Here's some possible non-Io-A from Friday noon.

The emission was just barely visible above the galactic background -- hence "possible." RCP dominant L bursting visible from 18 to 21 MHz; no modulation lanes. Almost looks like a brief N event at 1747 crossing 20.1 MHz.

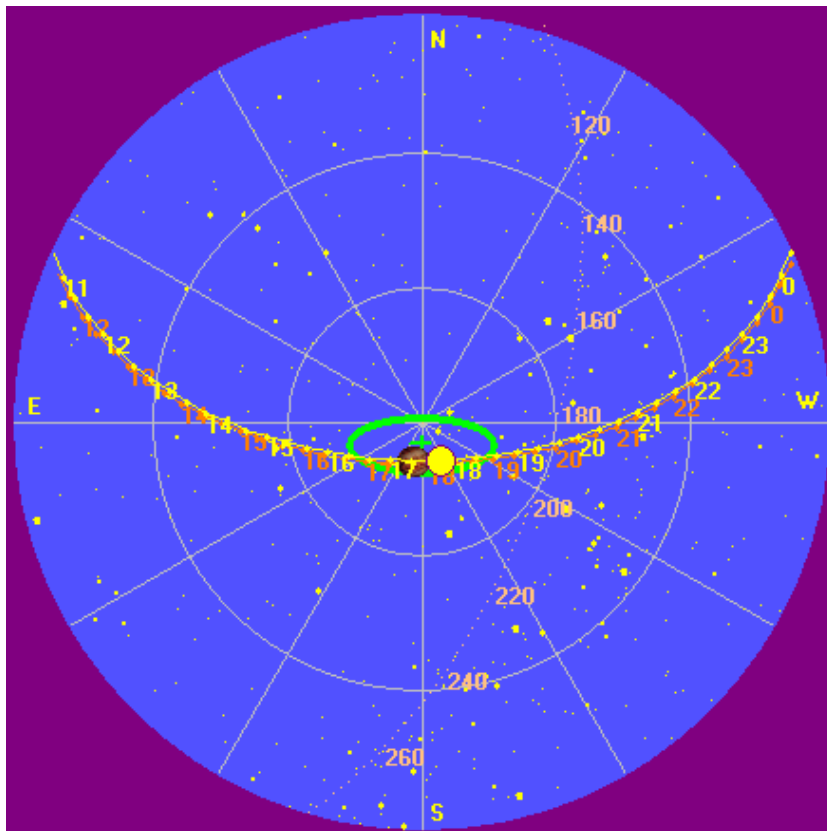
Jupiter was 5° off axis.

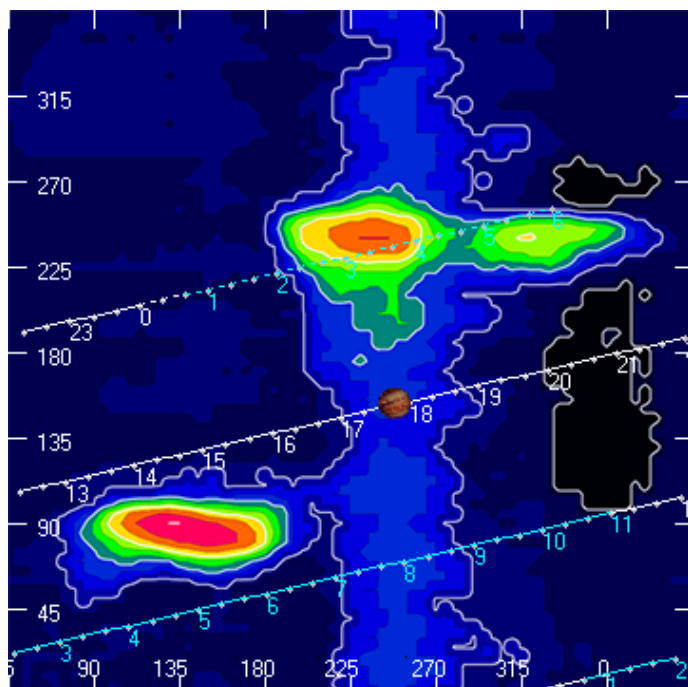
Jupiter was trailing the Sun by 5°.

