This was another night with a higher than normal K_p index having the CB band and 15 & 17 meter band propagation to show for it.

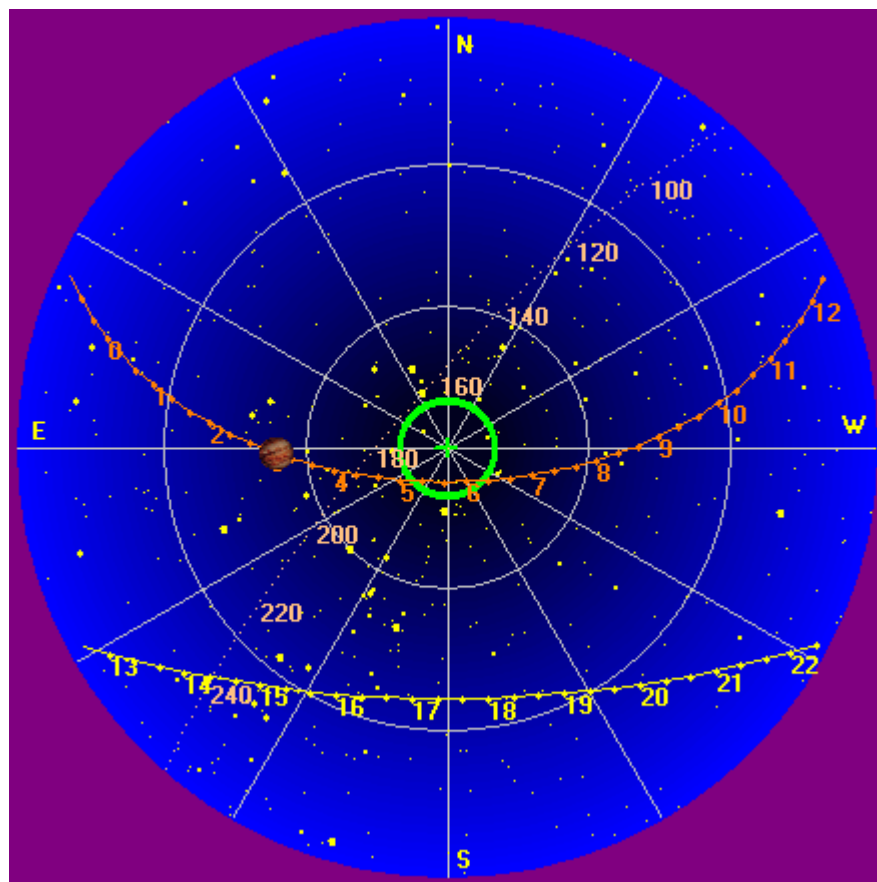
Jupiter was off axis by 44° to 26°.

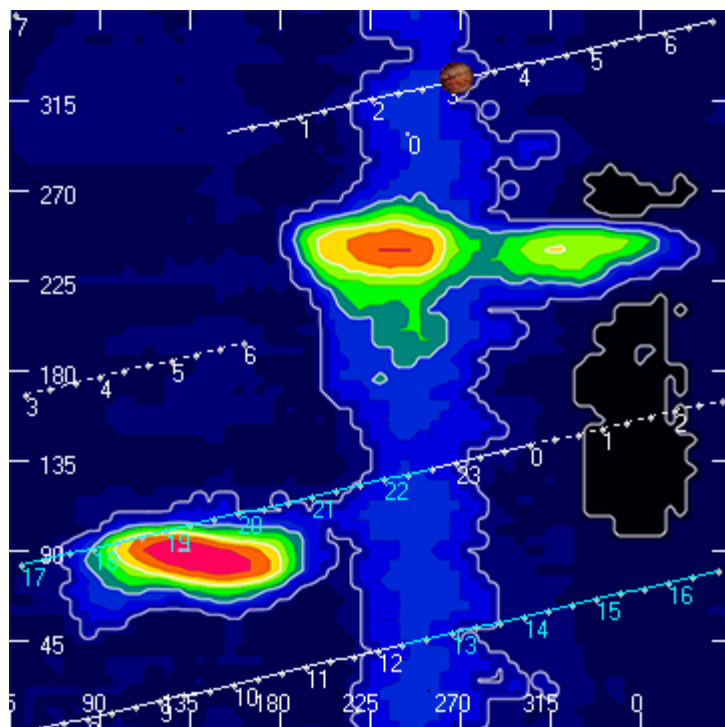
Jupiter was leading the Sun by 178°.

