Jupiter was -9° to $+14^\circ$ off axis.

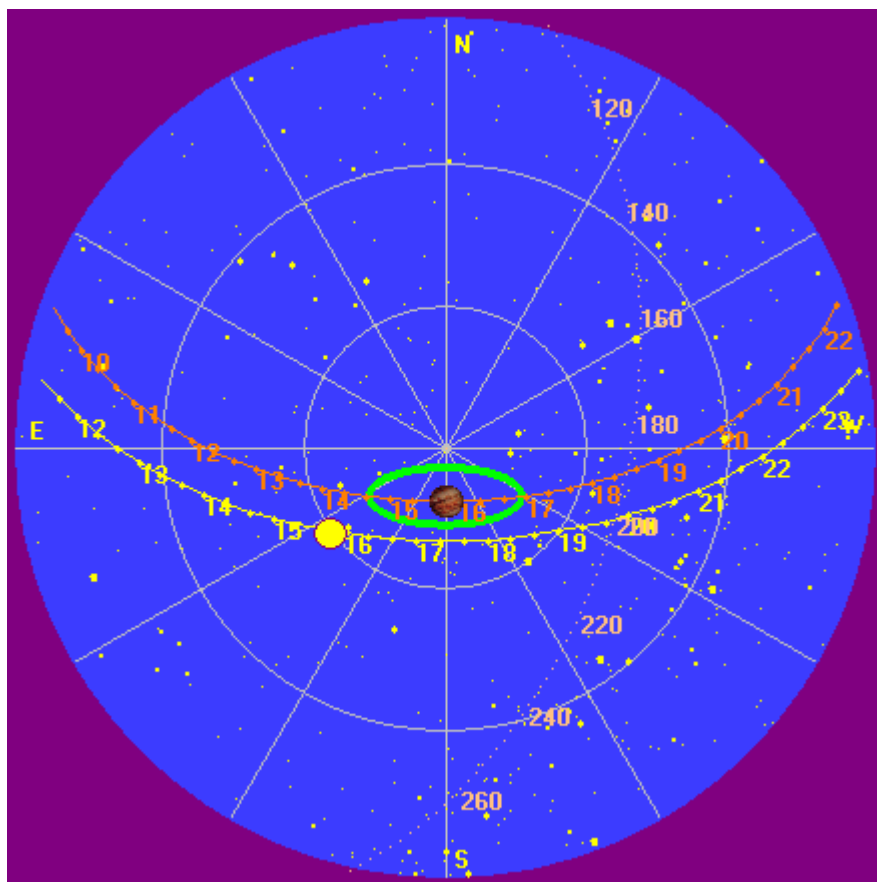
Jupiter was leading the Sun by 26° .

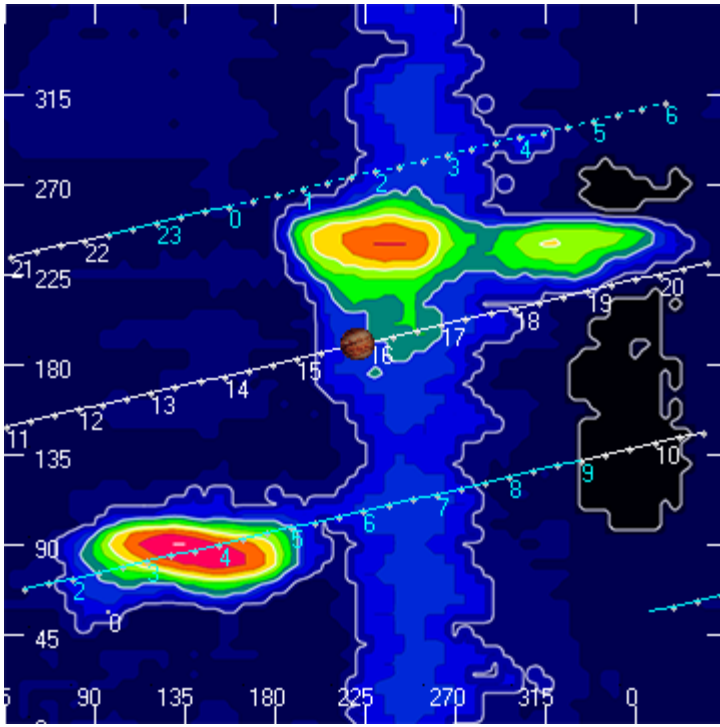
NOTE: The TFD array was/is missing one element, the northern-most EW dipole, for galactic background measurement testing.