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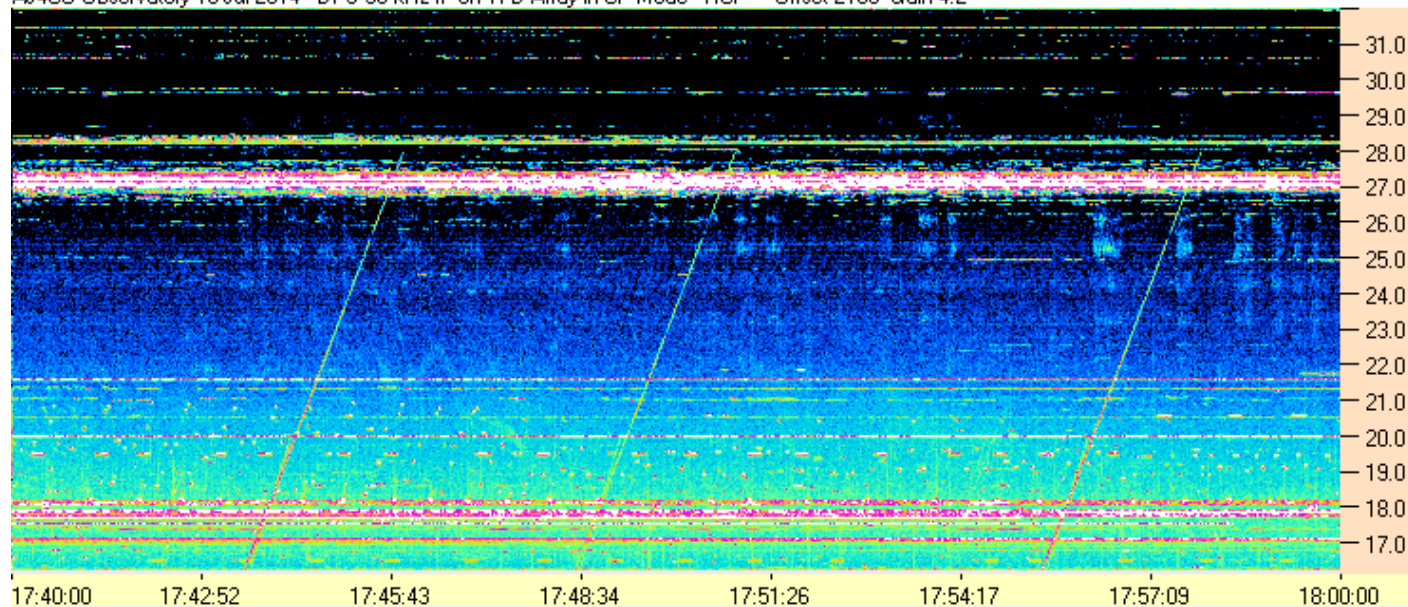

