RCP dominant L bursting observed from 17 to 25 MHz. No modulation lanes evident.

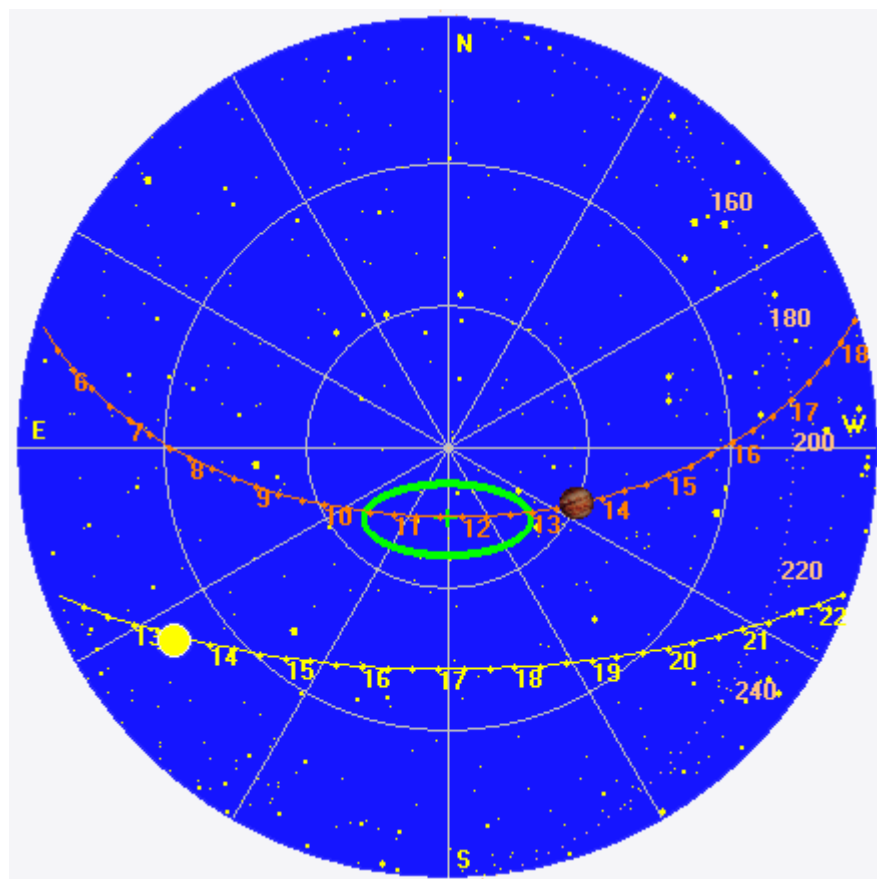
Jupiter was +23° to +30° off axis.

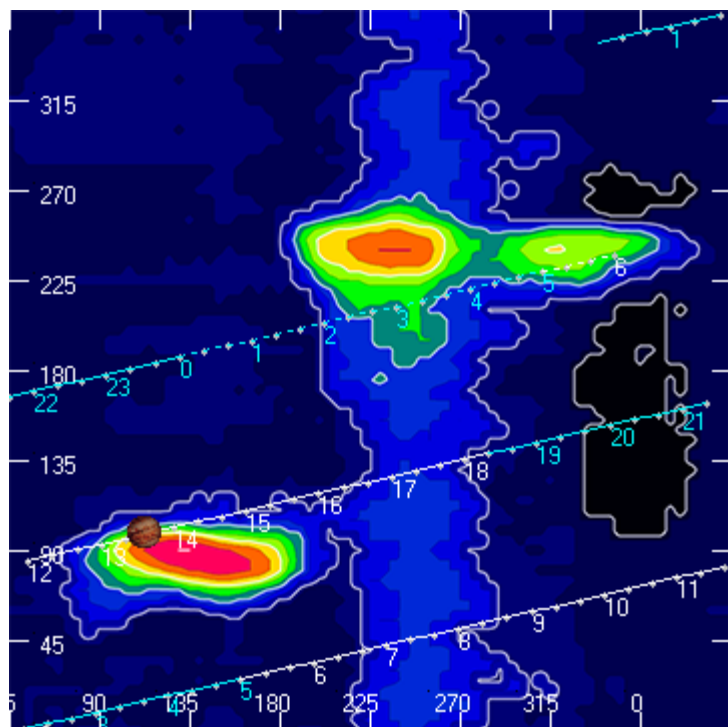
Jupiter was leading the Sun by 87°.