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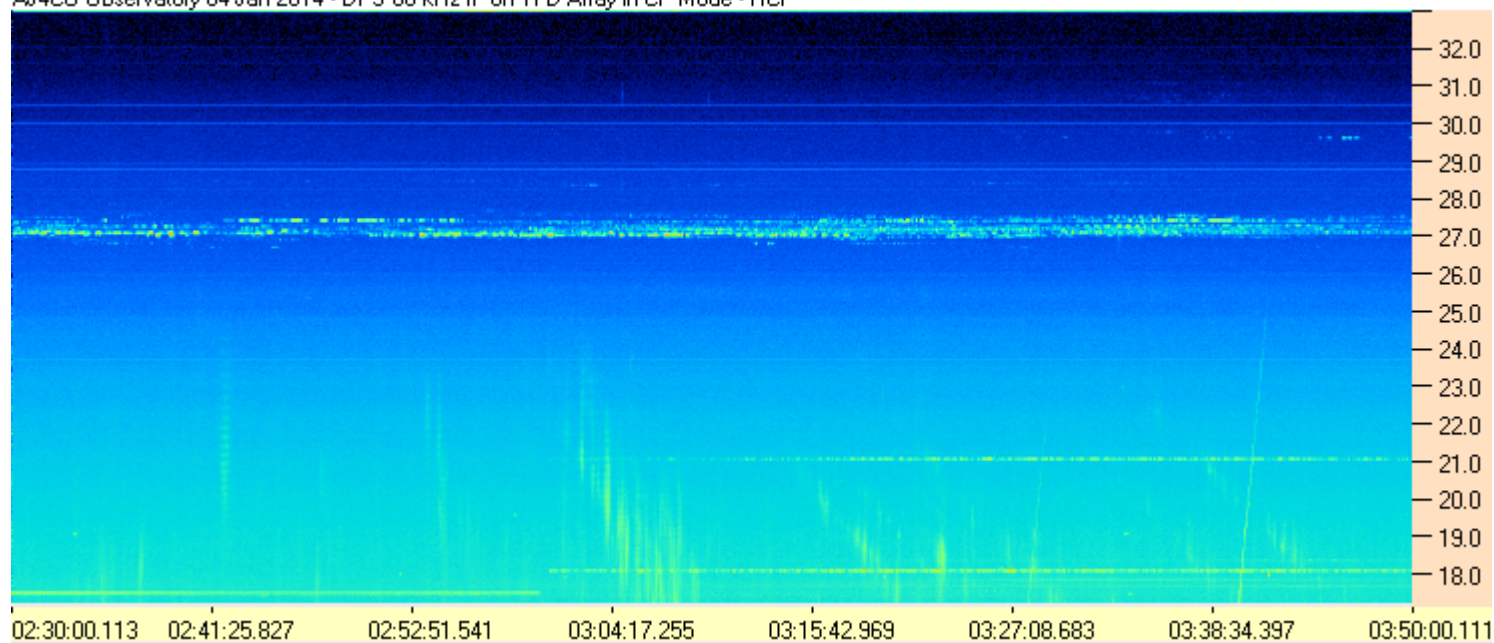

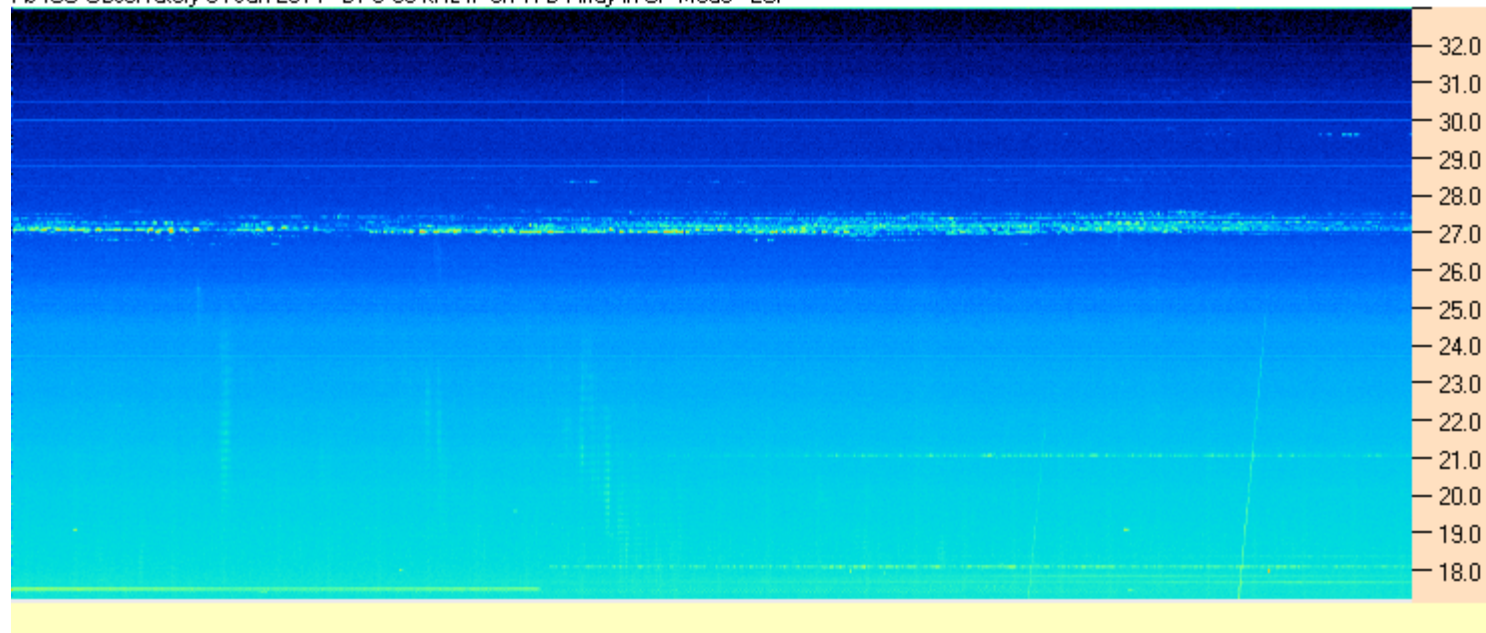




