Interesting mix of RCP and LCP visible from 17 to 32 MHz, but the bulk of it was below 26 MHz.

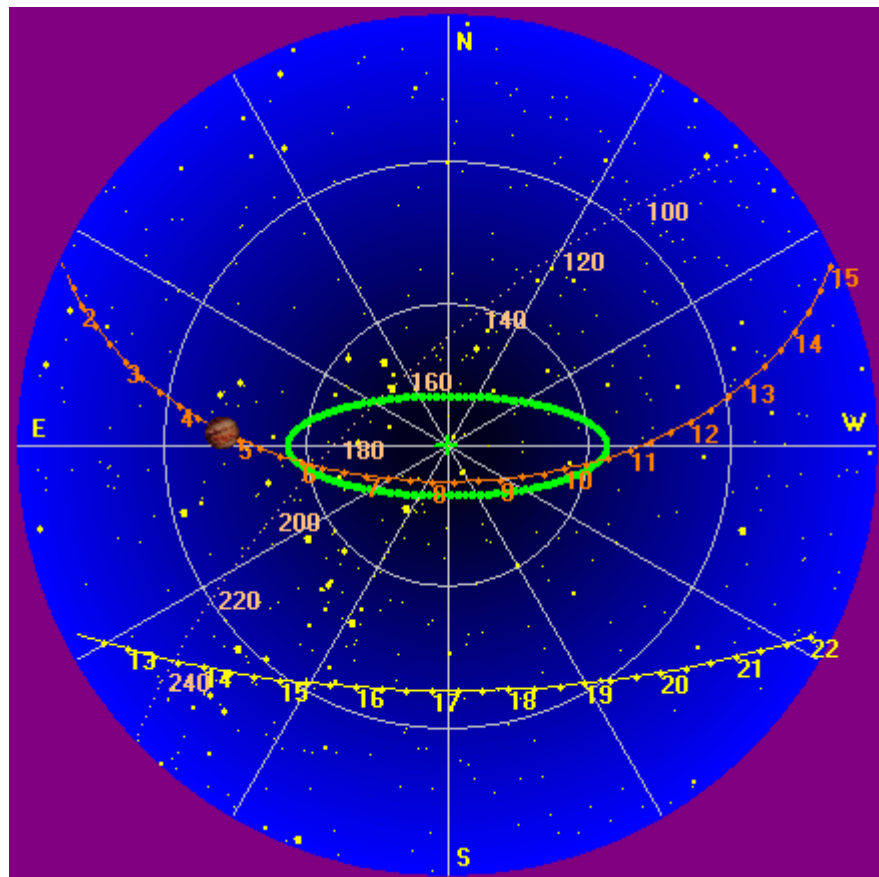
Jupiter was off axis from 51° to 45° .

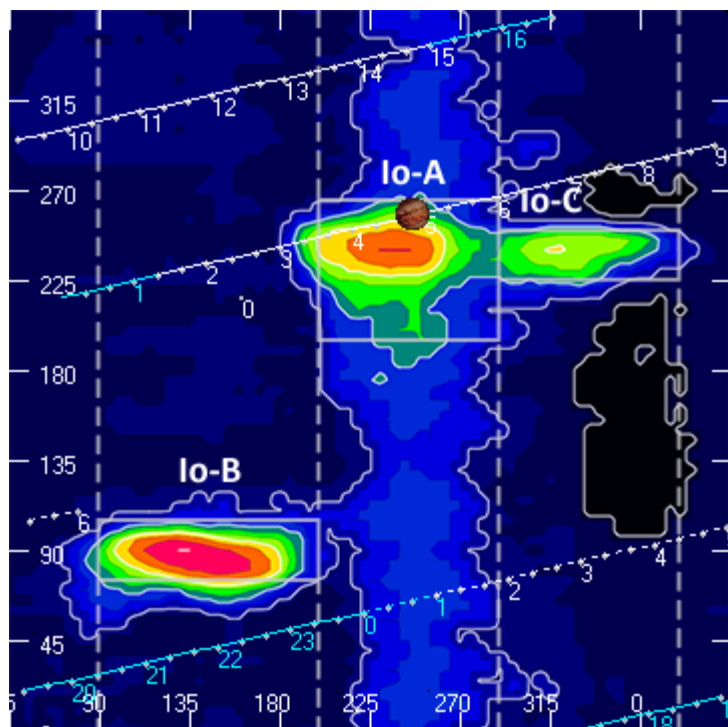
Jupiter was leading the Sun by 140° .

