Primarily RCP. Peak activity between 0800 and 0900. 25 MHz max observed emission frequency. Well defined modulation lanes around 0830.

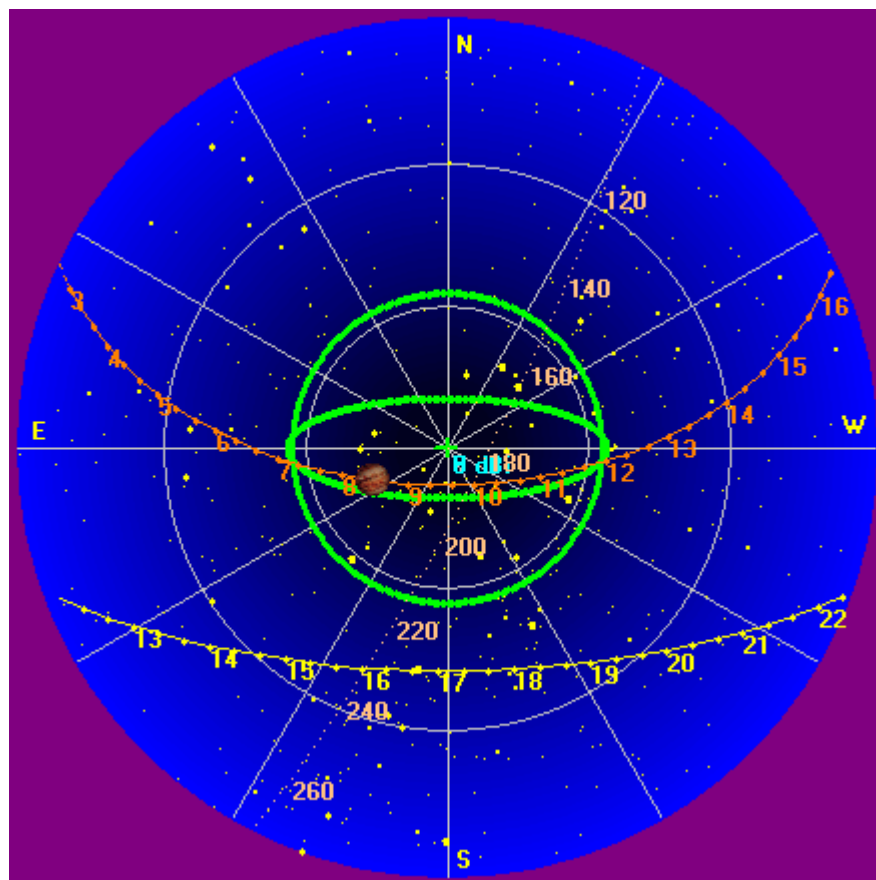
Jupiter was 14° to 36° off axis.

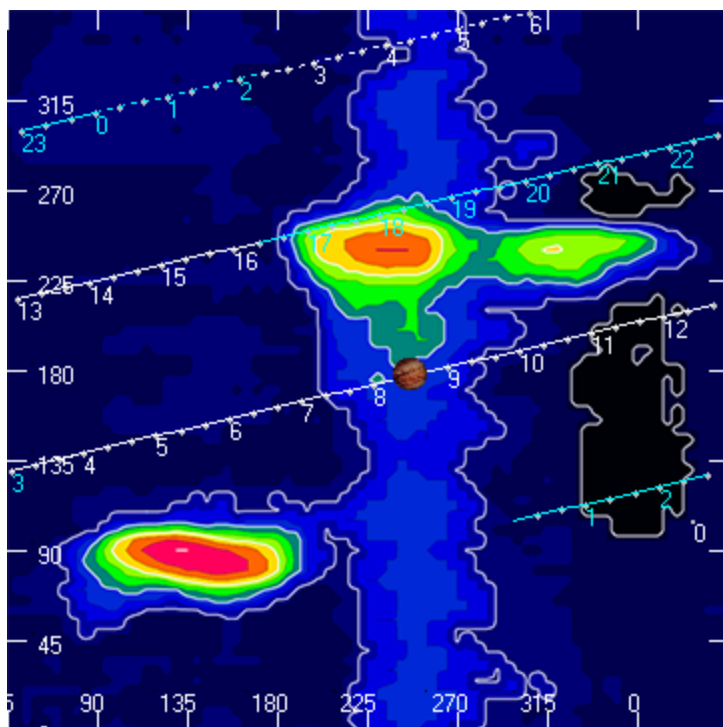
Jupiter was leading the Sun by 119° .

