Thanks to Jim Brown's eagle eye, here's some weak non-Io-A/C from this morning. RCP L bursting from 18 to 20 MHz.

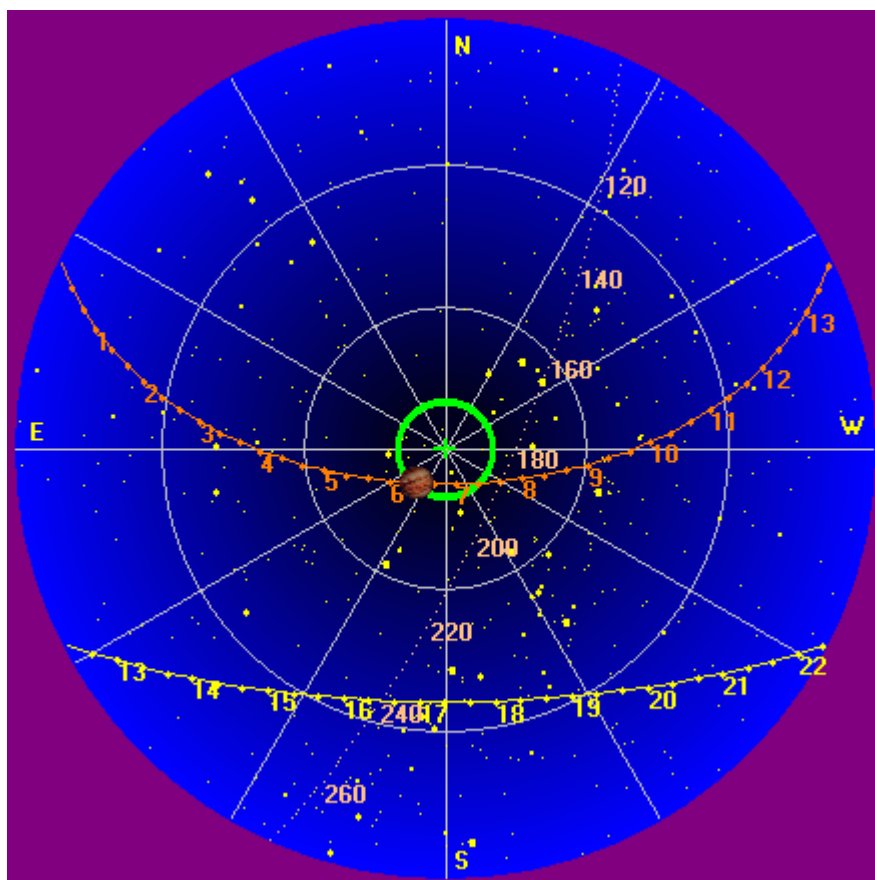
Jupiter was off axis 9°.

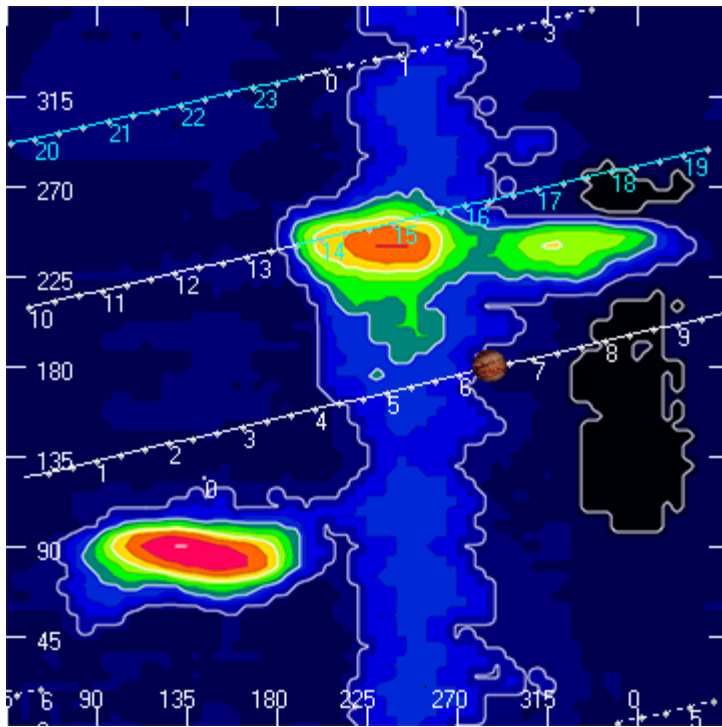
Jupiter was leading the Sun by 161°.

