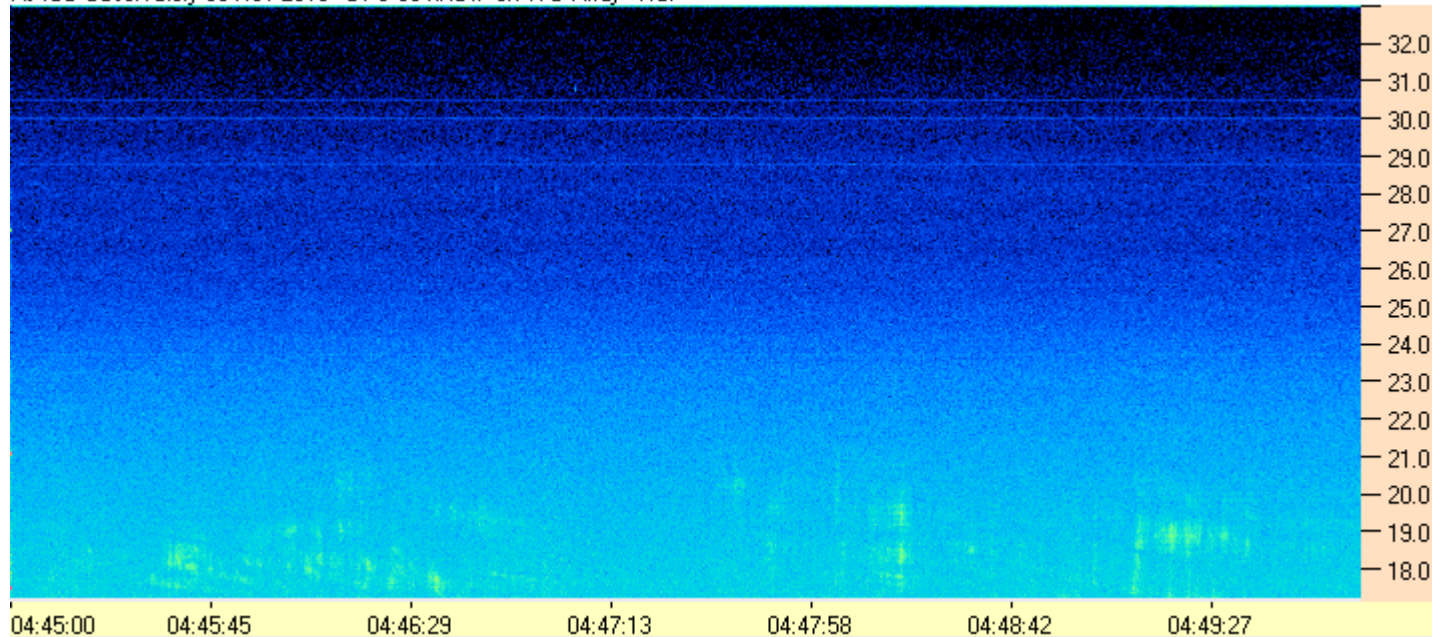
AJ4CD Observatory 09 Nov 2013 - DPS 60 kHz IF on TFD Array - RCP



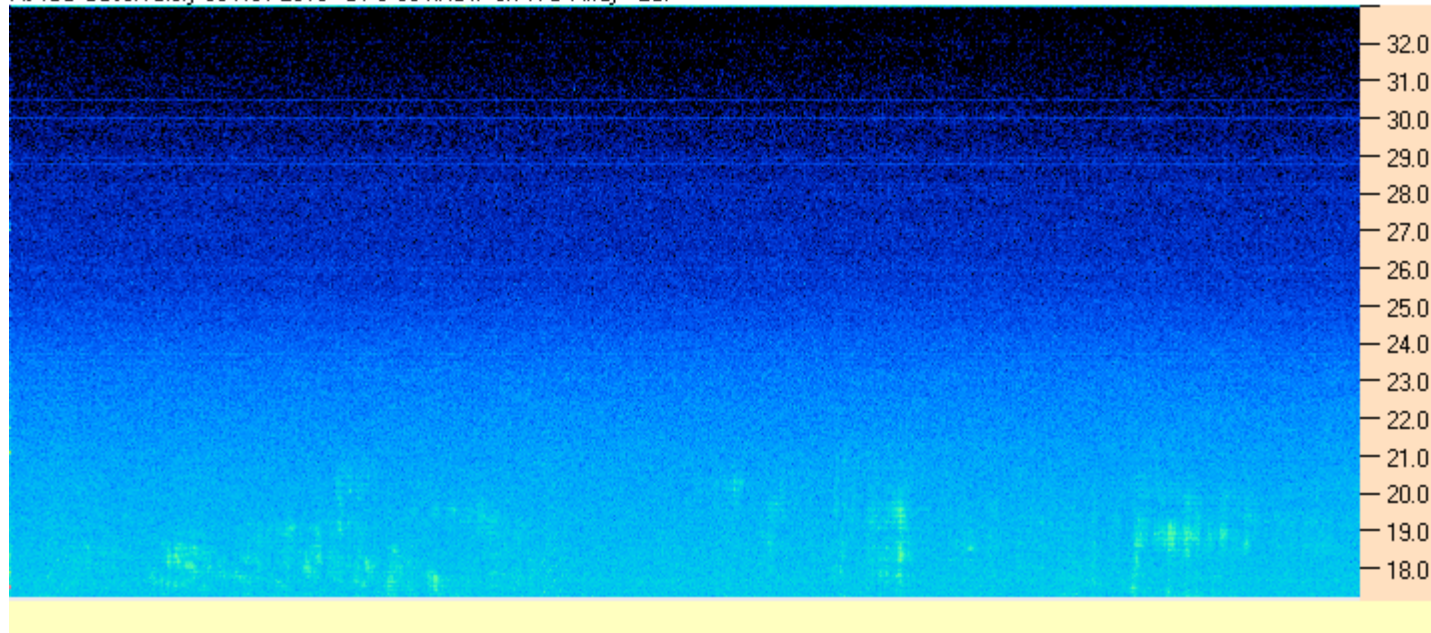
