Lots of S bursting from 0920 to 1010 UTC. Pretty much all L bursting after that, a little overlap of both in between. Nice modulation lanes after 1030.

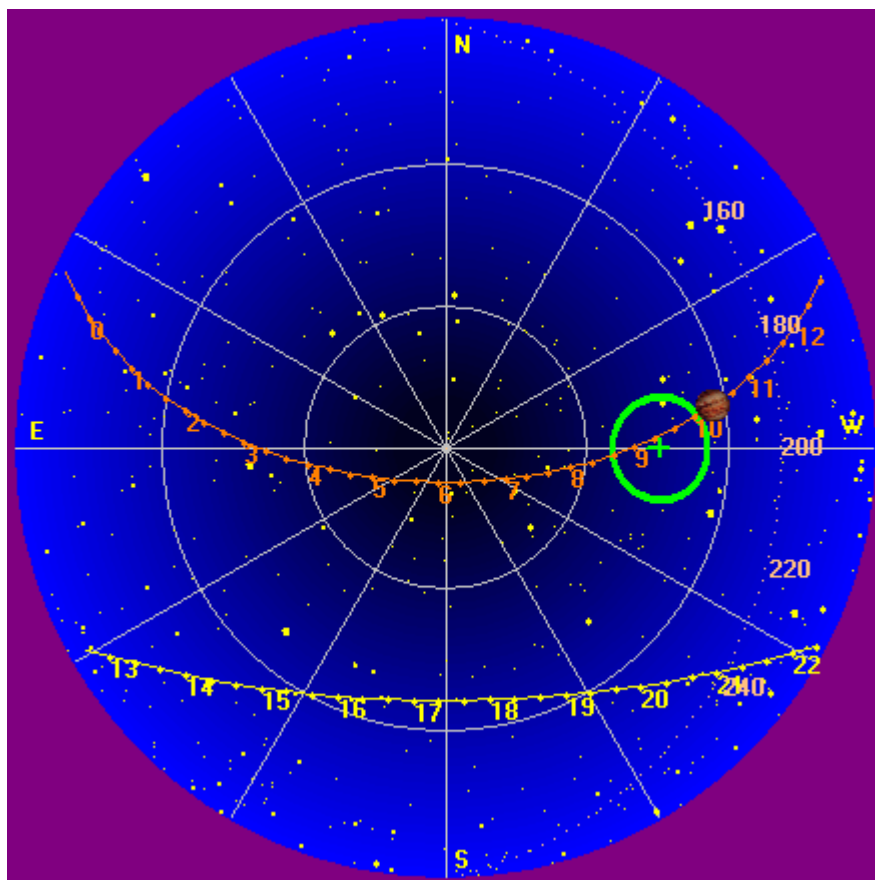
Jupiter was off axis from 3° to 30°.

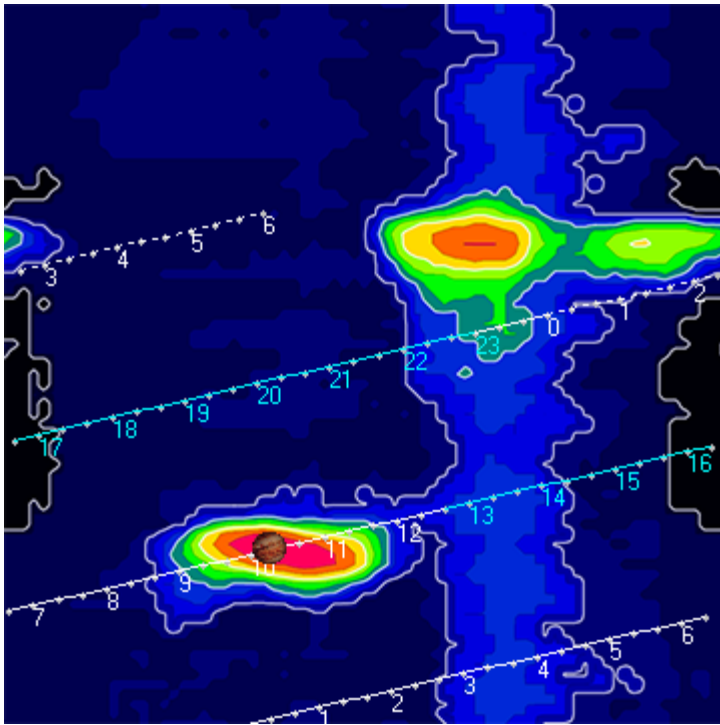
Jupiter was leading the Sun by 173°.

