RCP dominant L bursting from 16 to 28 MHz. No modulation lanes visible.

Lots of line noise due to a rapid temperature change -- temp went down to 25 °F that morning. Cold for Florida.

Strip charts only show how bad things can get, not Jupiter.

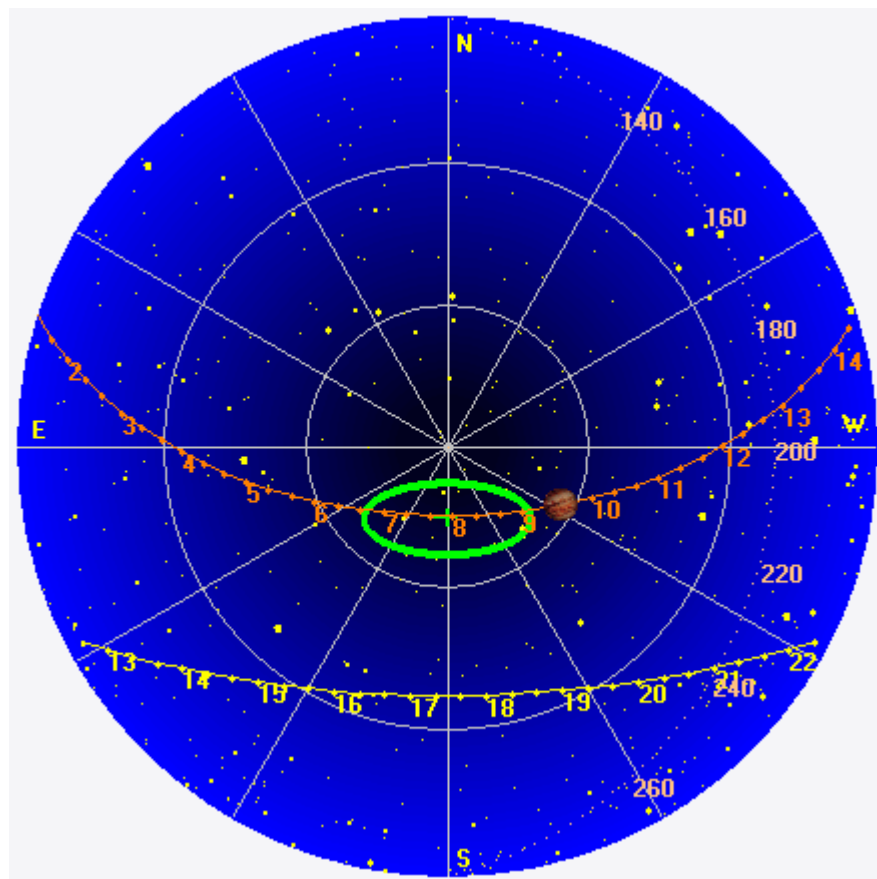
Jupiter was +19° to +28° off axis.

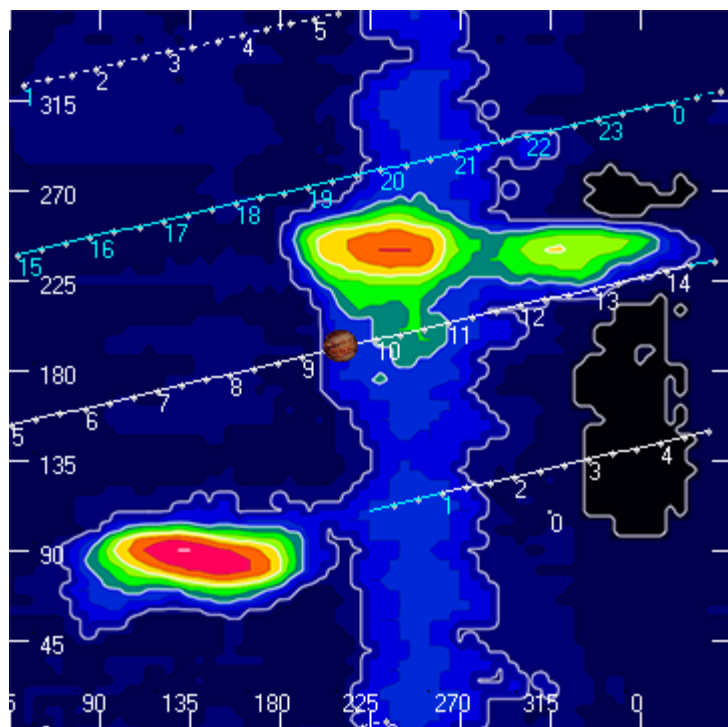
Jupiter was leading the Sun by 147°.