AJ400 Observatory 09 Nov 2013 - DPS 60 kHz IF on TFD Array - LCP



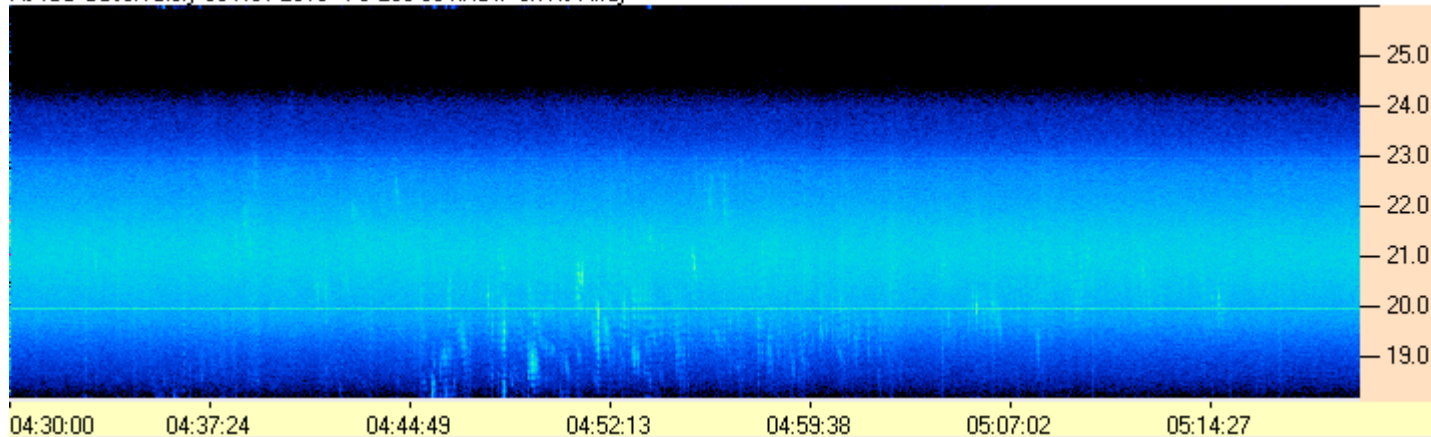