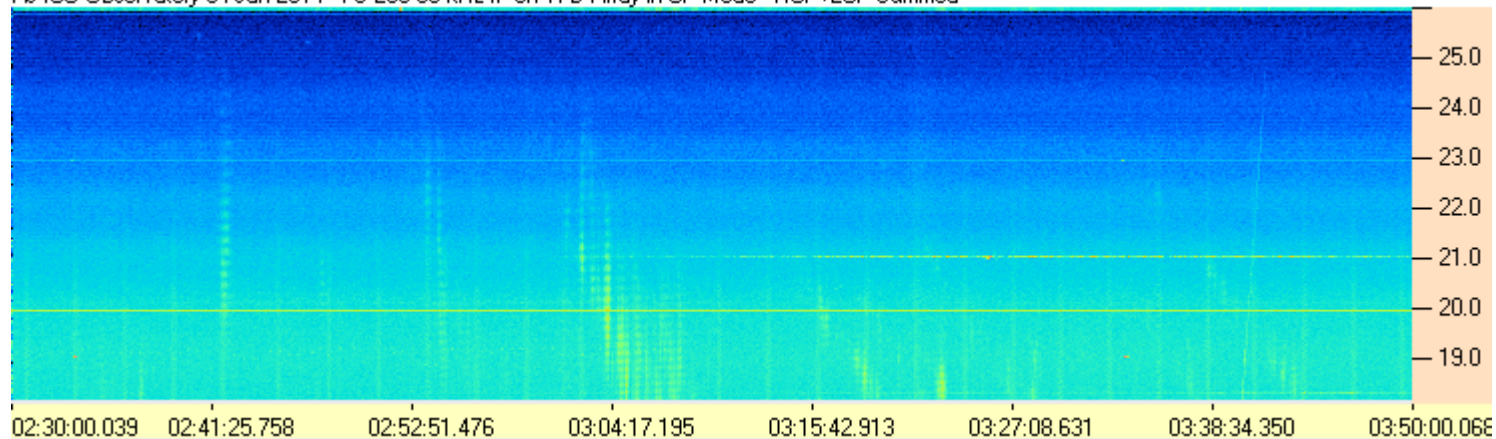
AJ4CO Observatory 04 Jan 2014 - DPS 60 kHz IF on TFD Array