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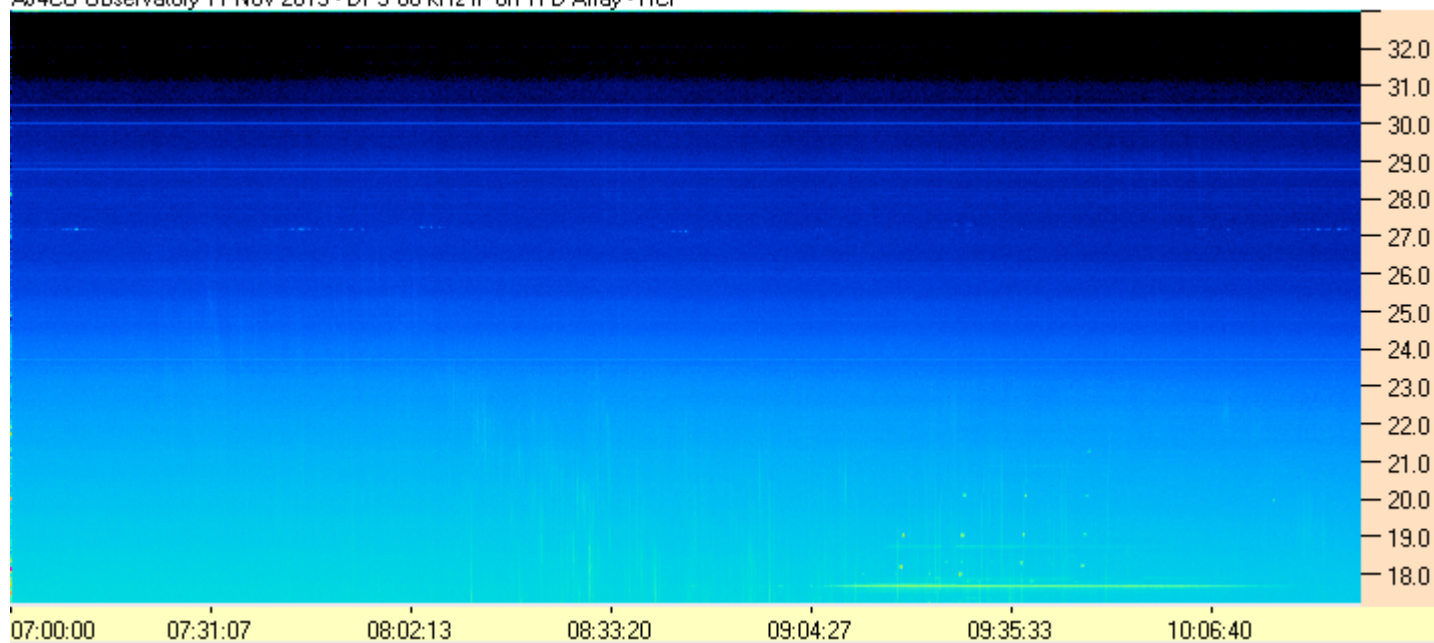