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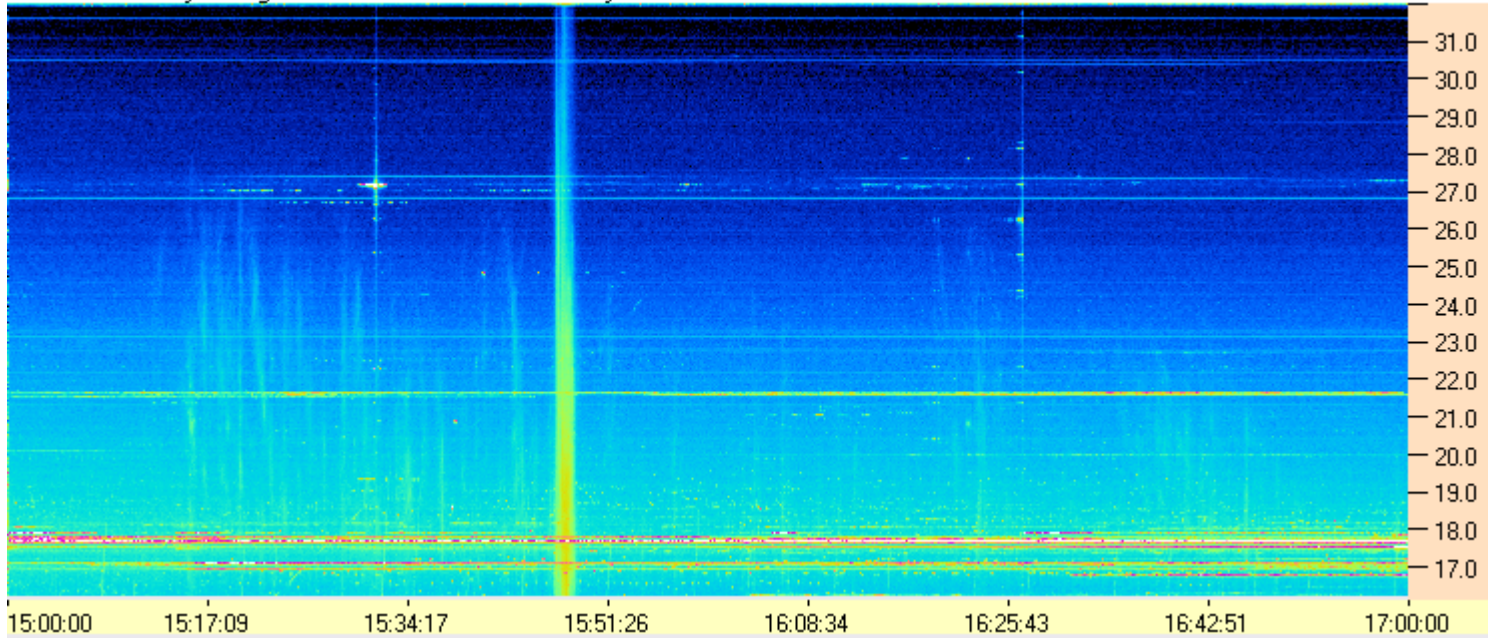