in CP Mode - RCP



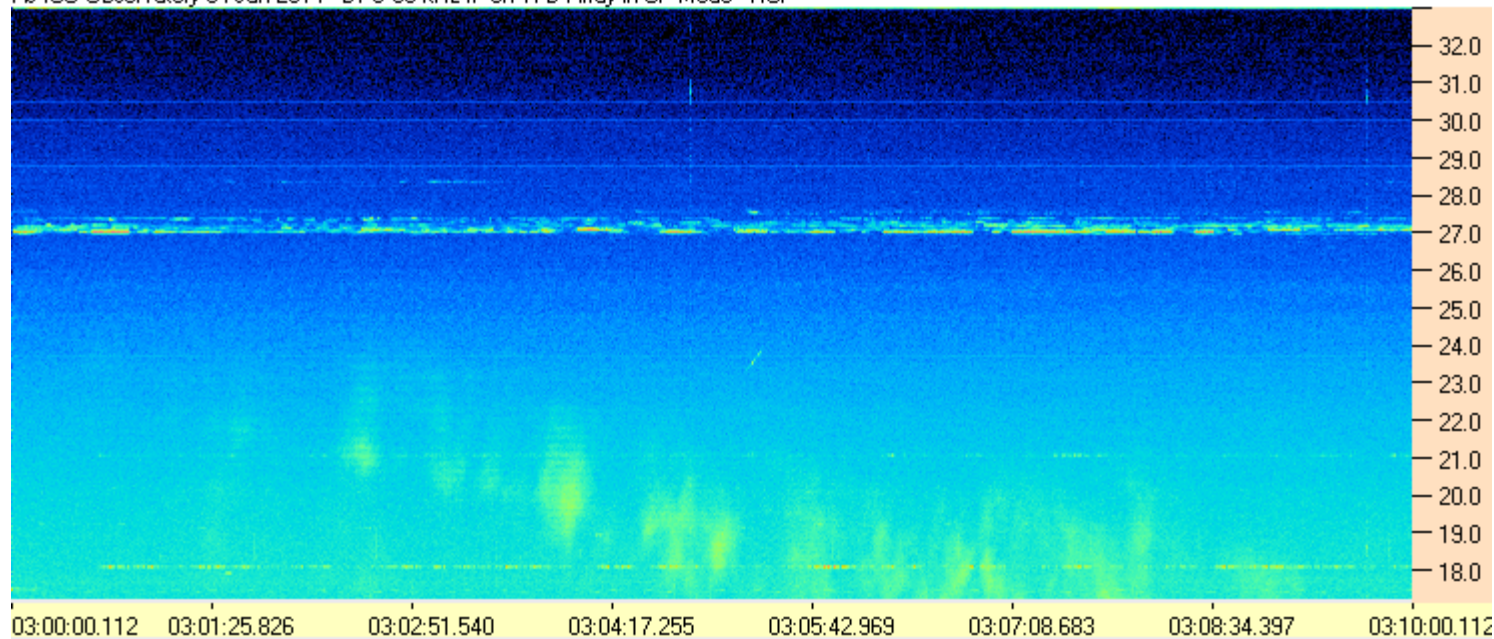
AJ4CO Observatory 04 Jan 2014 - DPS 60 kHz IF on TFD