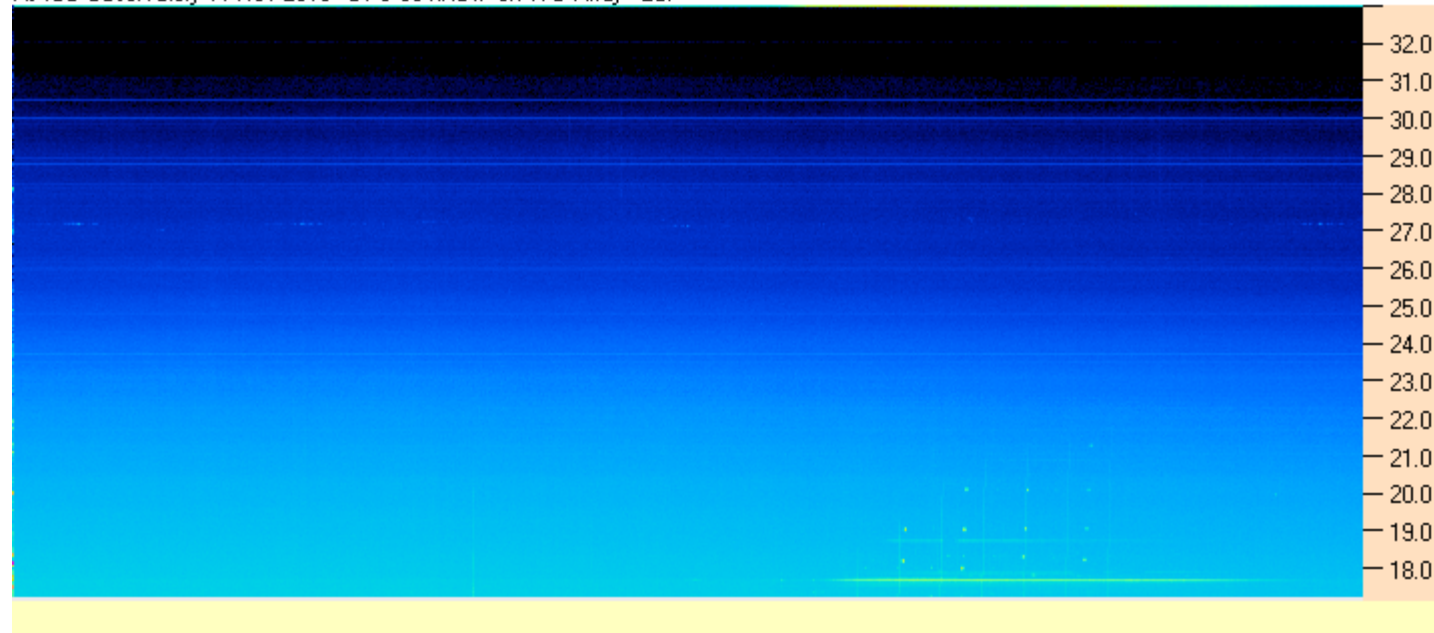




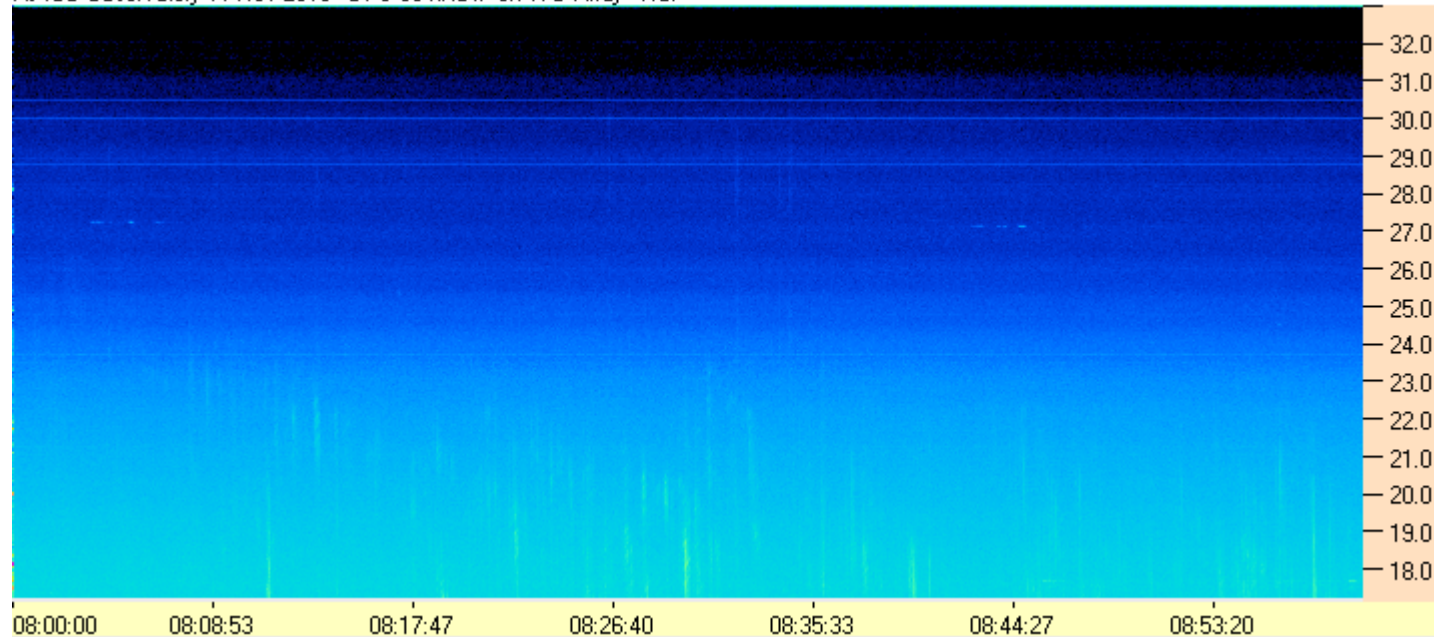
AJ4CD Observatory 