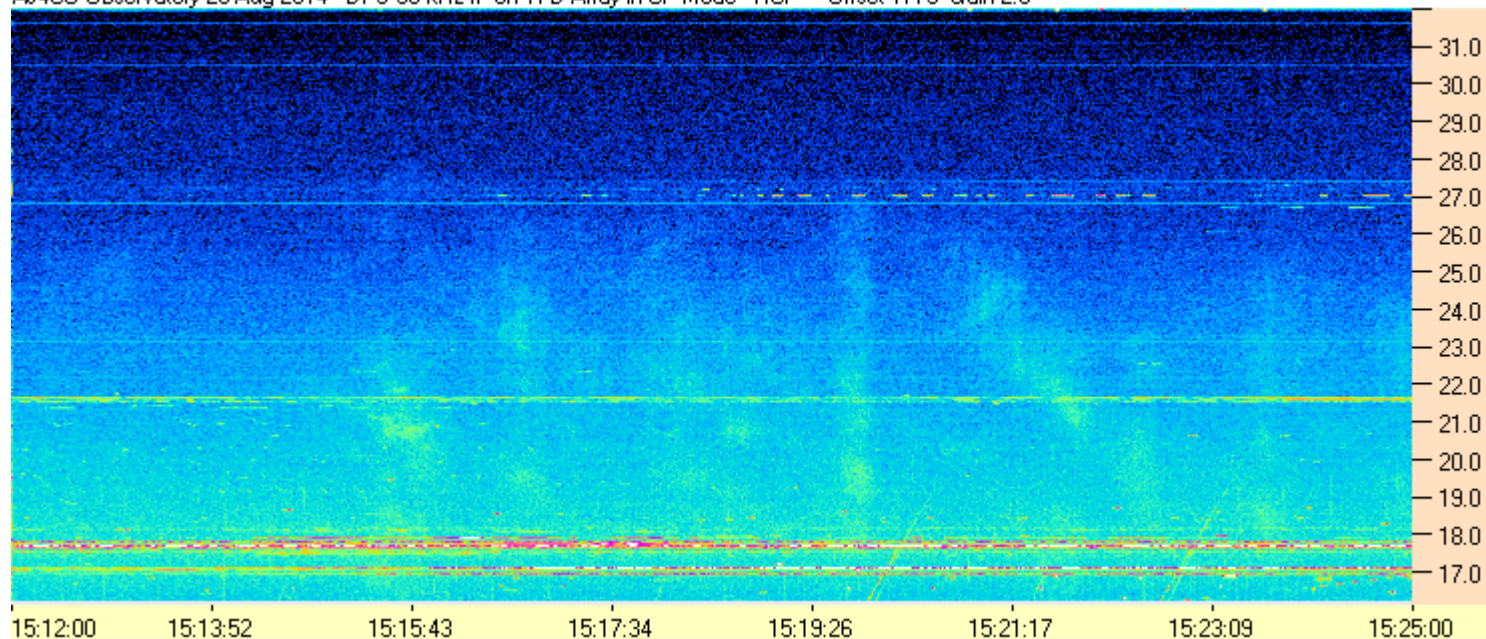