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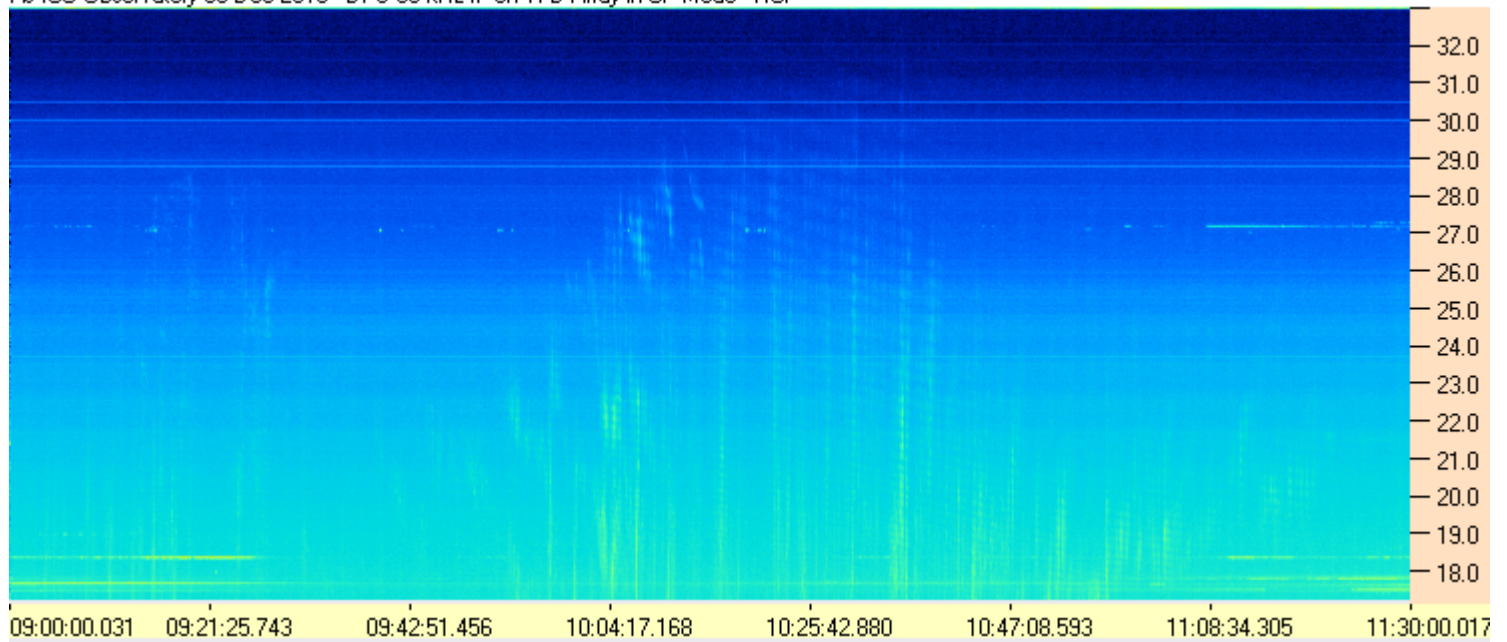

