Adding to Tom's nice report, here's some Io-B from Wednesday morning.

RCP dominant S bursting 0035-0227 UTC from 18 to 28 MHz, vertex early arc, no modulation lanes visible. Strong narrow banded S burst trains near 27 MHz at 0124 UTC.

RCP dominant L bursting 0111-0220 UTC from 16 to 22 MHz, vertex early arc, no modulation lanes visible.

No obvious LCP Io-D component to this storm.

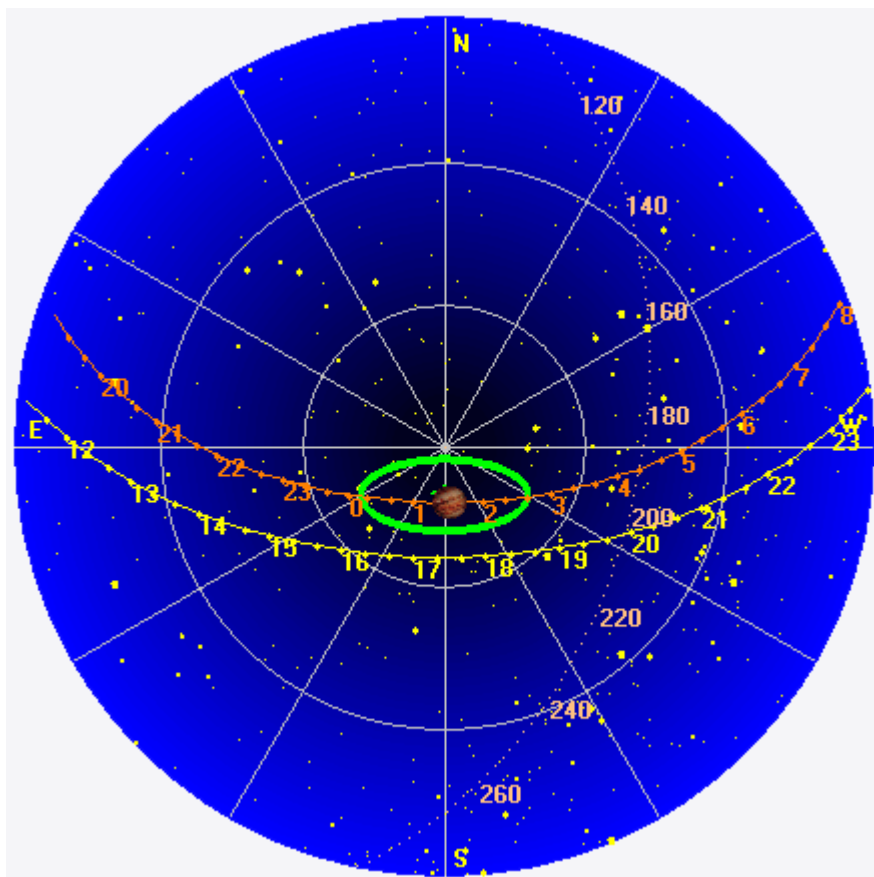
Jupiter was -13° to $+14^\circ$ off axis.

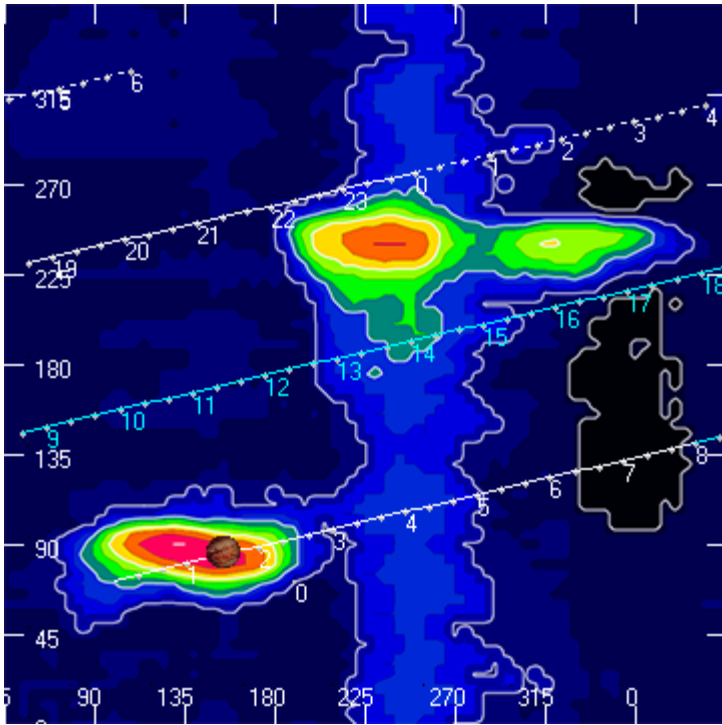
Jupiter was trailing the Sun by 115° .