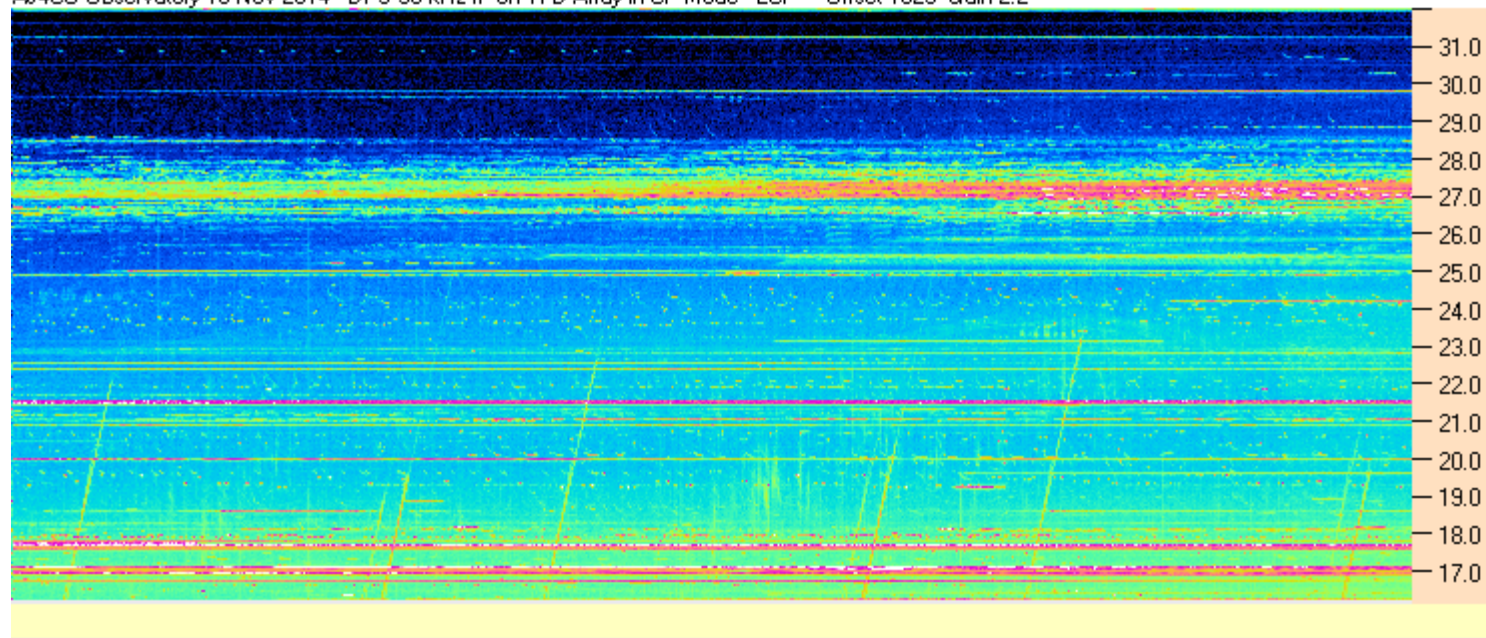