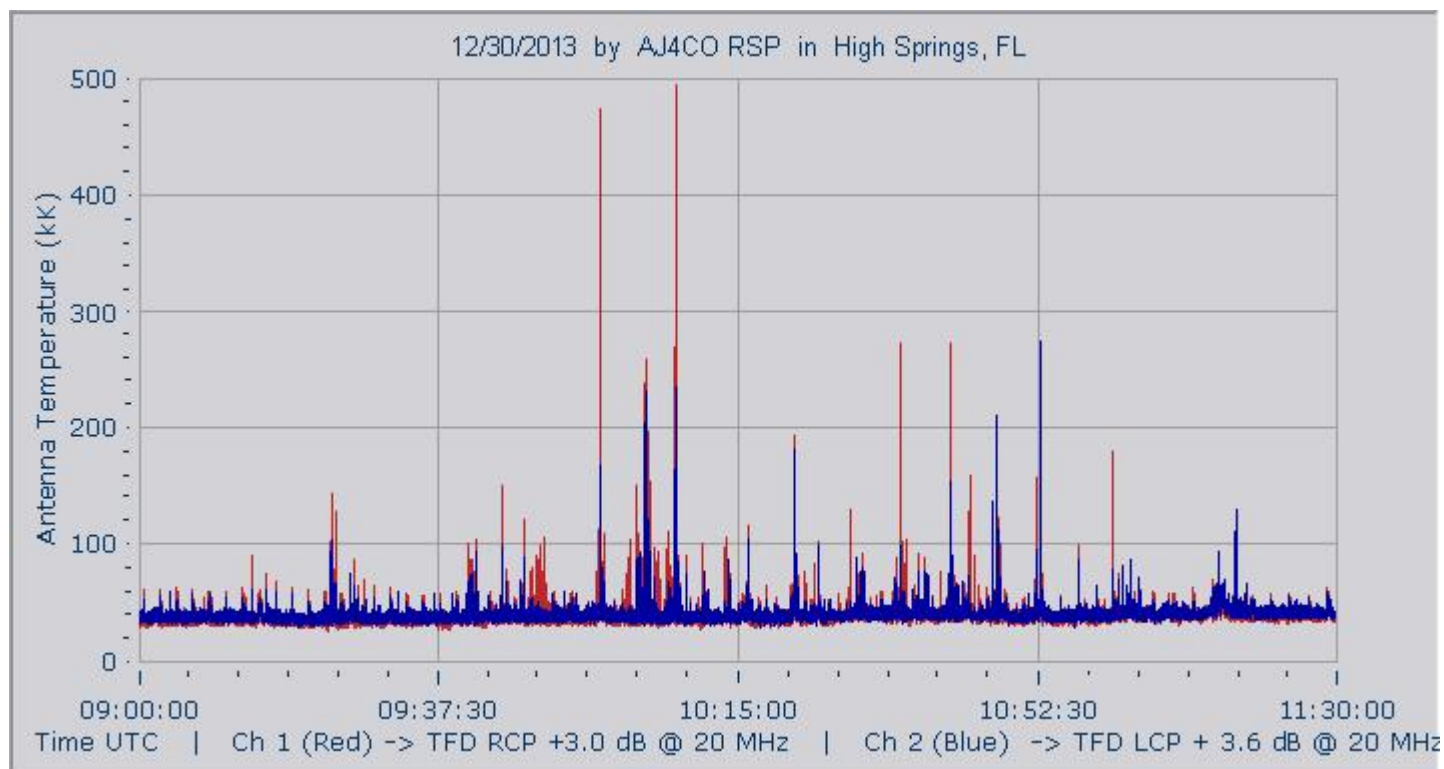
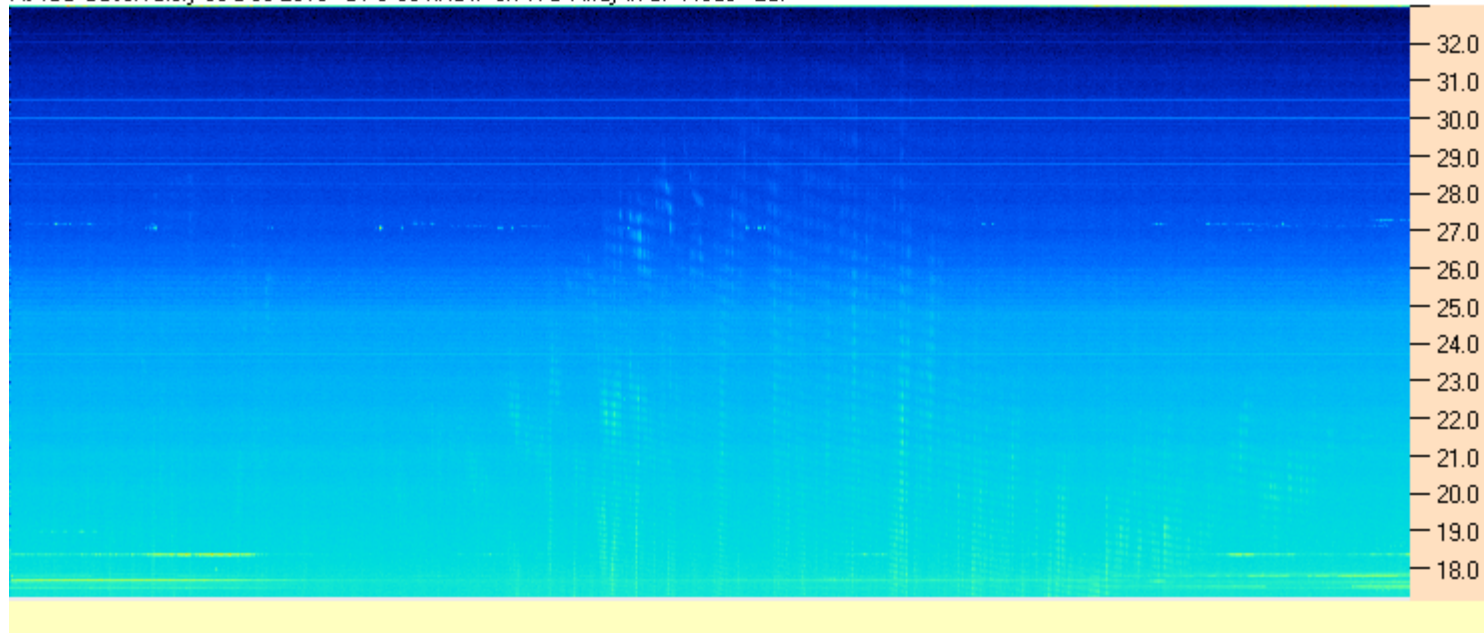




