Narrow band S burst trains at lower freqs during the beginning of the storm.

Lots of L bursting with modulation lanes.

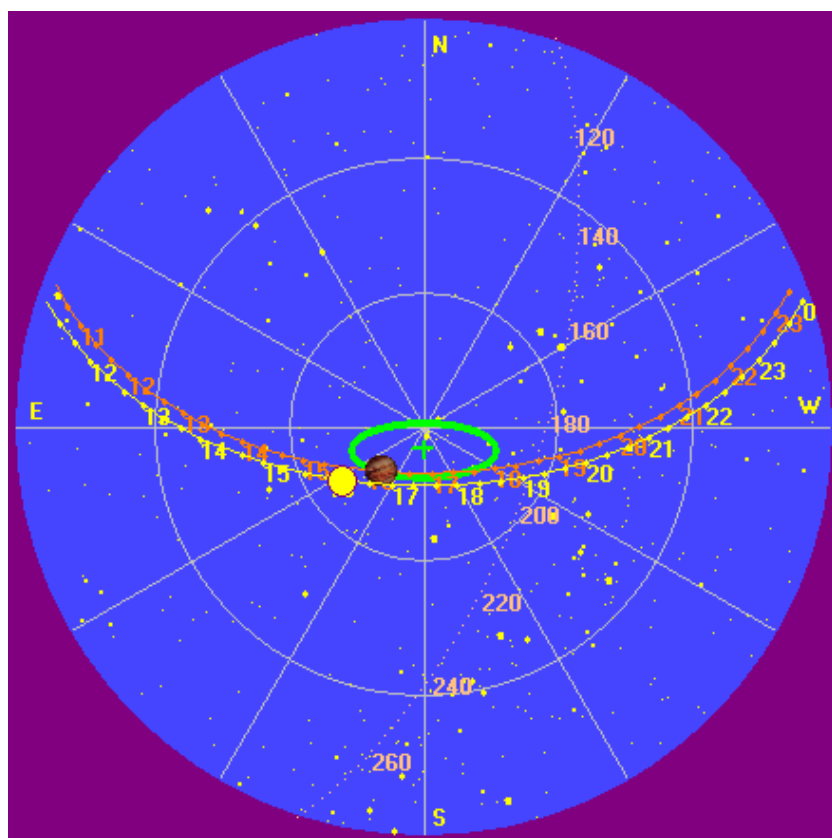
Jupiter was $+22^\circ$ to $+6^\circ$ off axis.

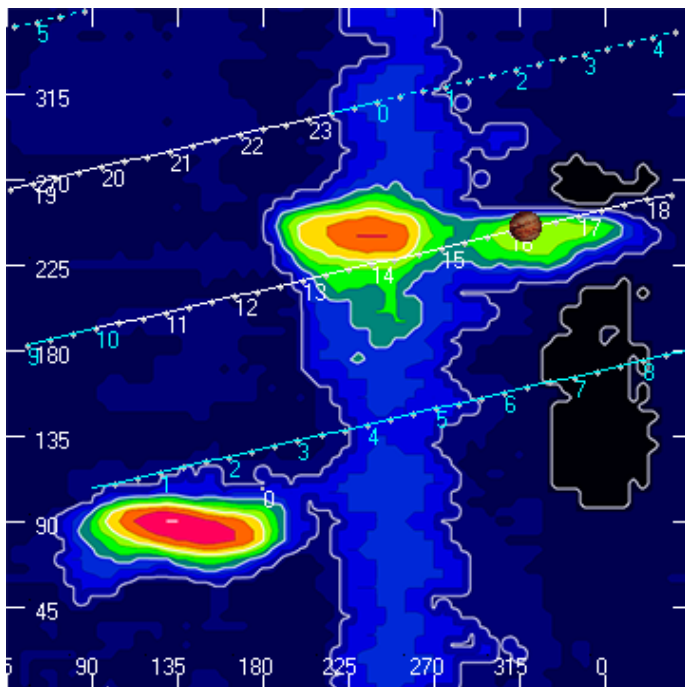
Jupiter was leading the Sun by 10° .