11 Nov 2013 - DPS 60 kHz IF on TFD Array - RCP



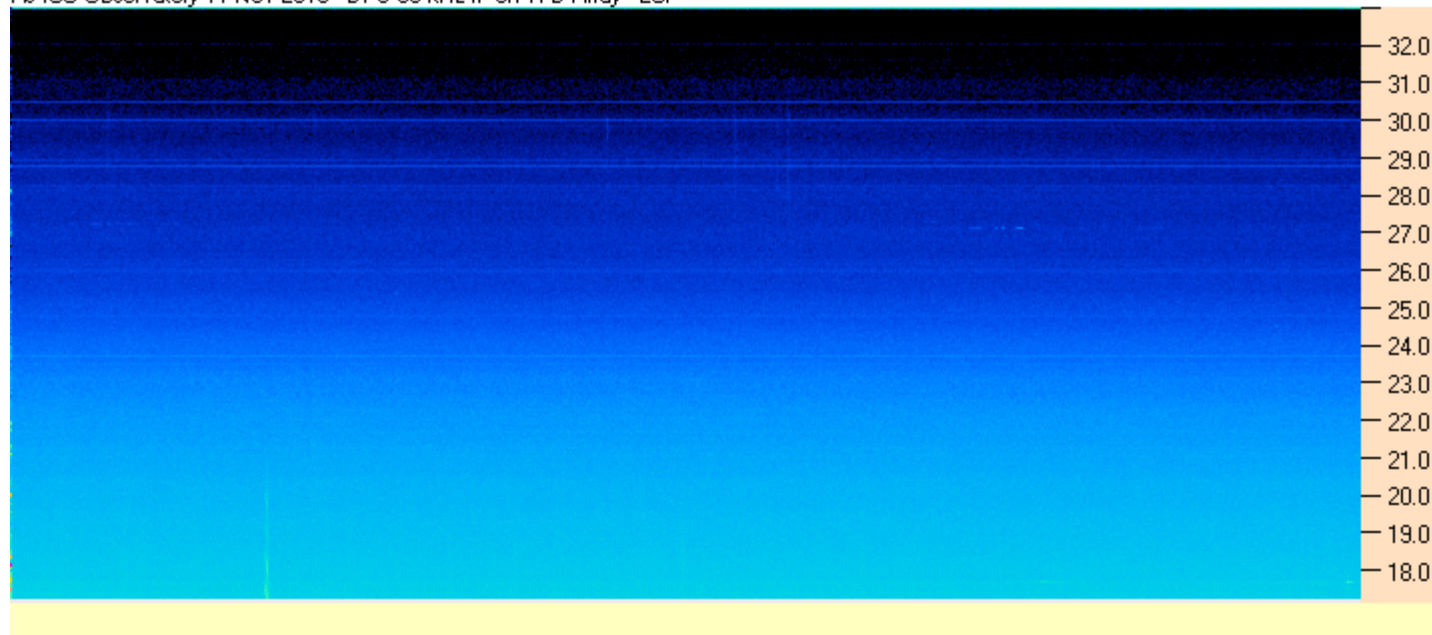