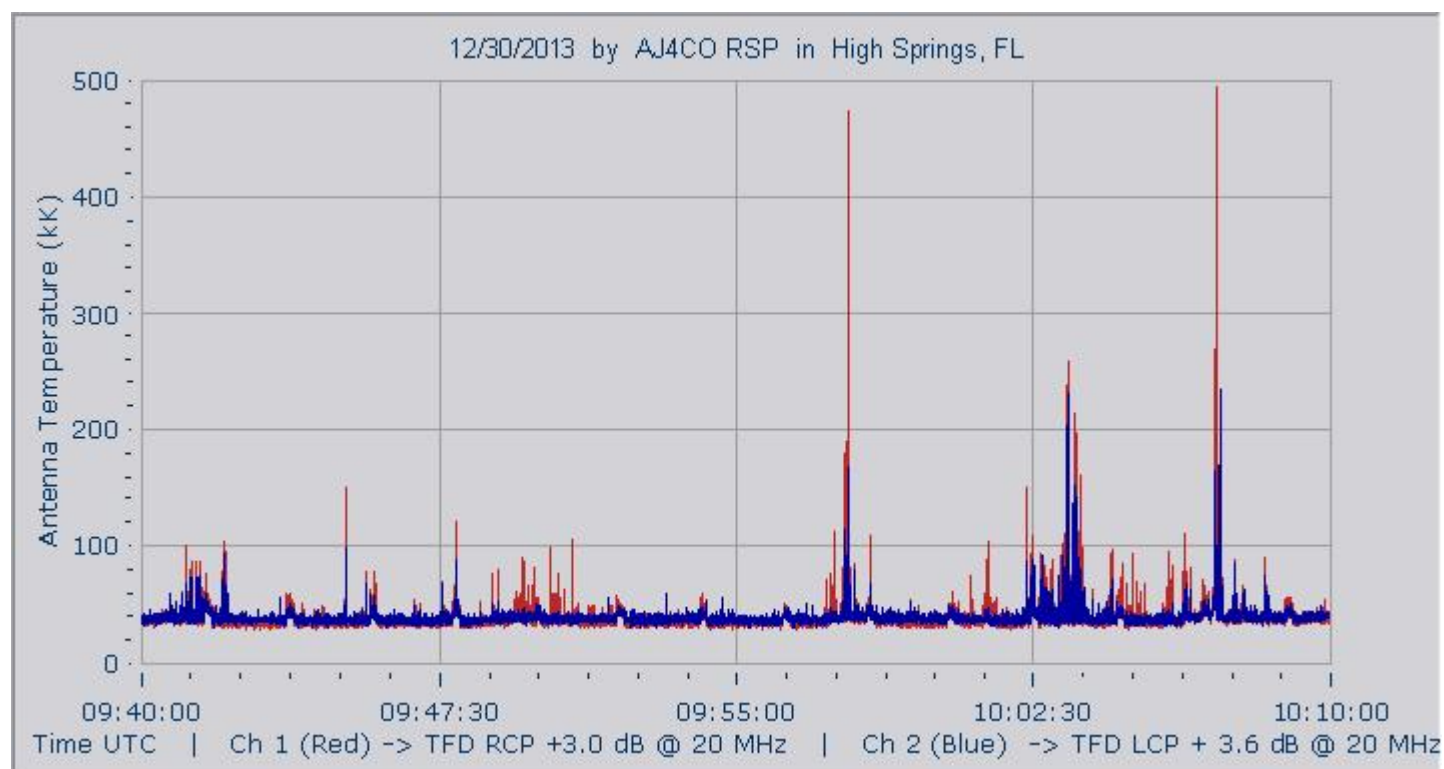
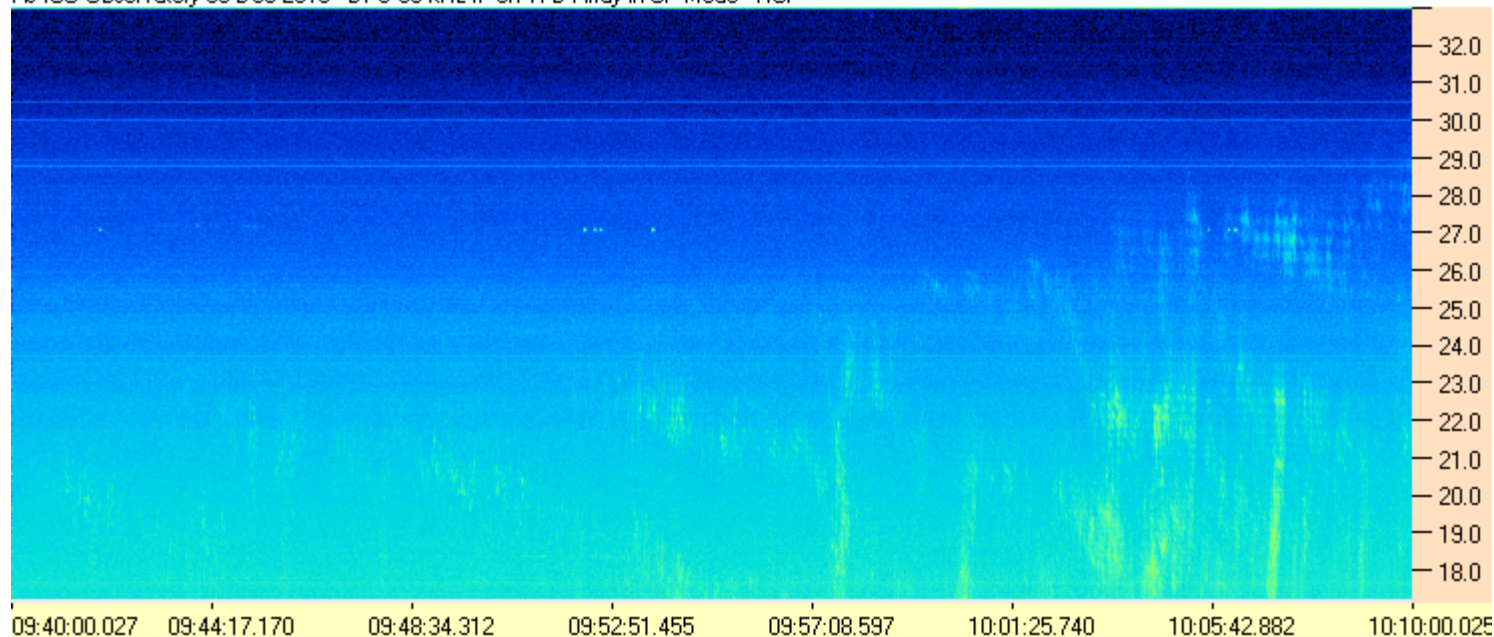