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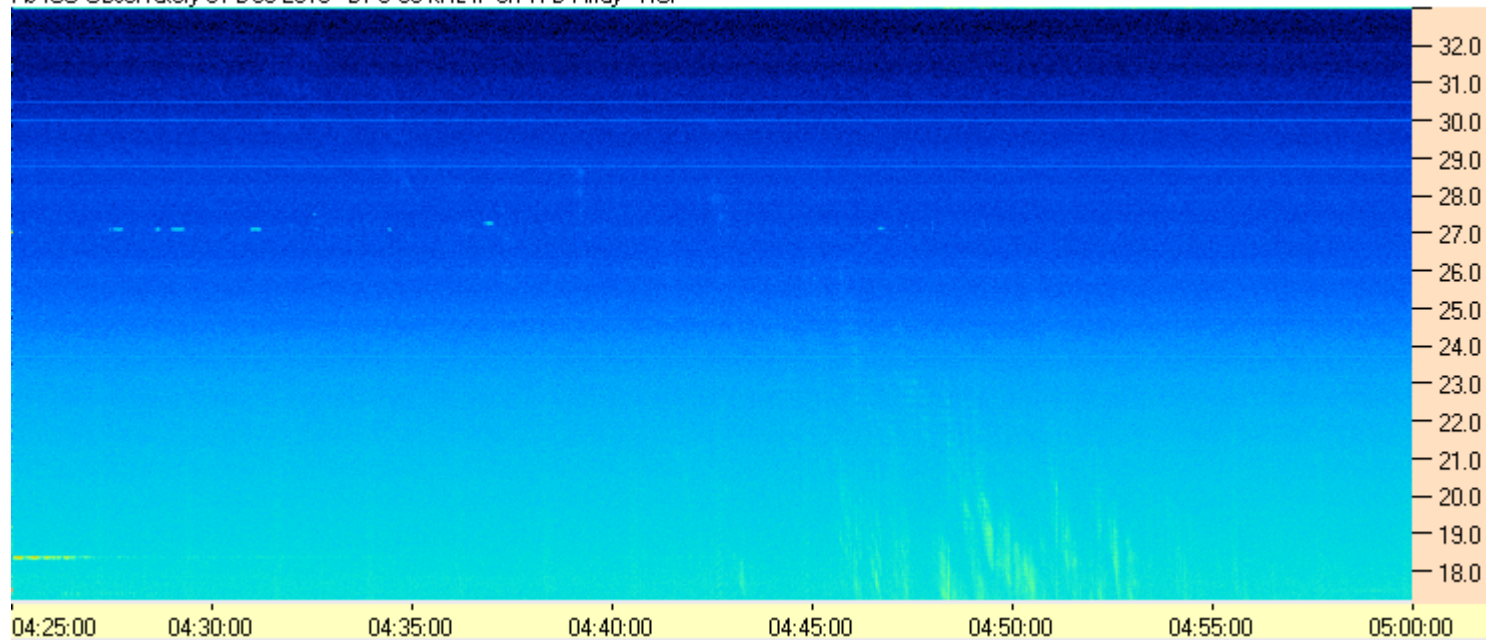