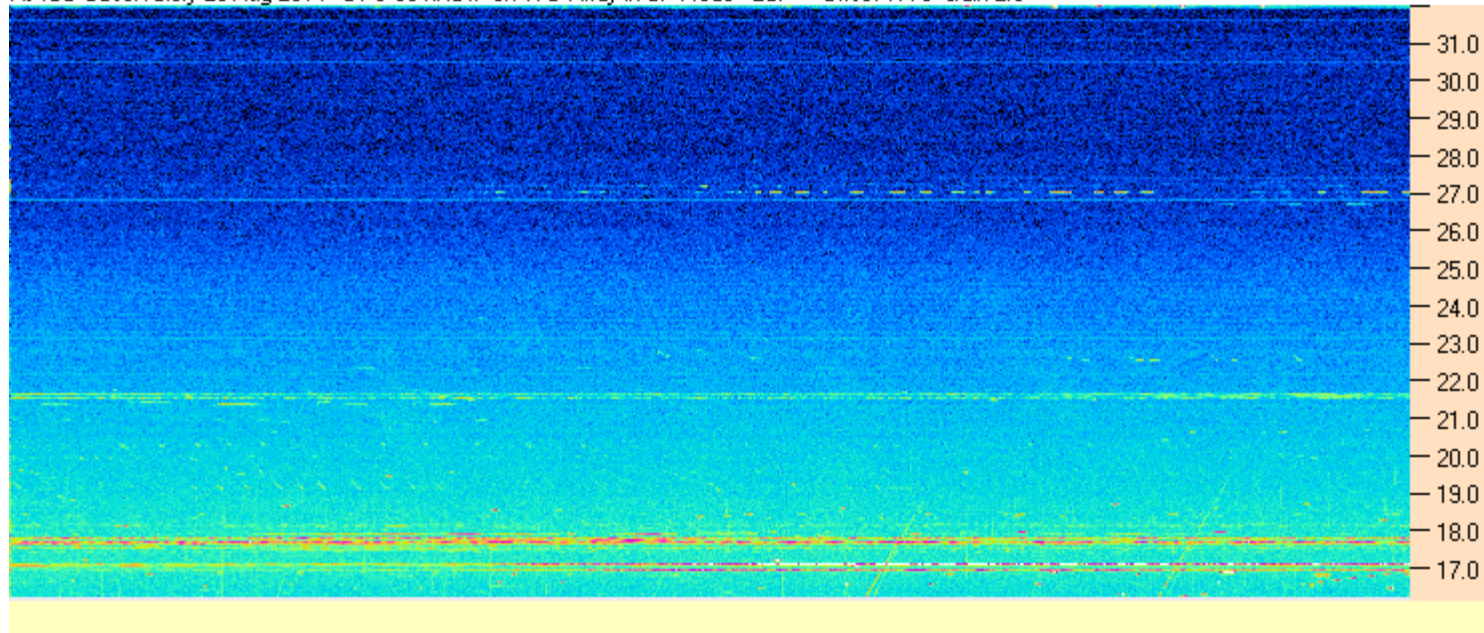

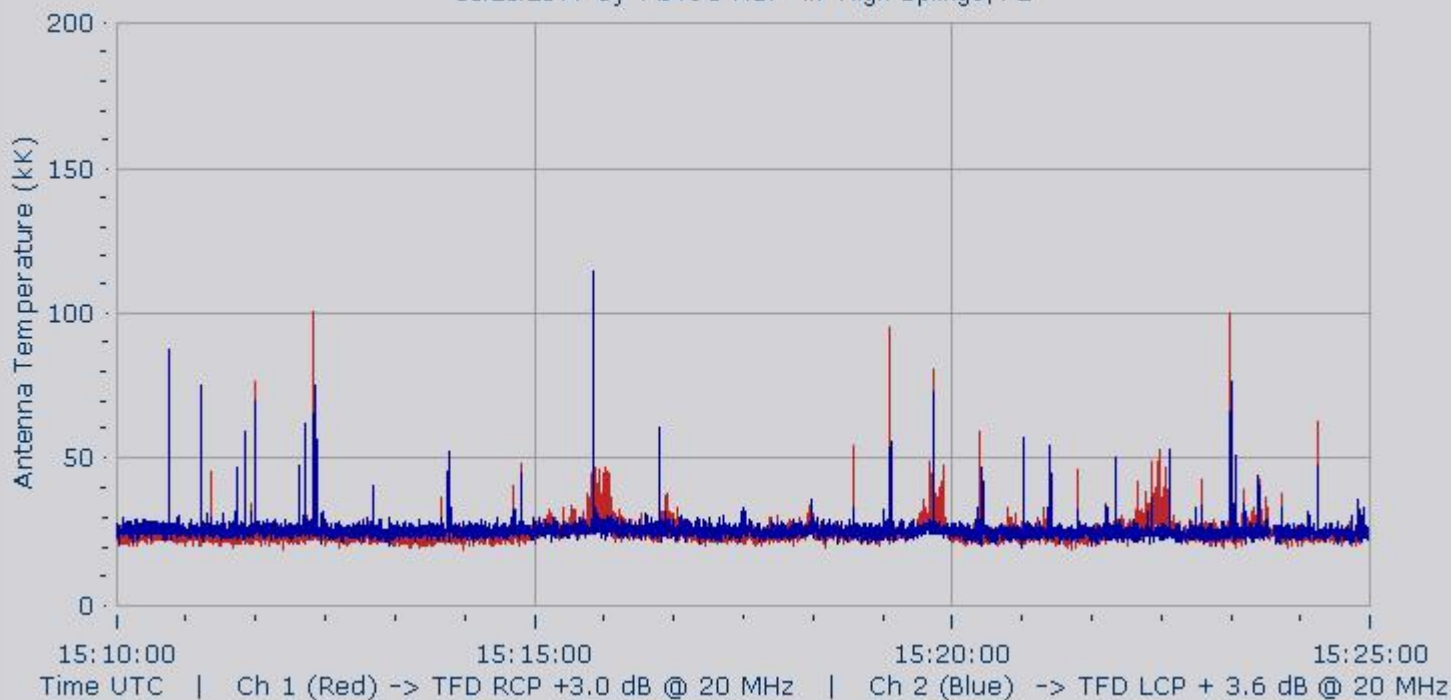