AJ4CO Observatory 30 Dec 2013 - DPS 60 kHz IF on TFD Array in CP Mode - RCP



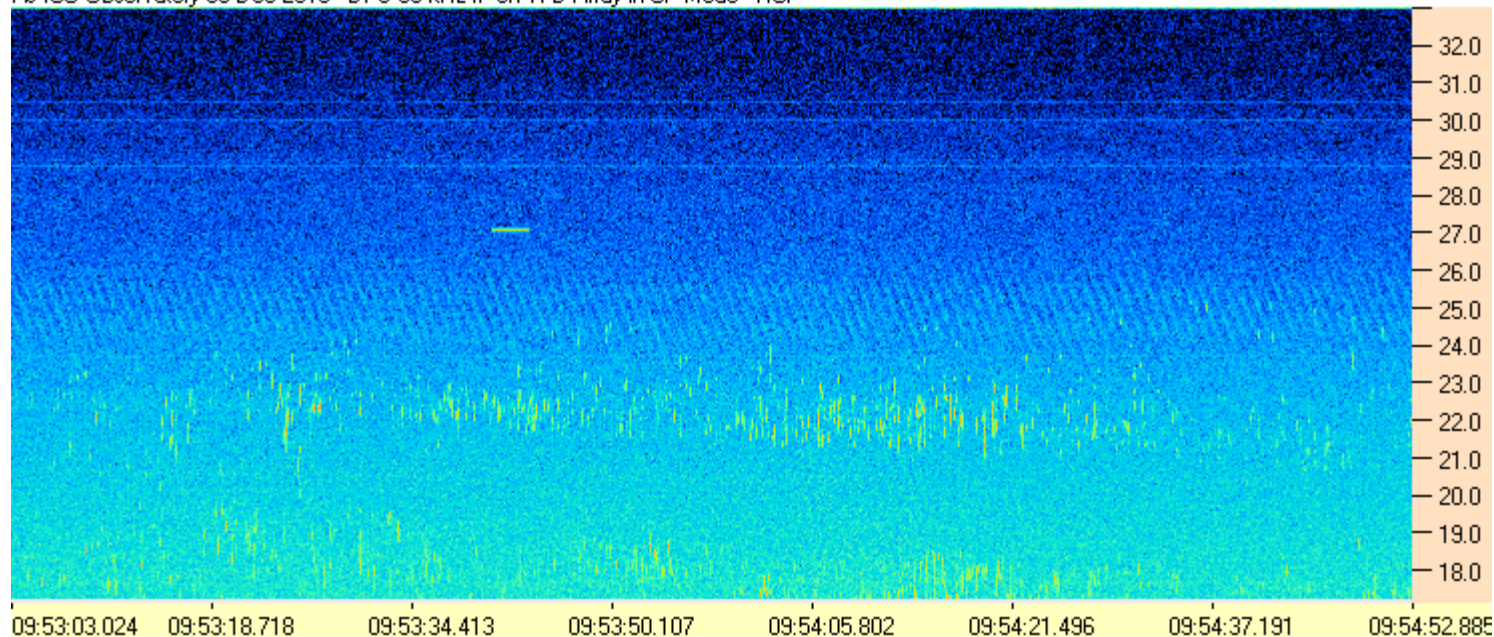
AJ4CO Observatory 30 Dec 2013 - DPS 