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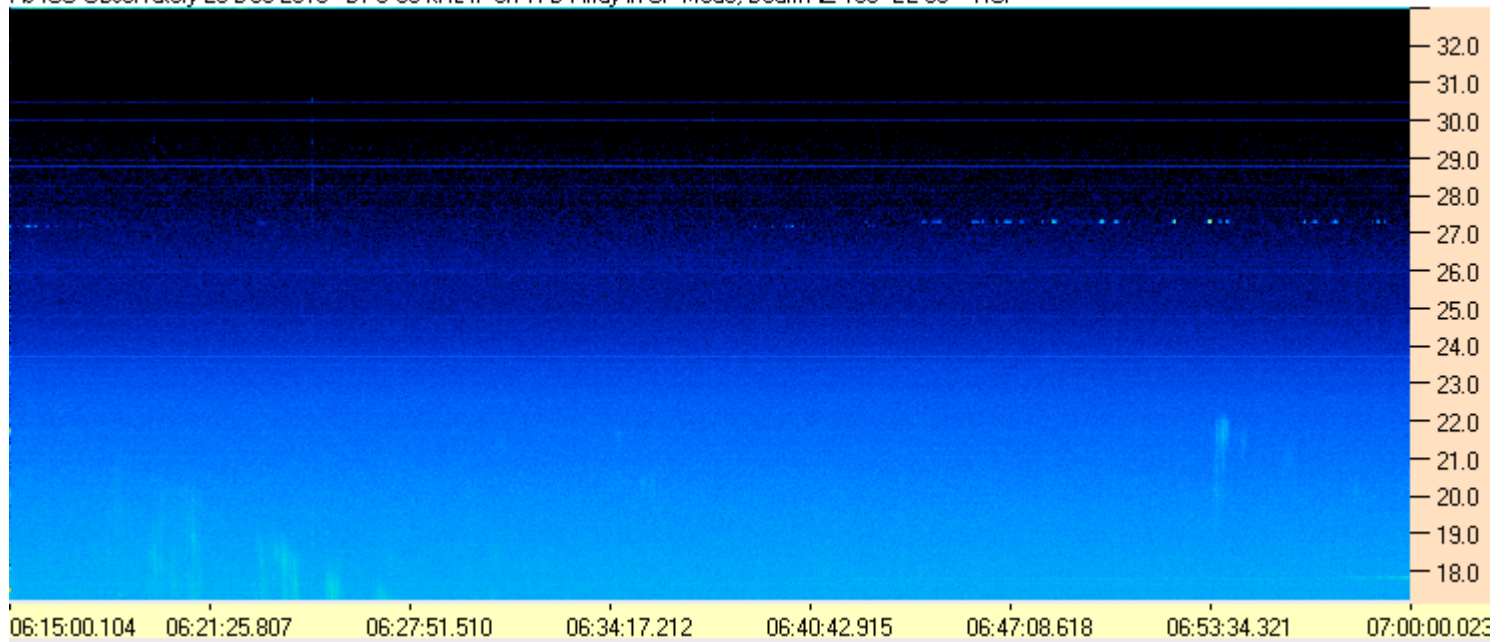