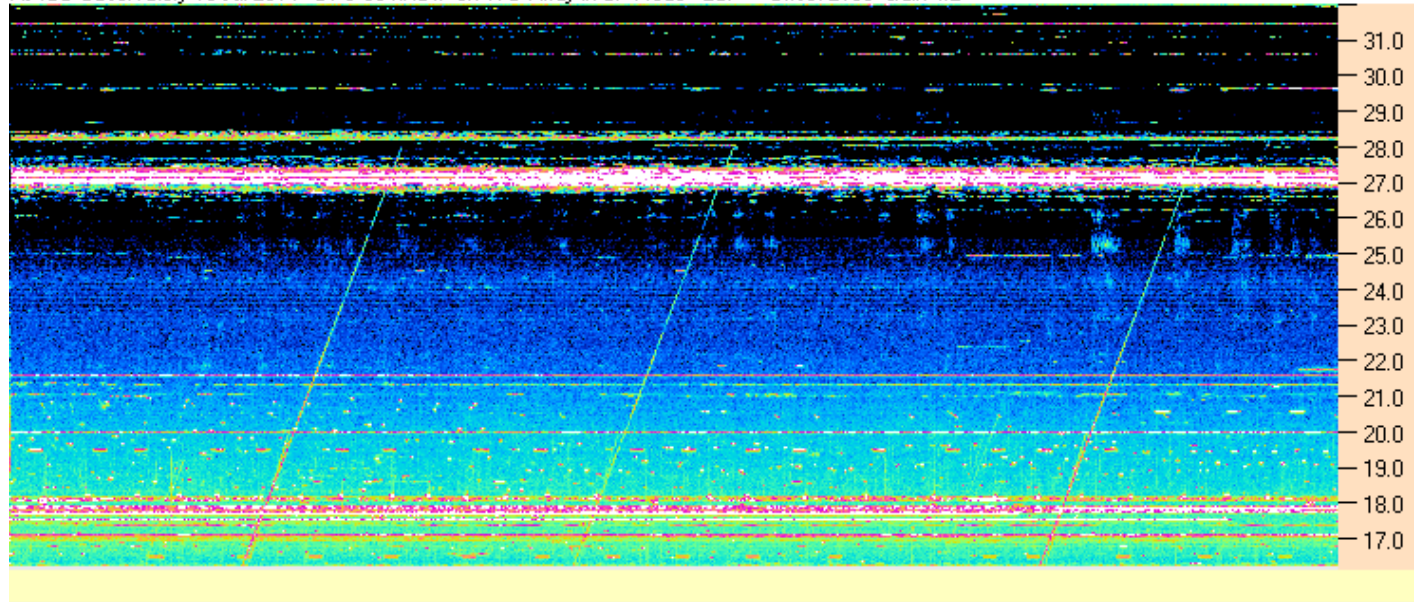