AJ400 Observatory 11 Nov 2013 - DPS 60 kHz IF on TFD Array - LCP



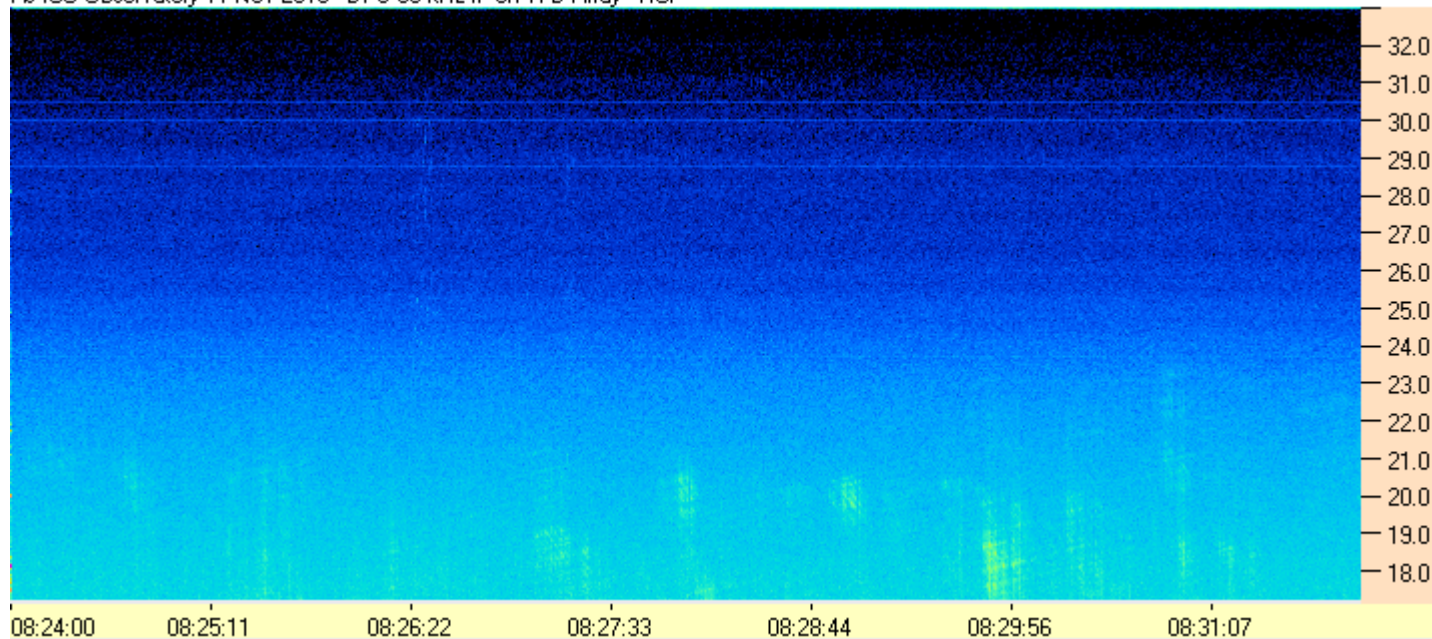