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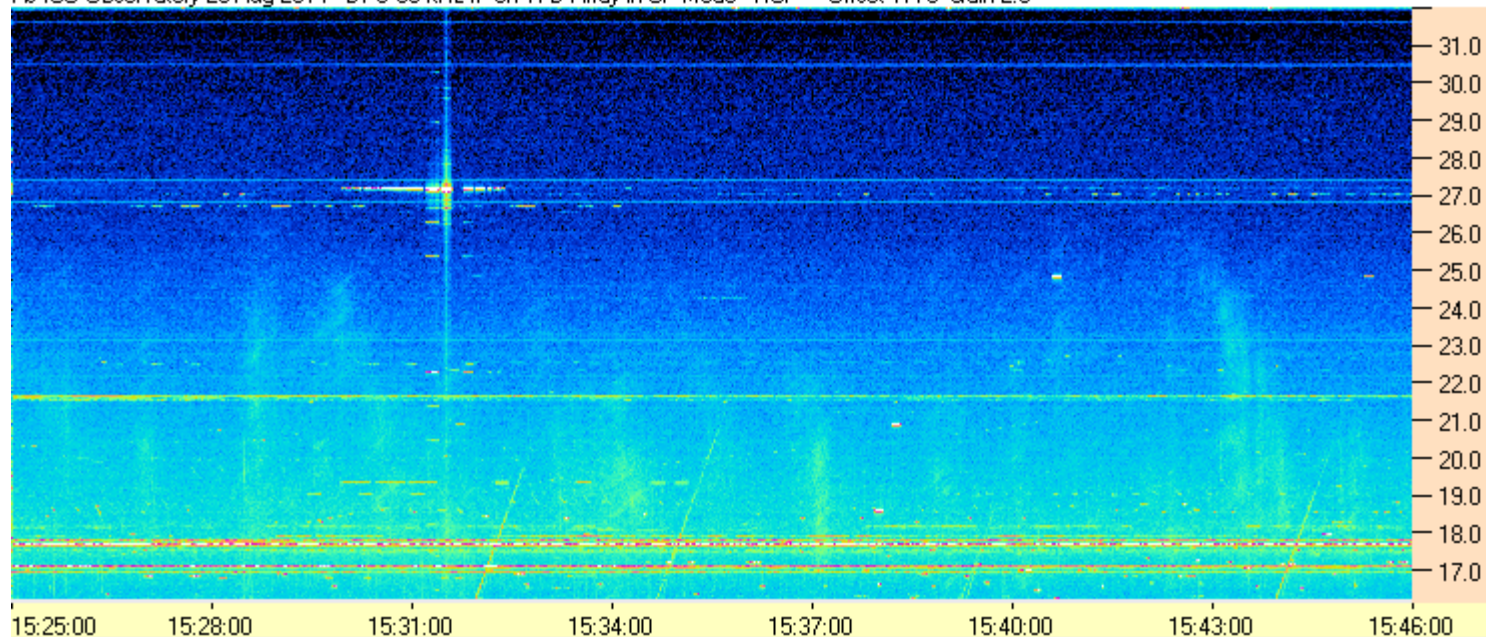