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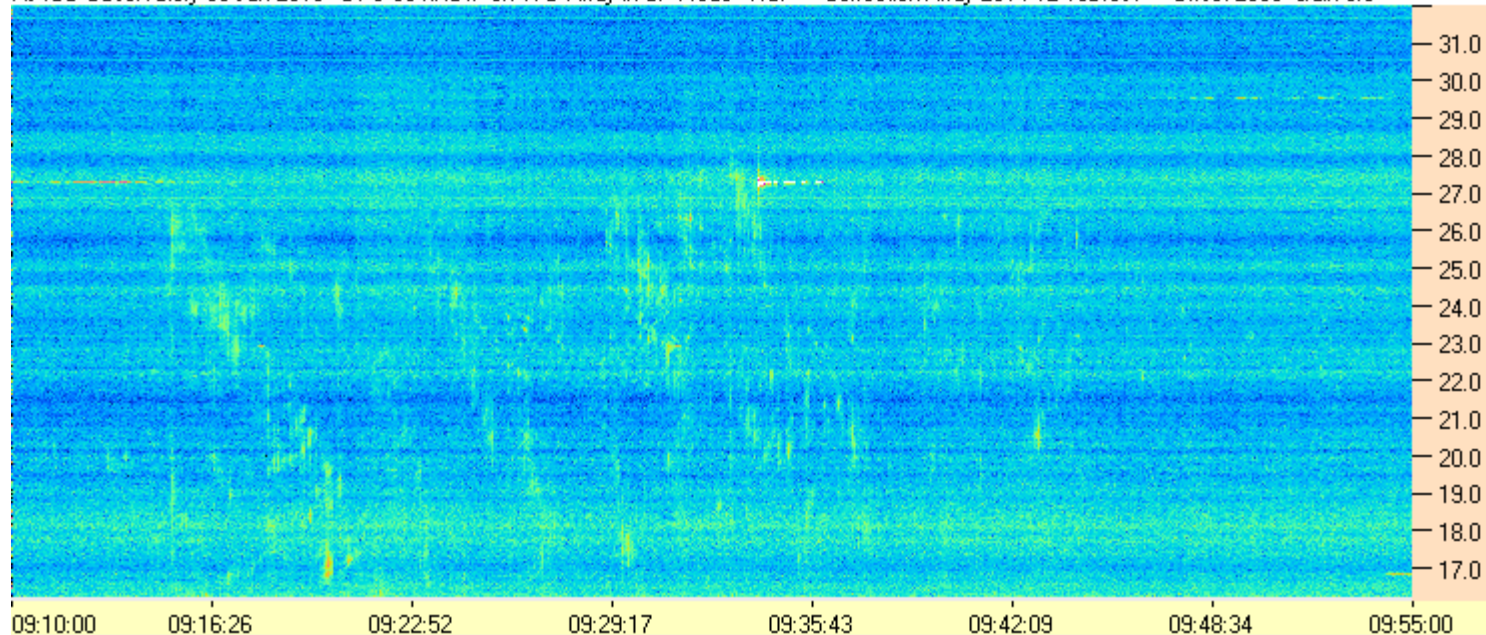