Array in CP Mode - LCP



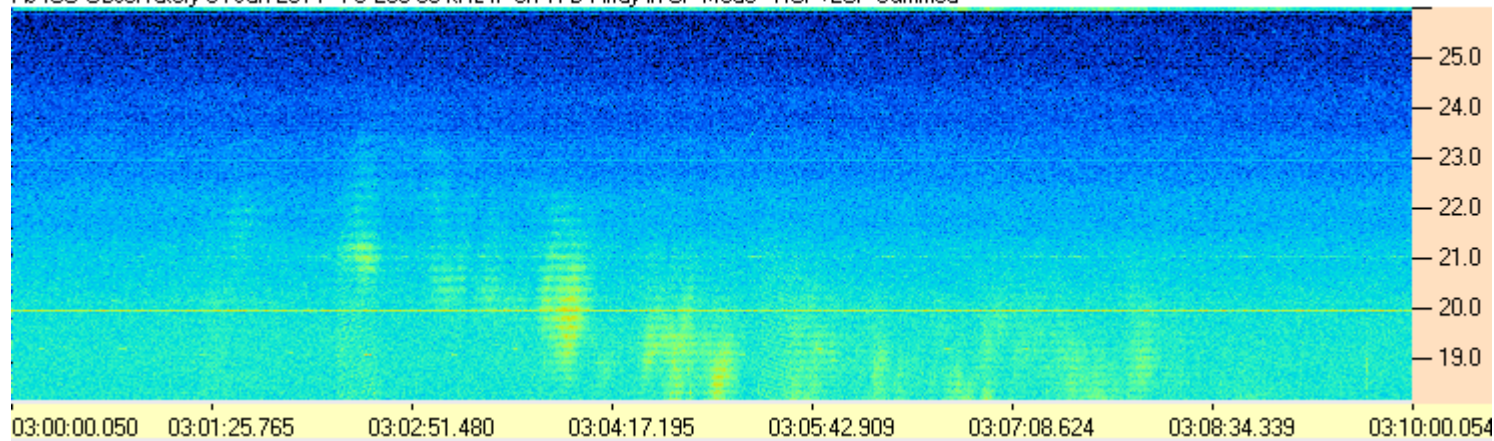
AJ4CO Observatory 04 Jan 2014 - FS-200 30 kHz IF on TFD