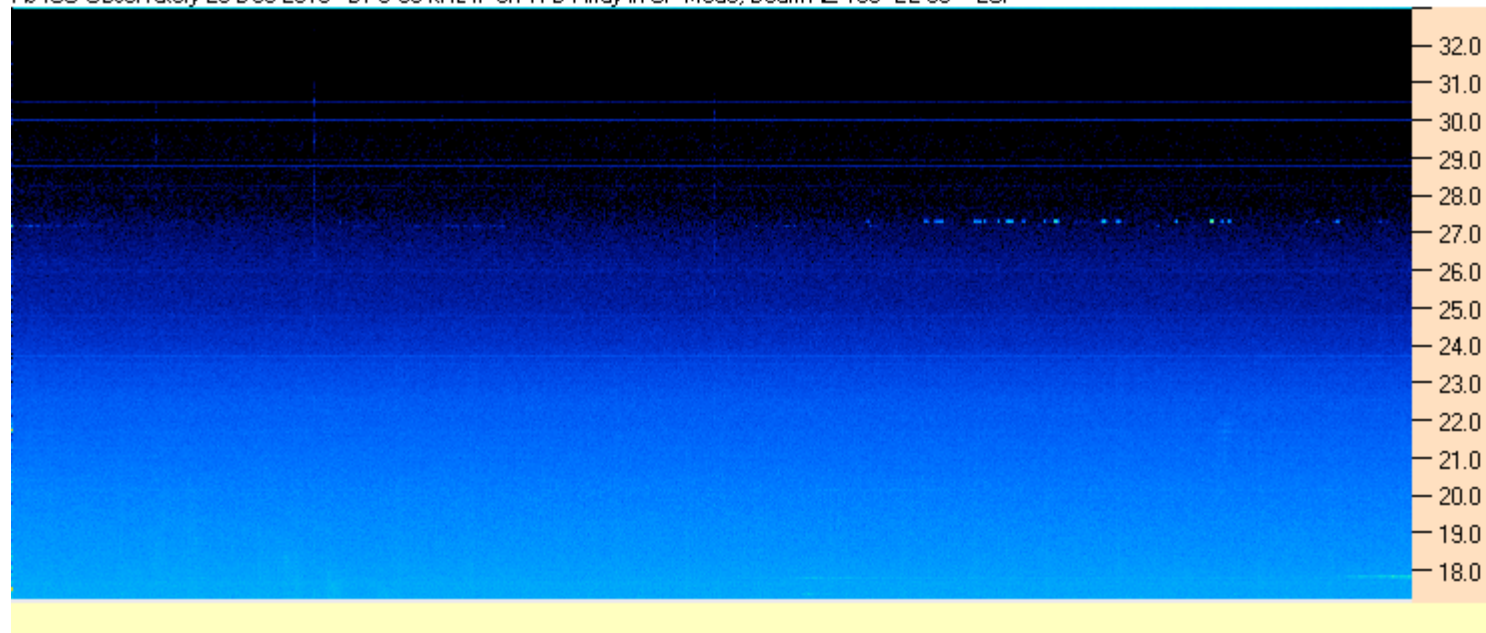




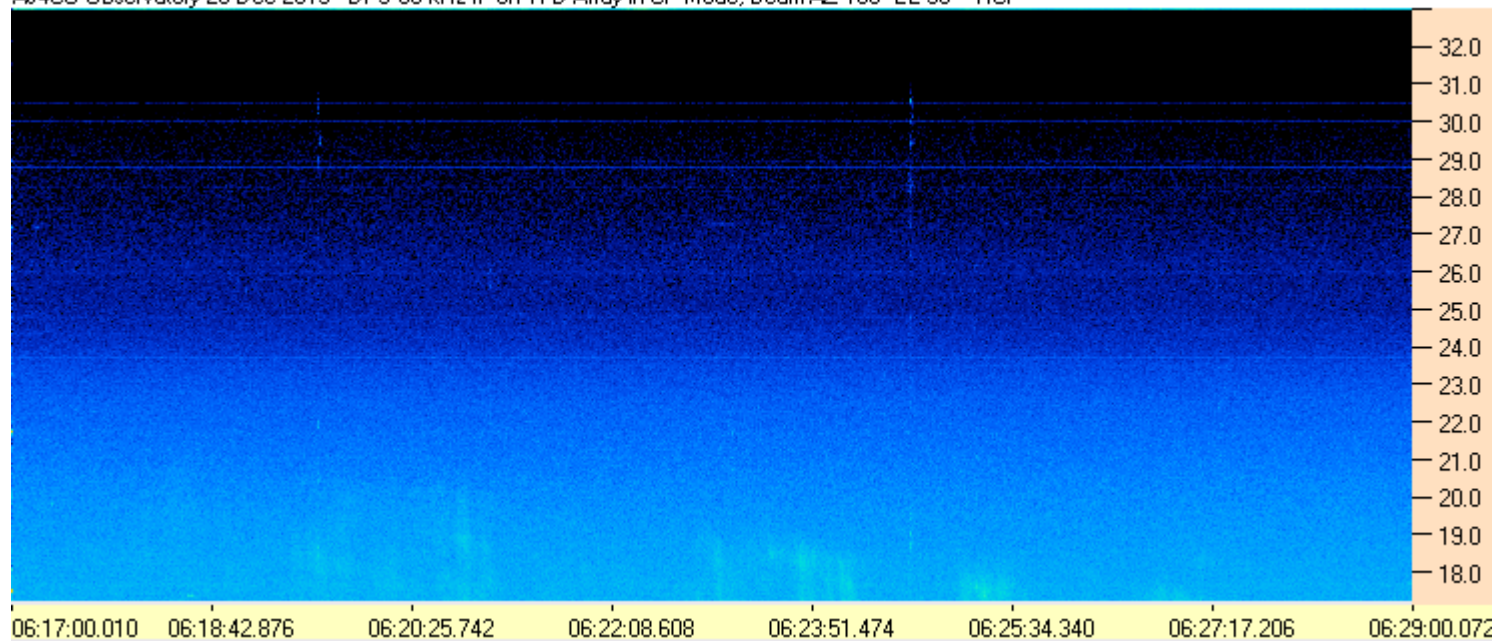