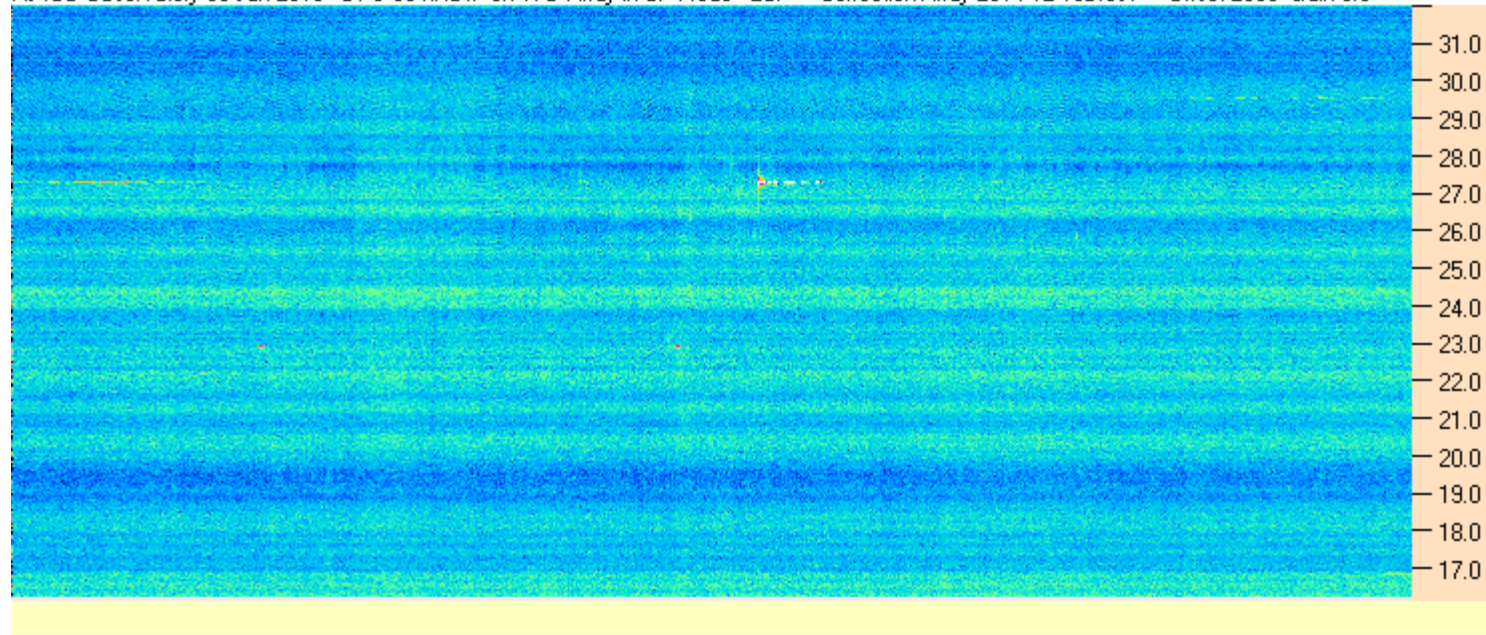