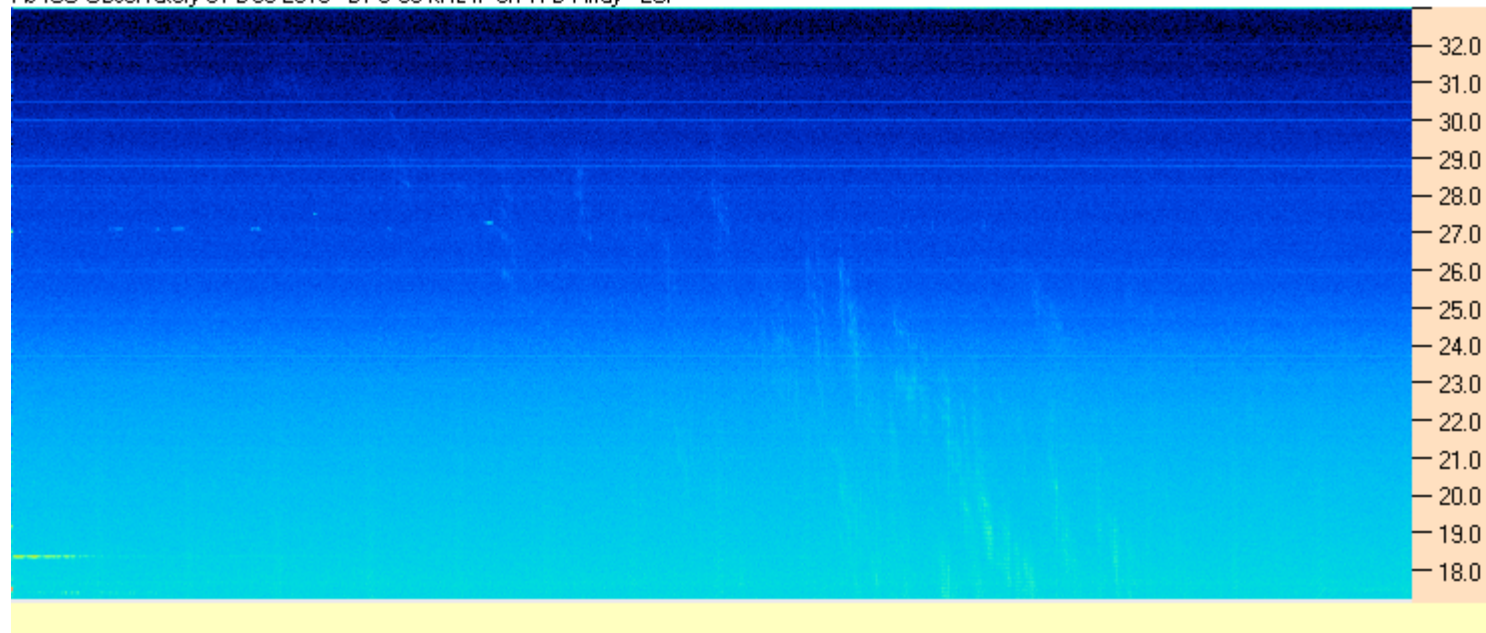




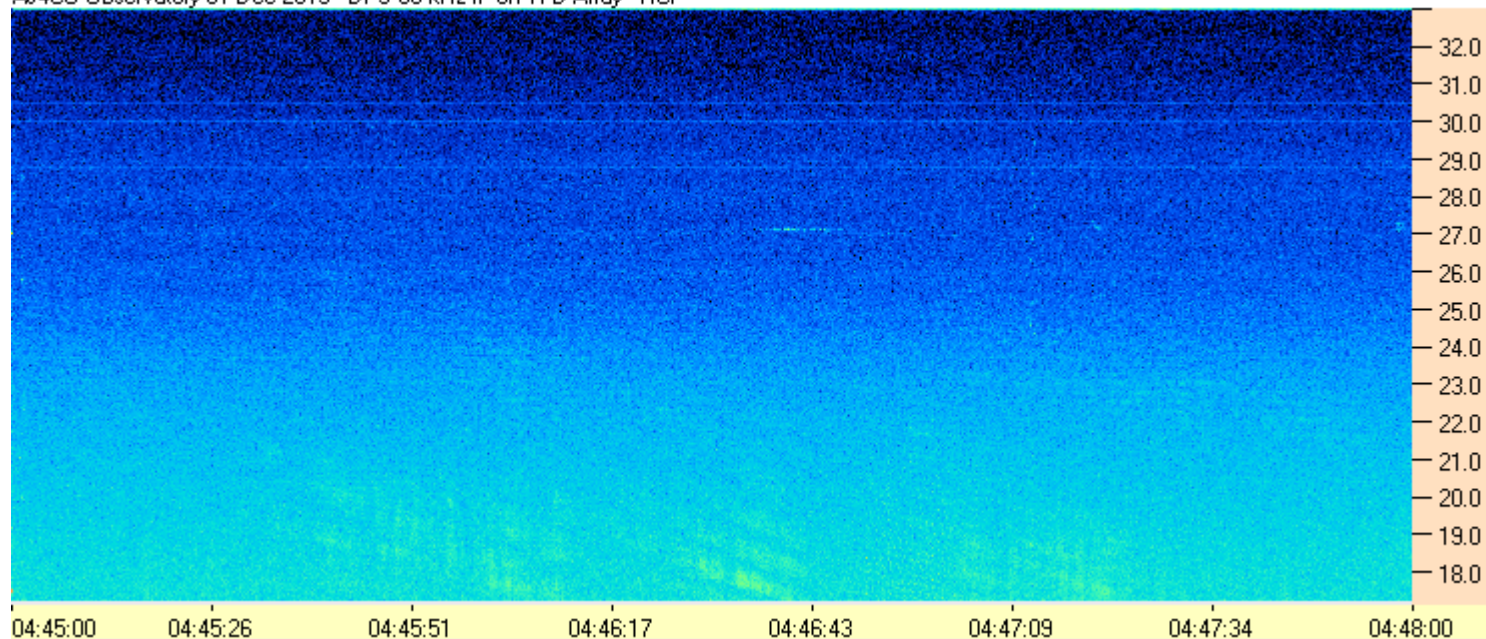