AJ400 Observatory 11 Nov 2013 - DPS 60 kHz IF on TFD Array - RCP



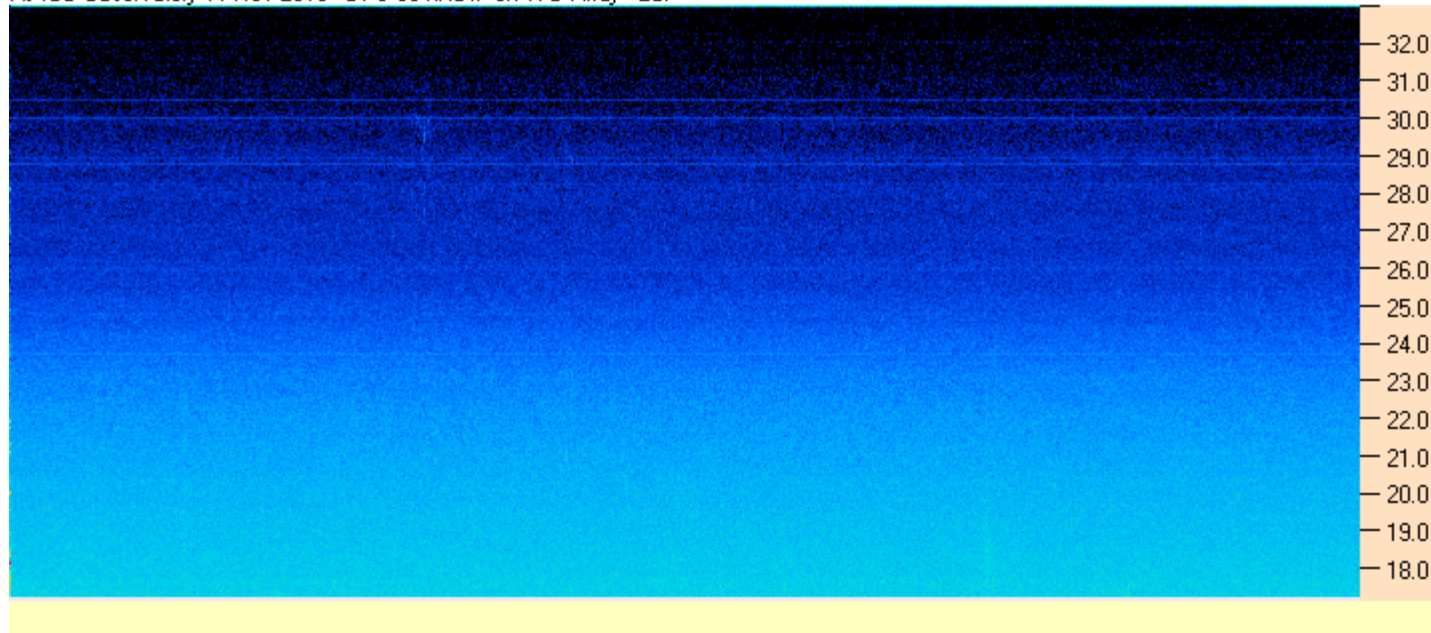