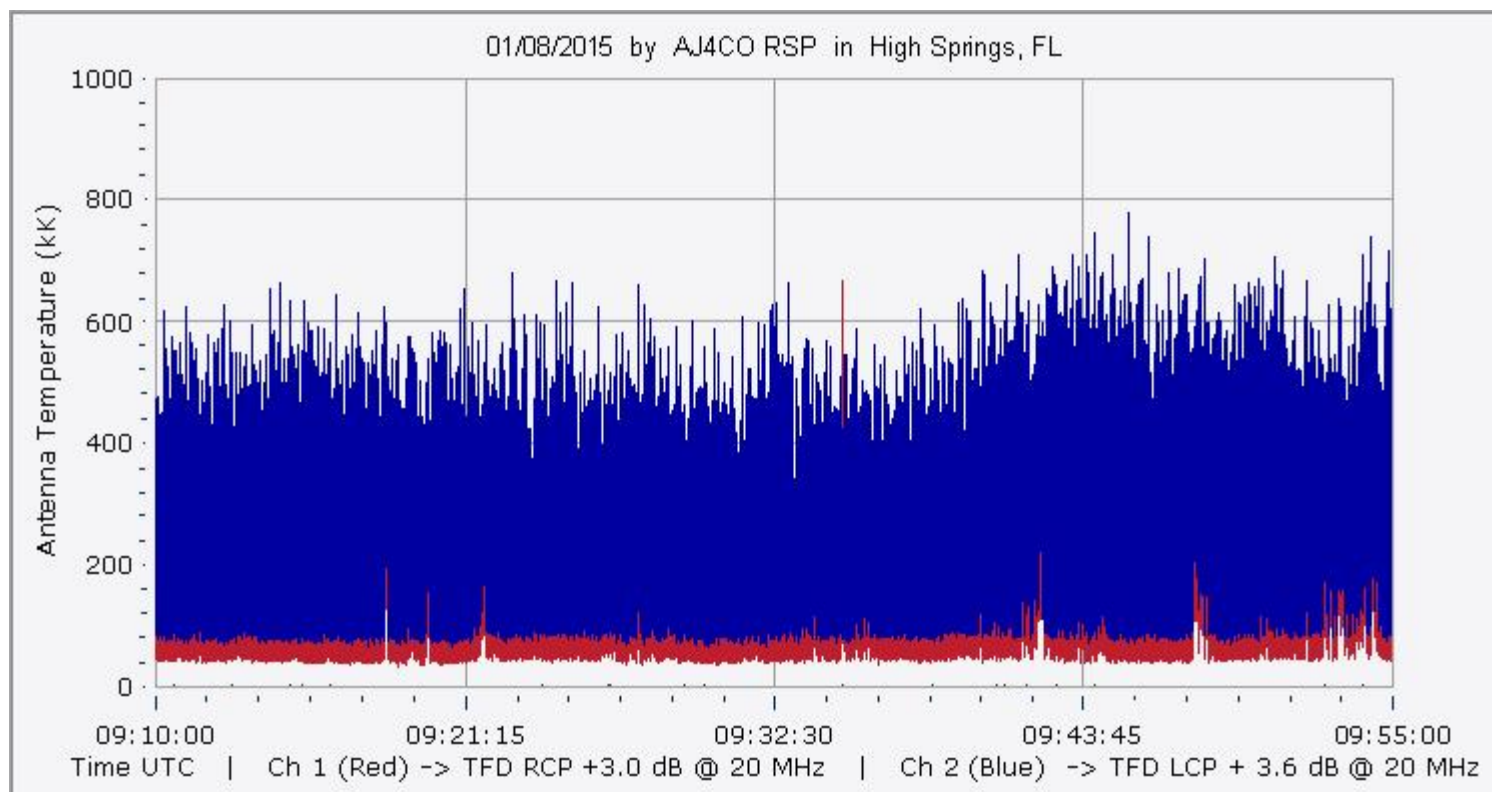

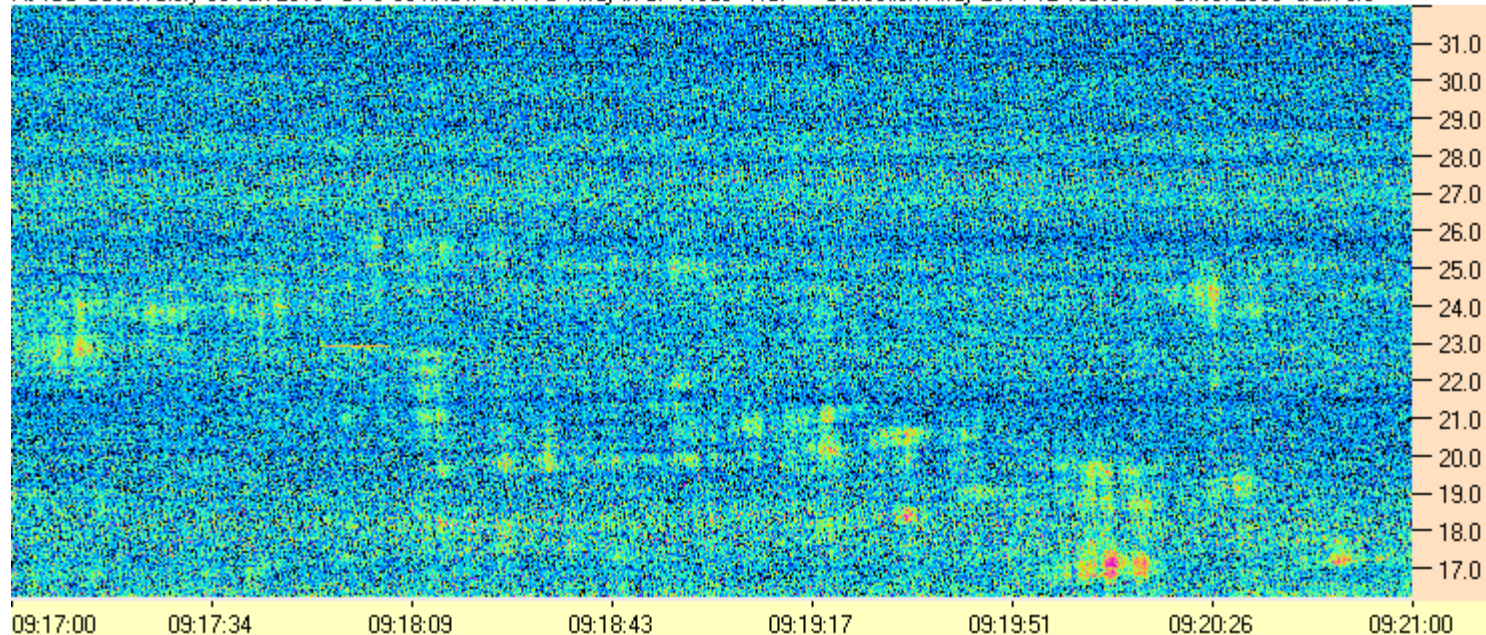