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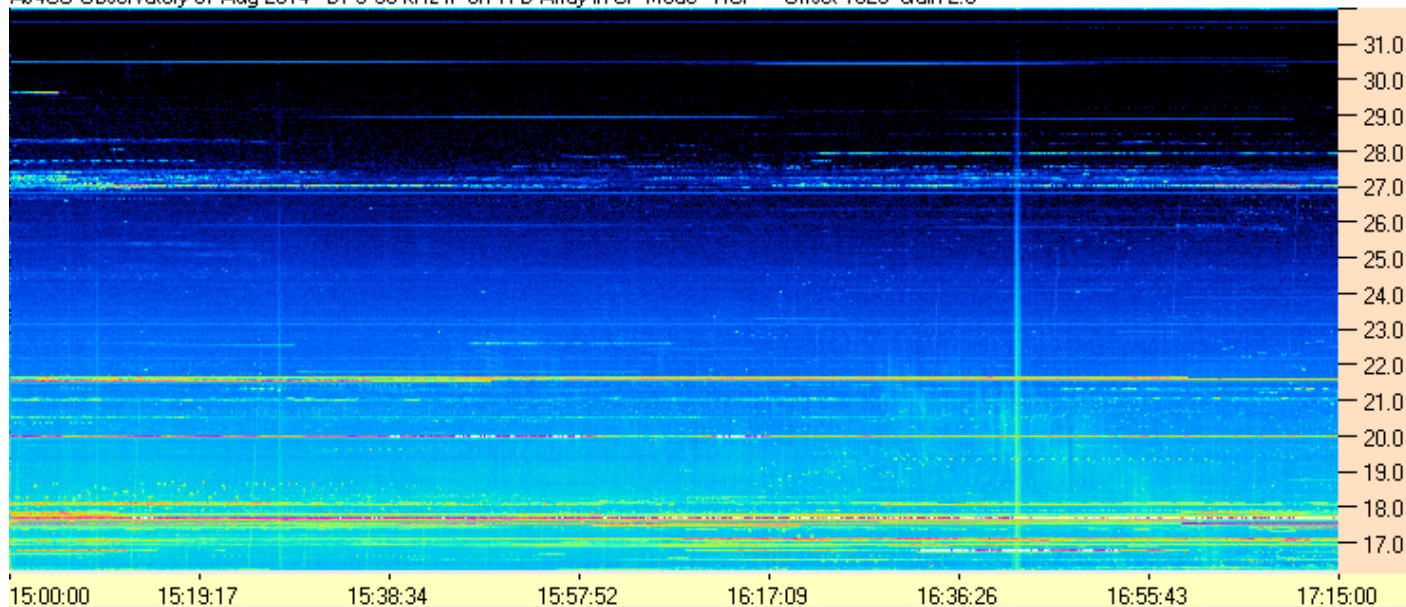

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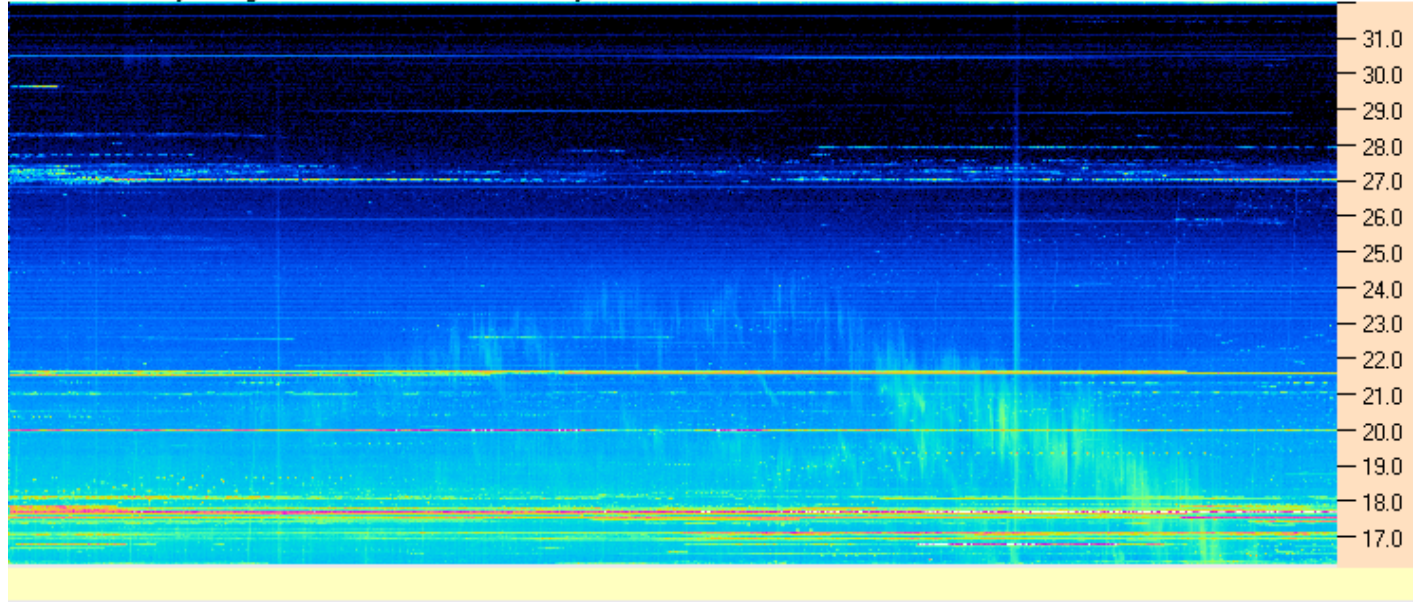