AJ4CO Observatory 01 Dec 2013 - DPS 60 kHz IF on TFD Array - RCP



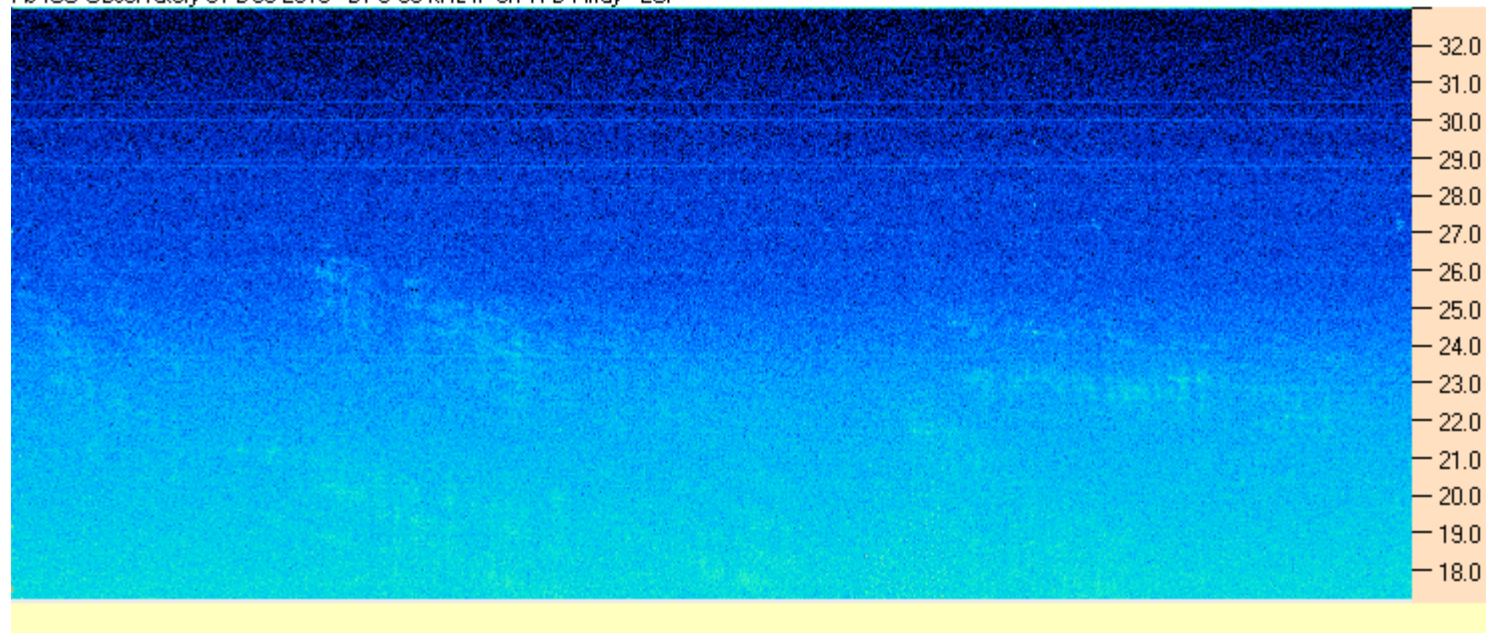
AJ4CO Observatory 01 Dec 2013 - DPS 60 kHz IF on TFD Array - LCP