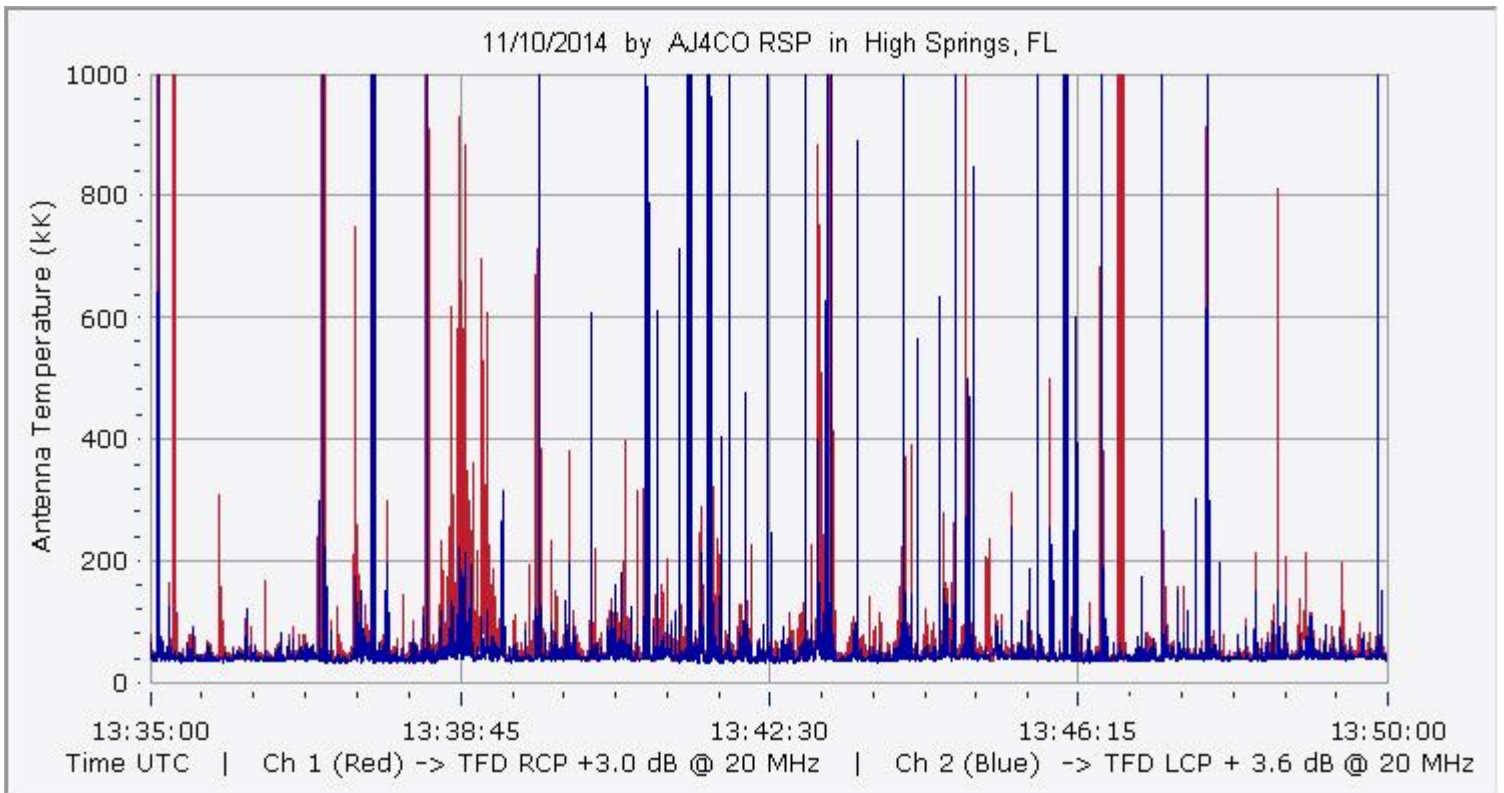

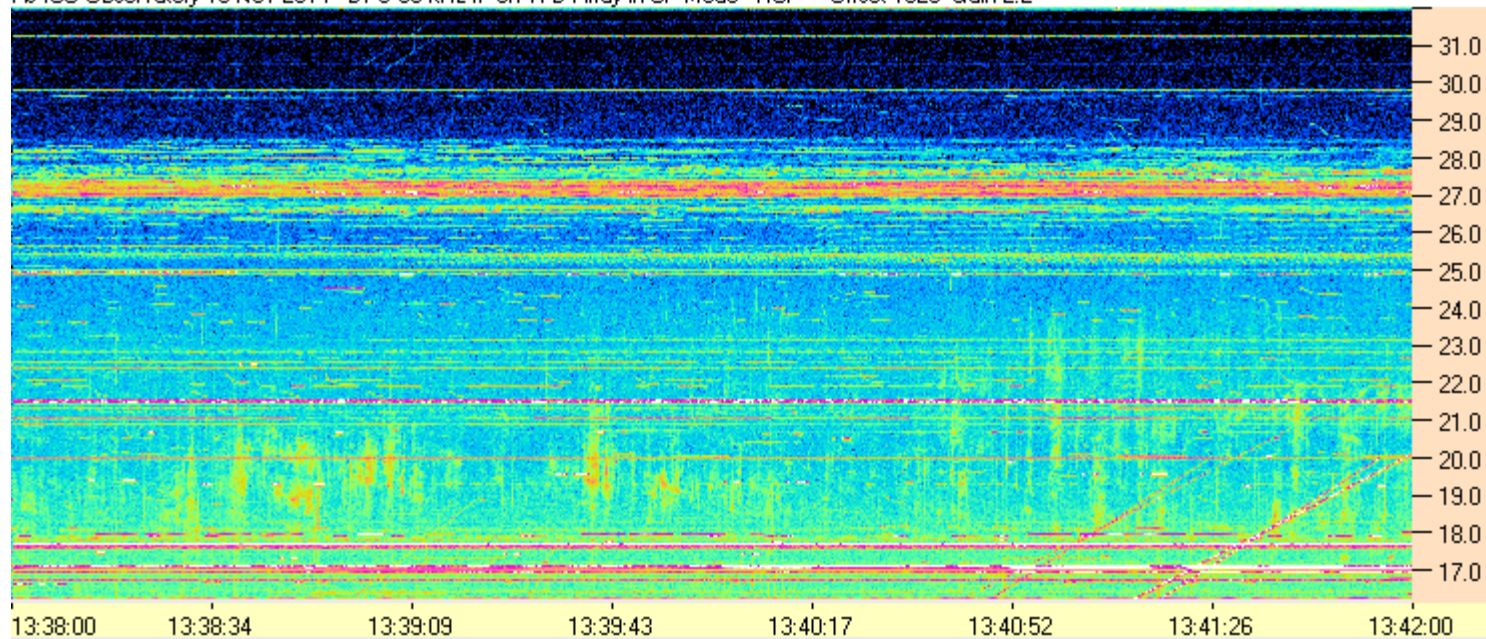