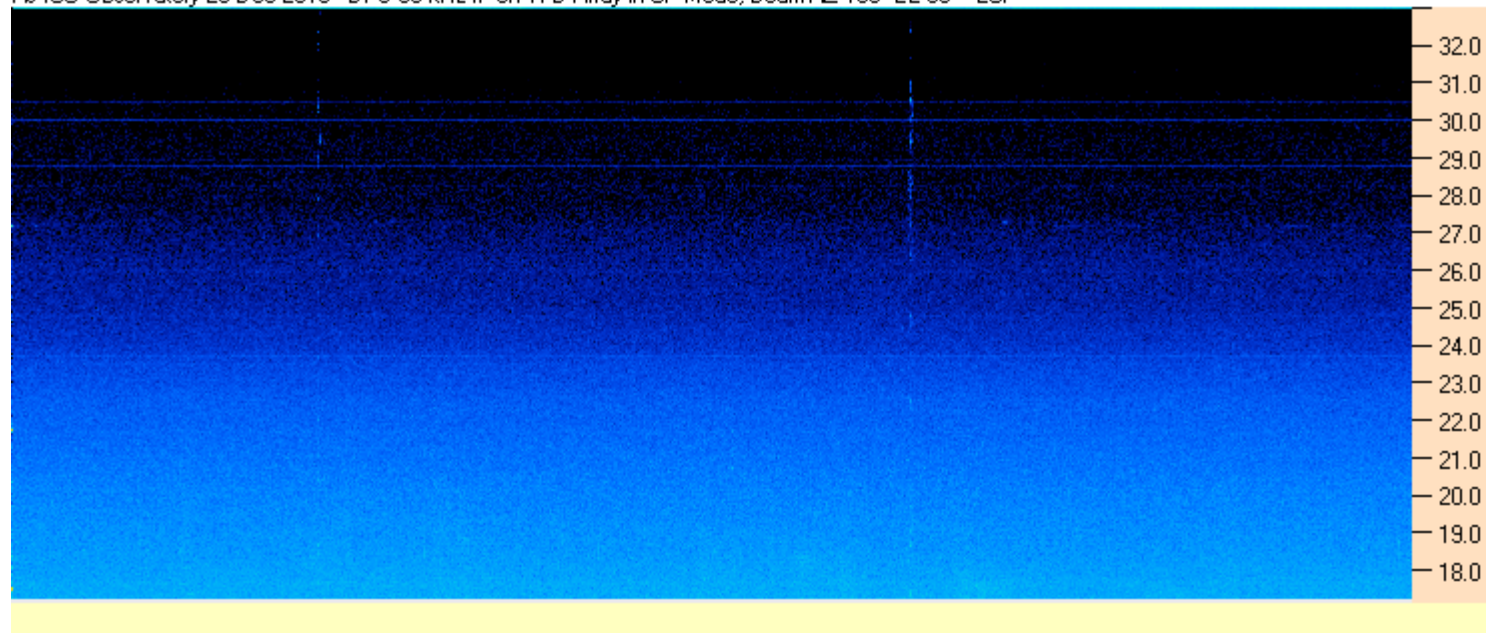

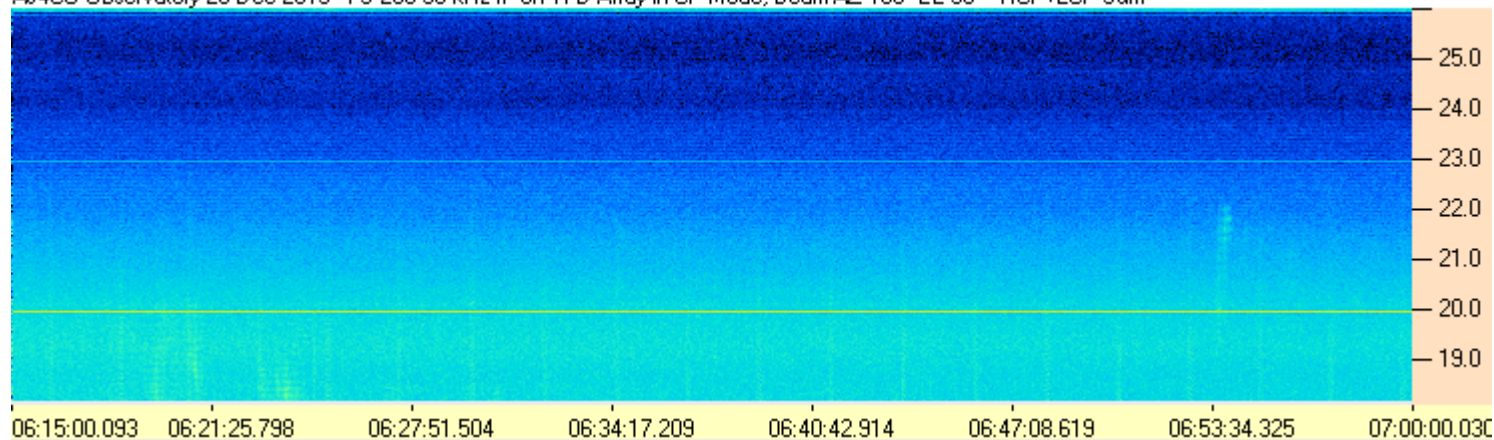