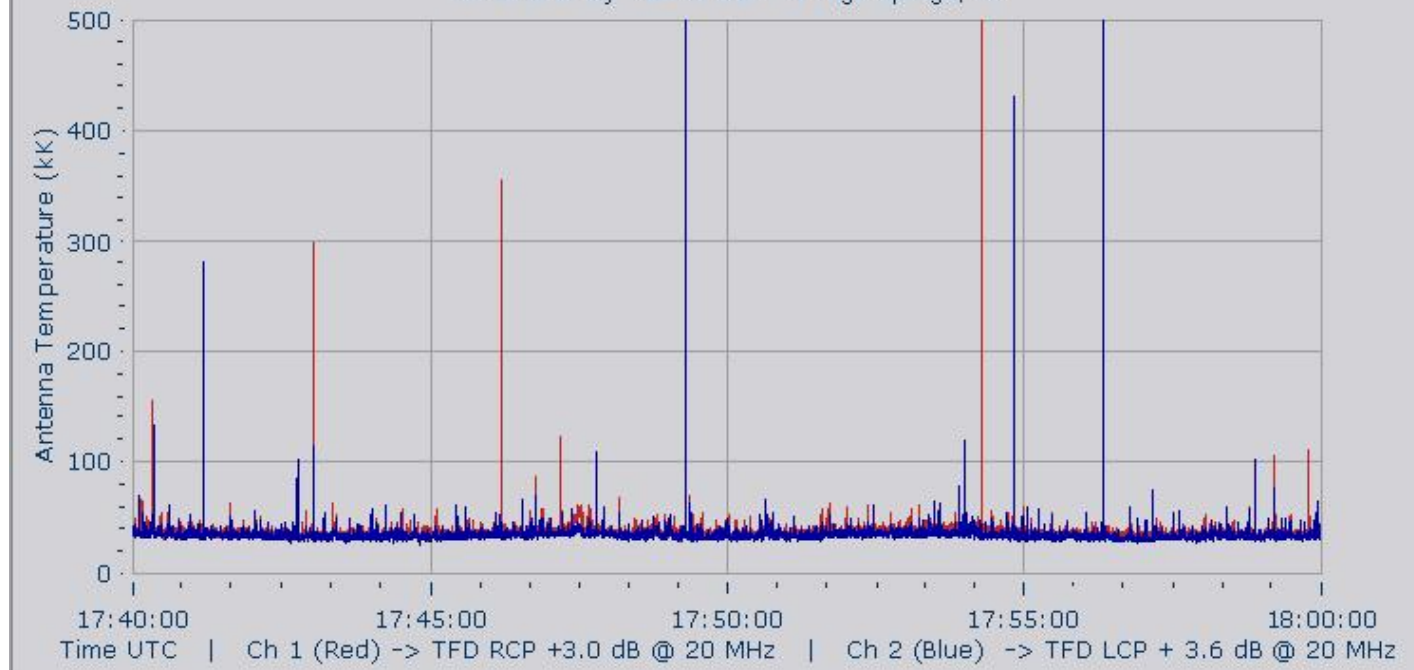

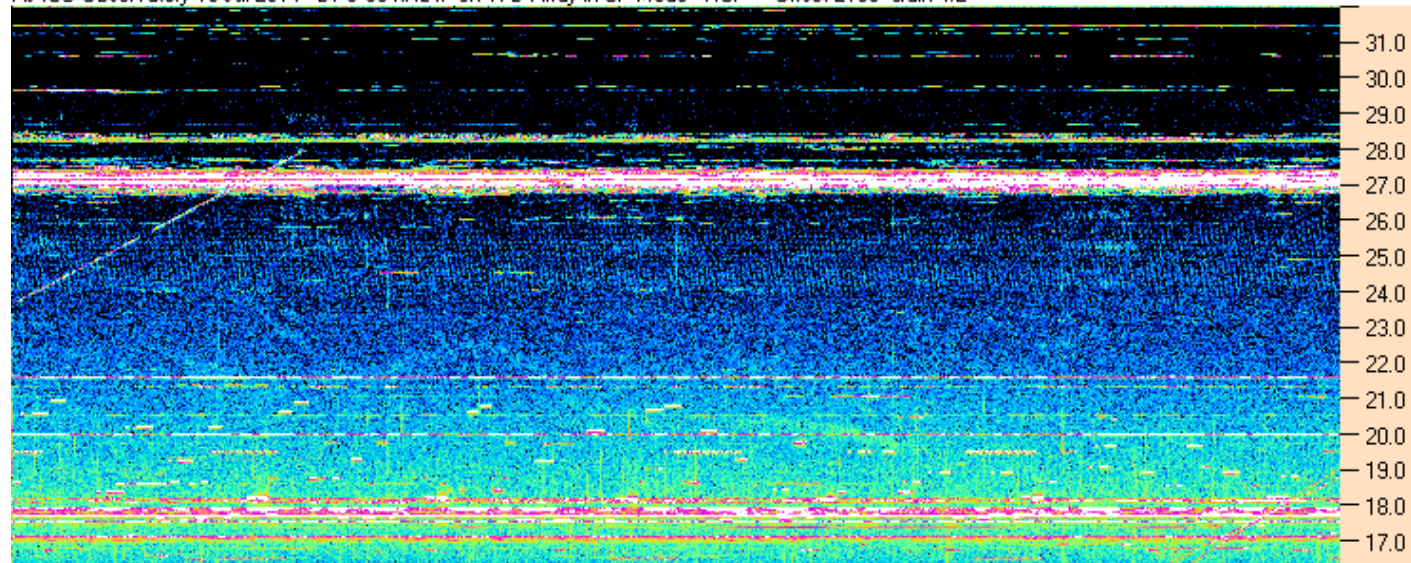