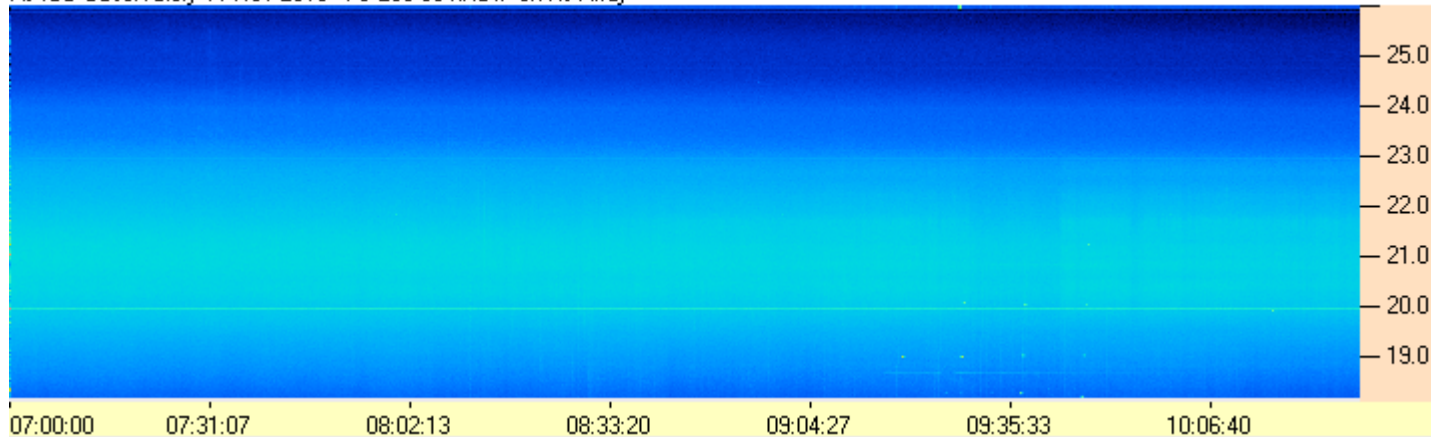

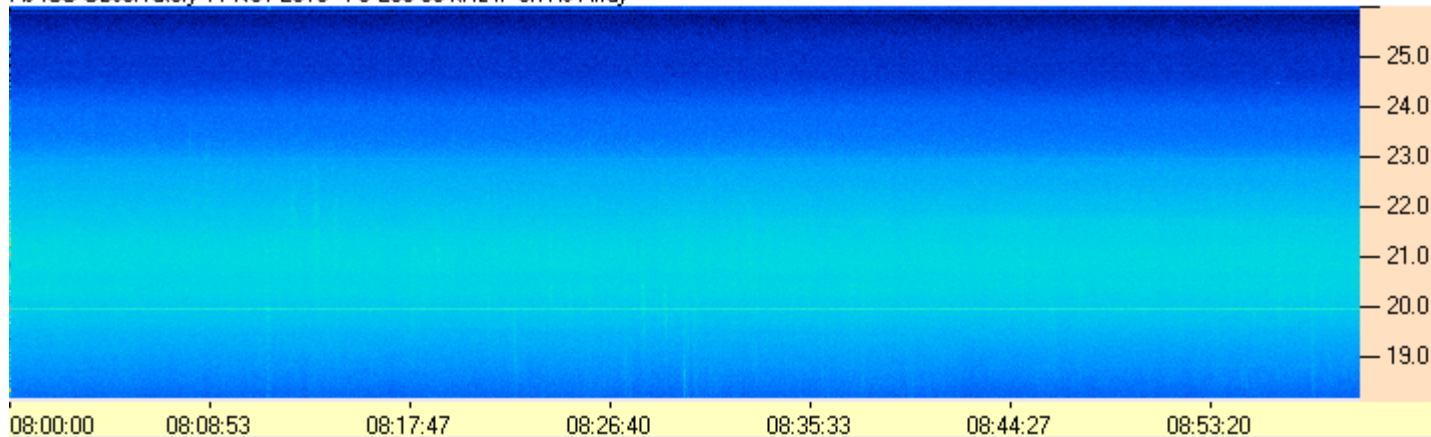