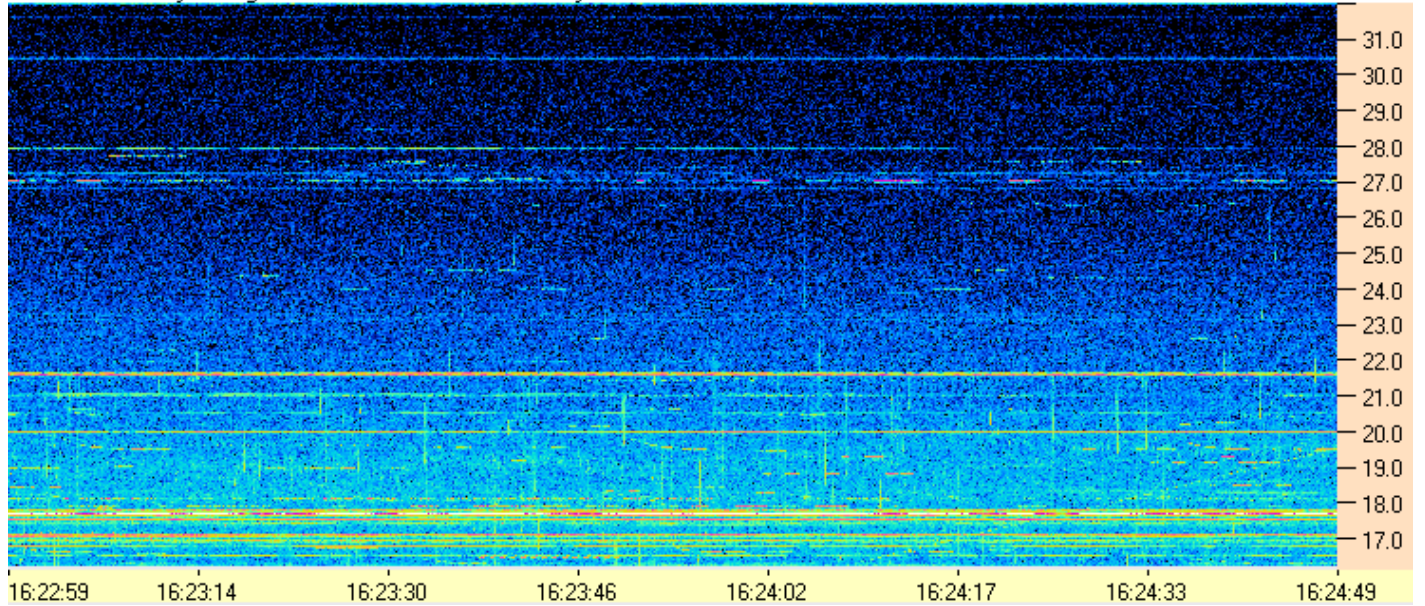

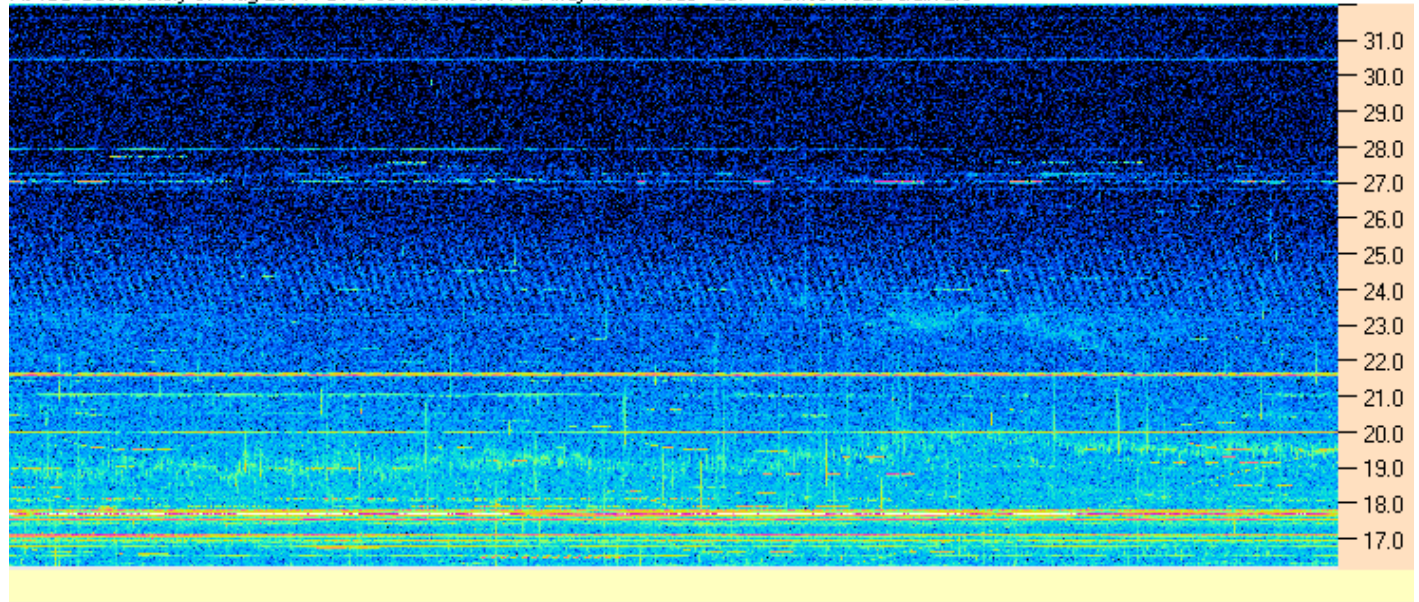