60 kHz IF on TFD Array in CP Mode - LCP



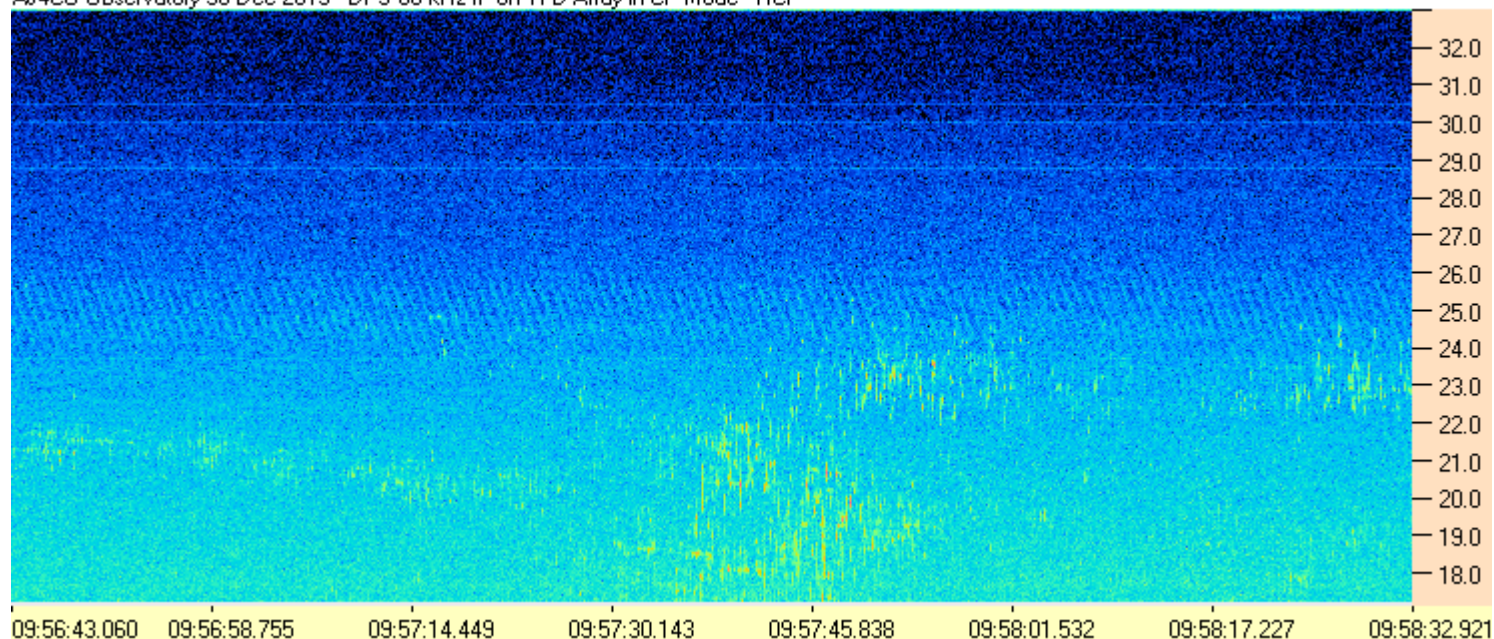