Array in CP Mode - RCP+LCP Summed

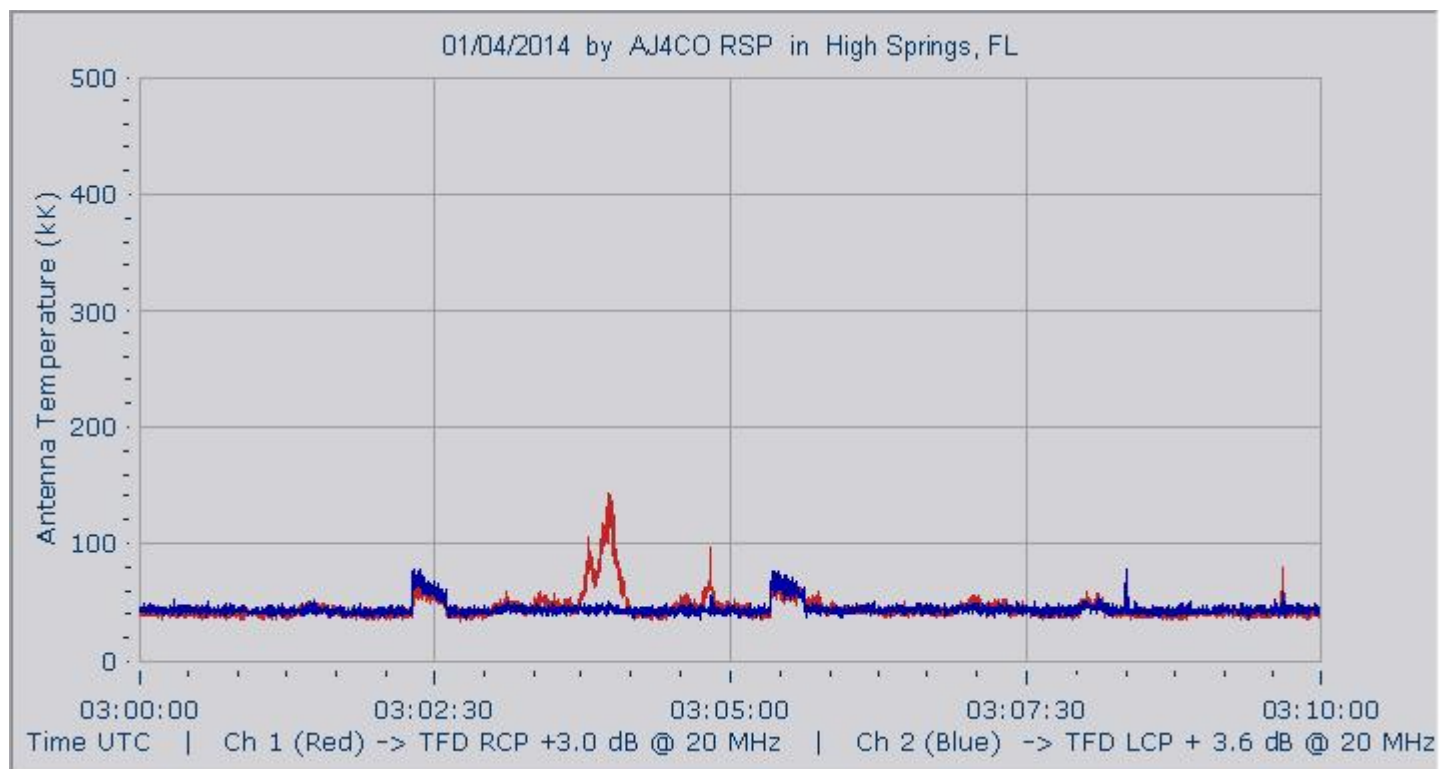

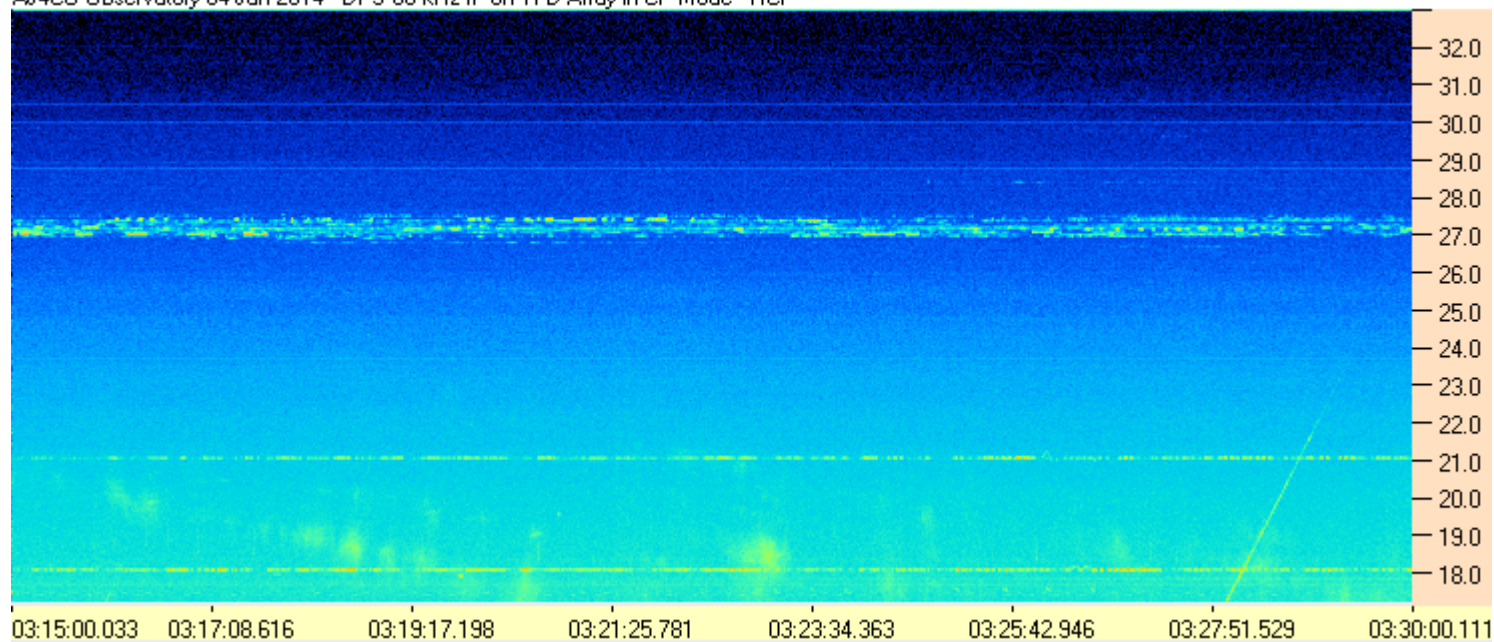