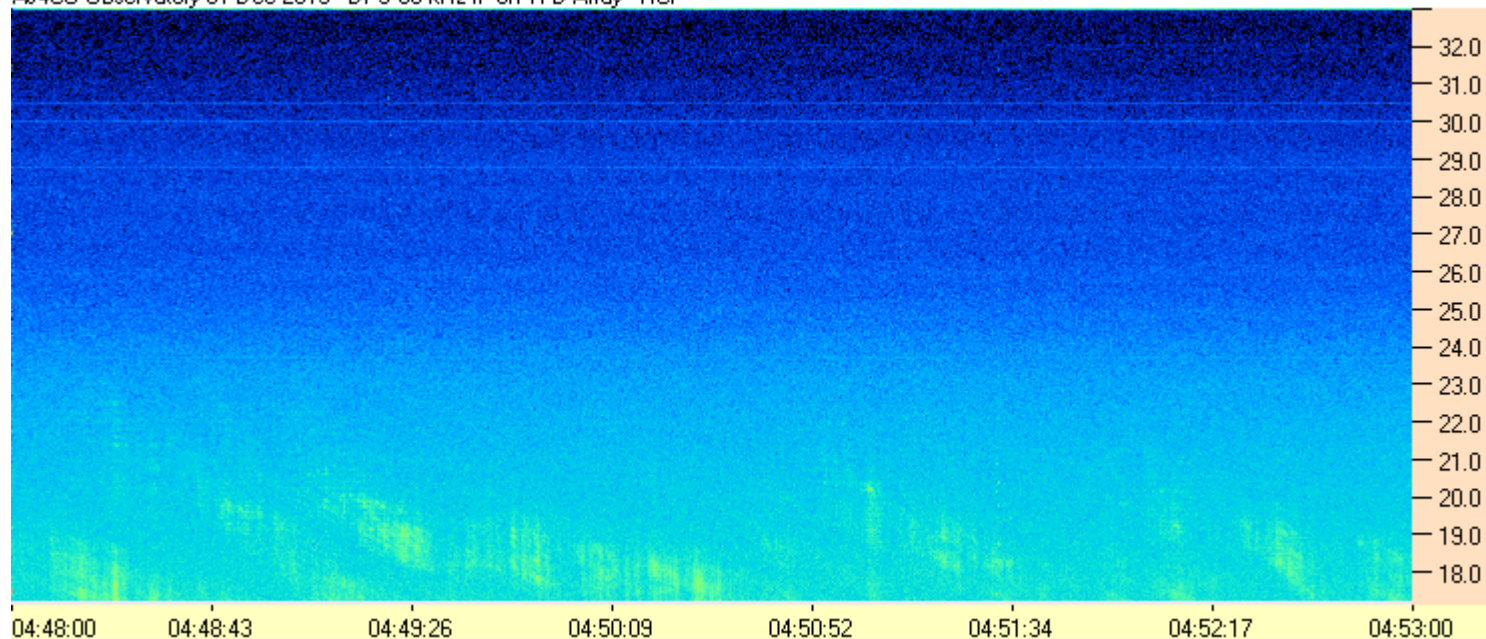

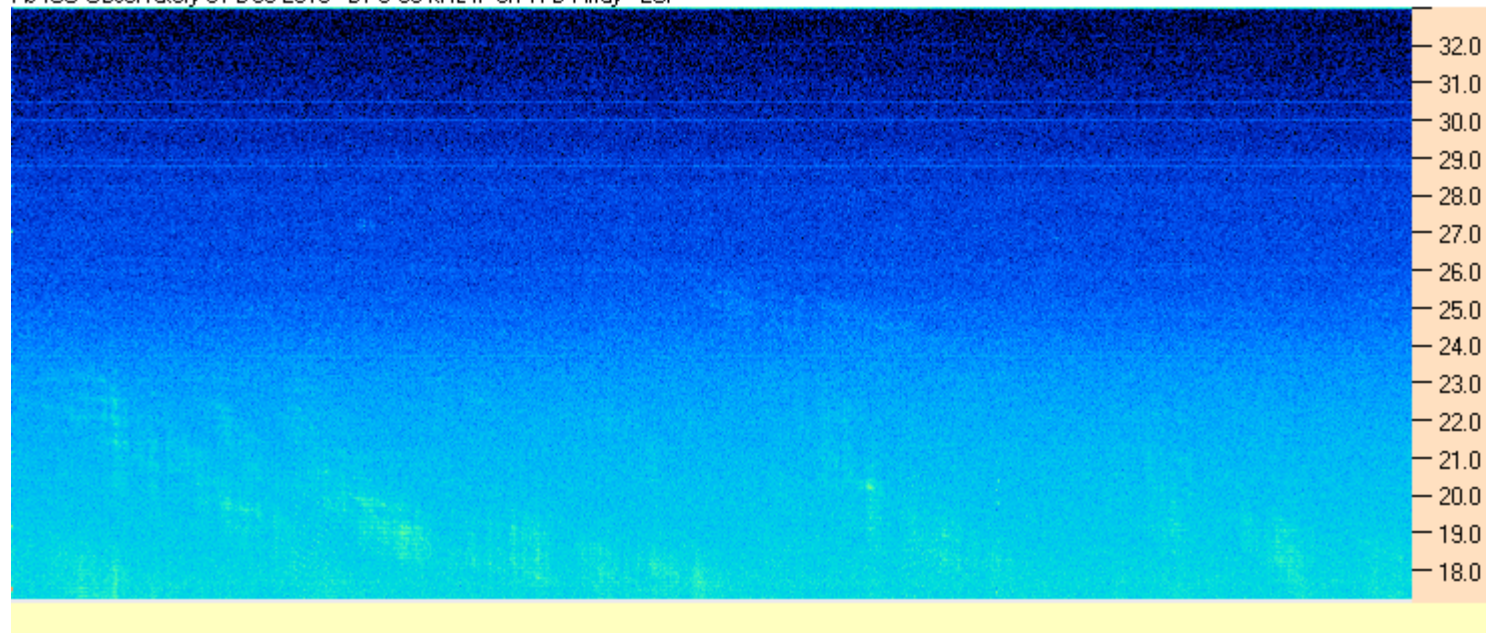