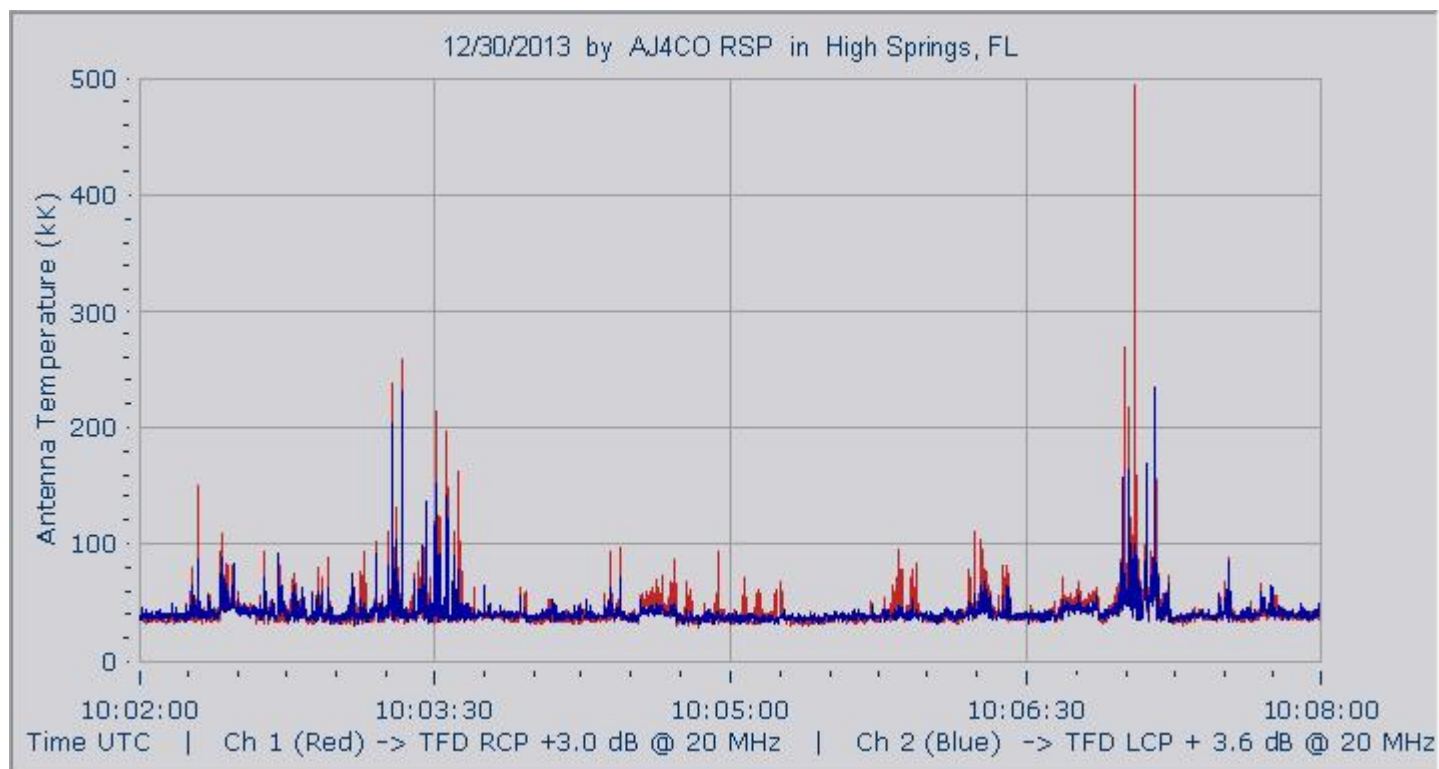
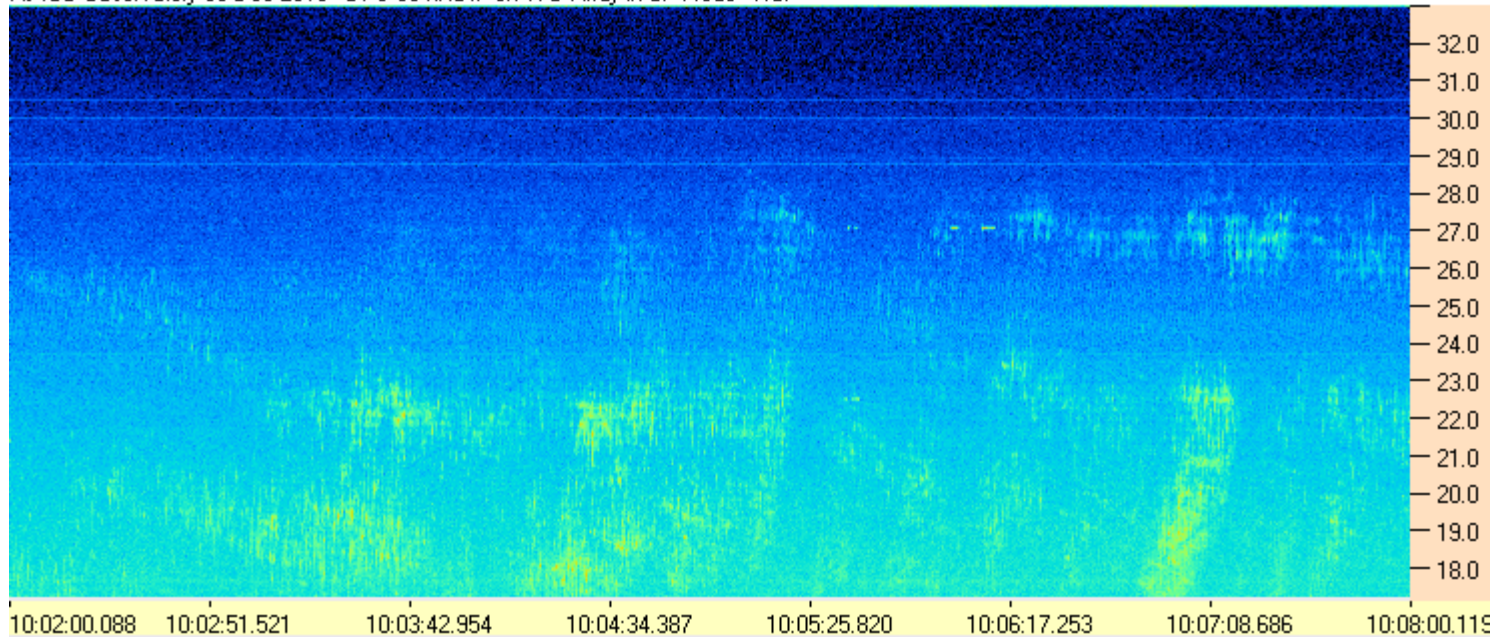