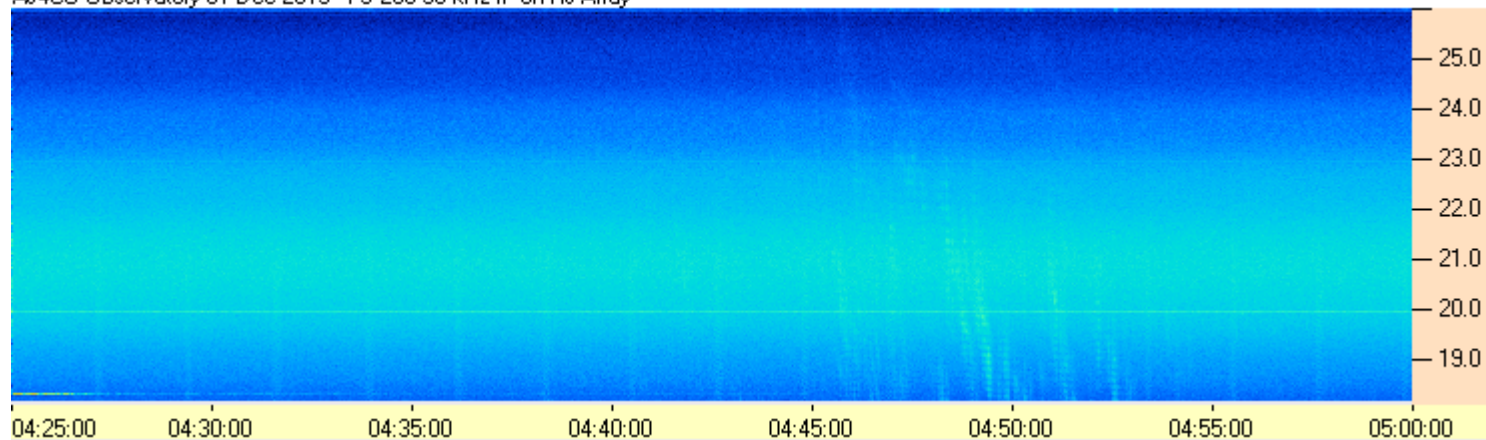

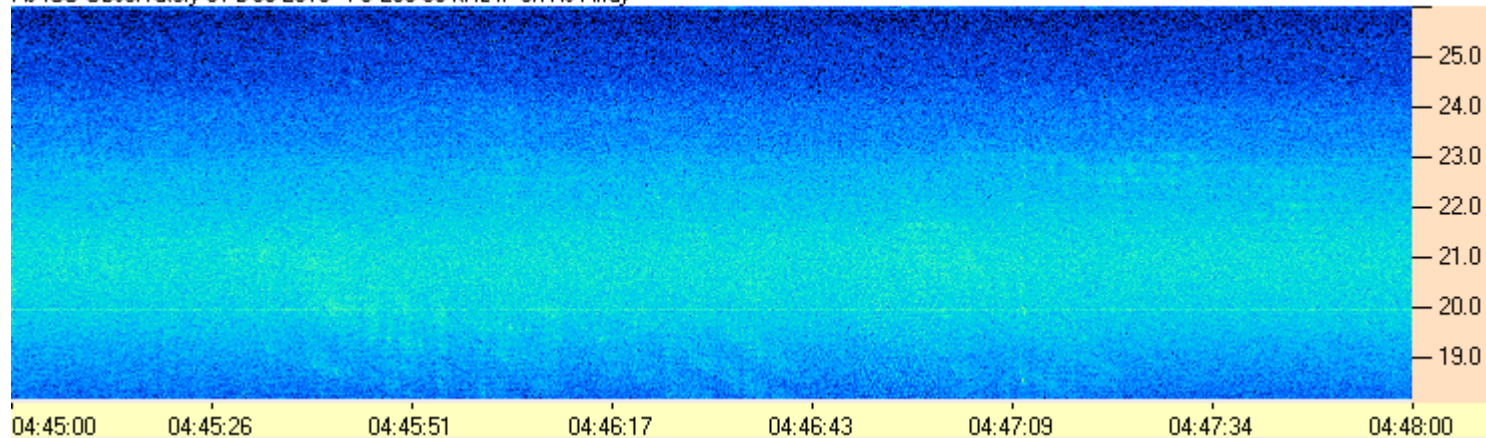