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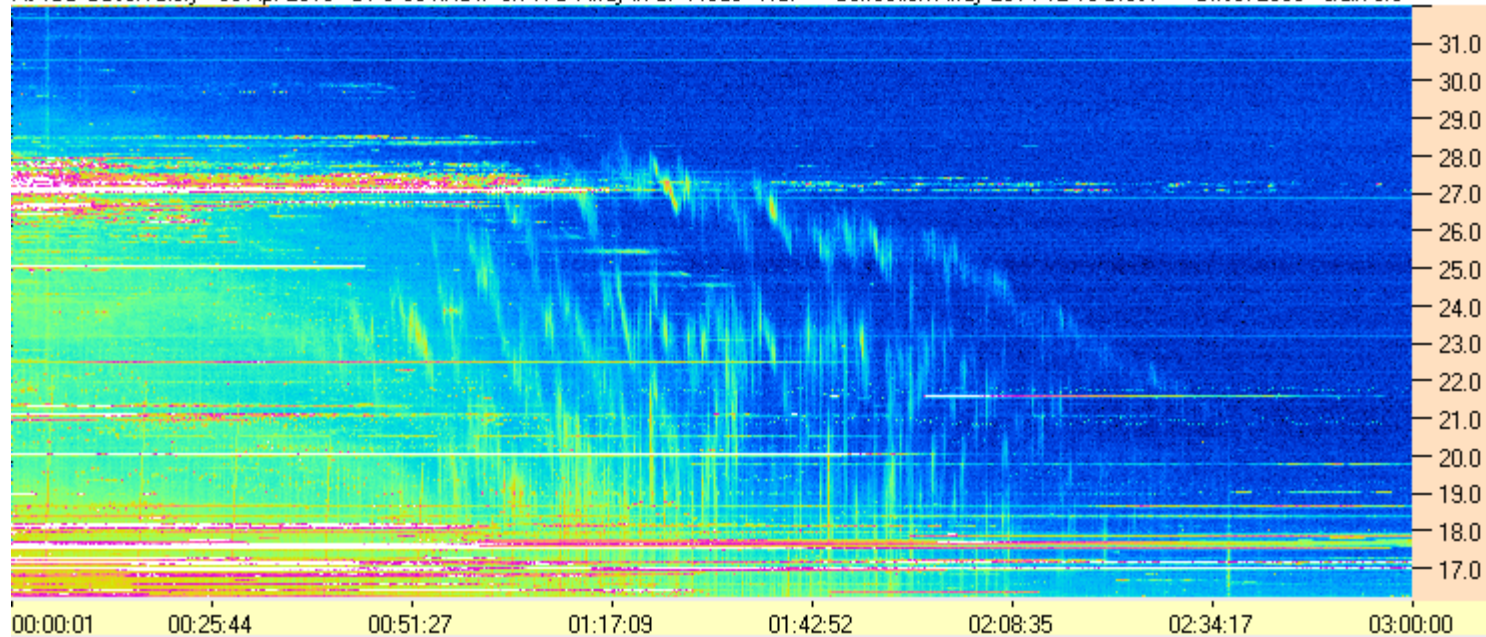

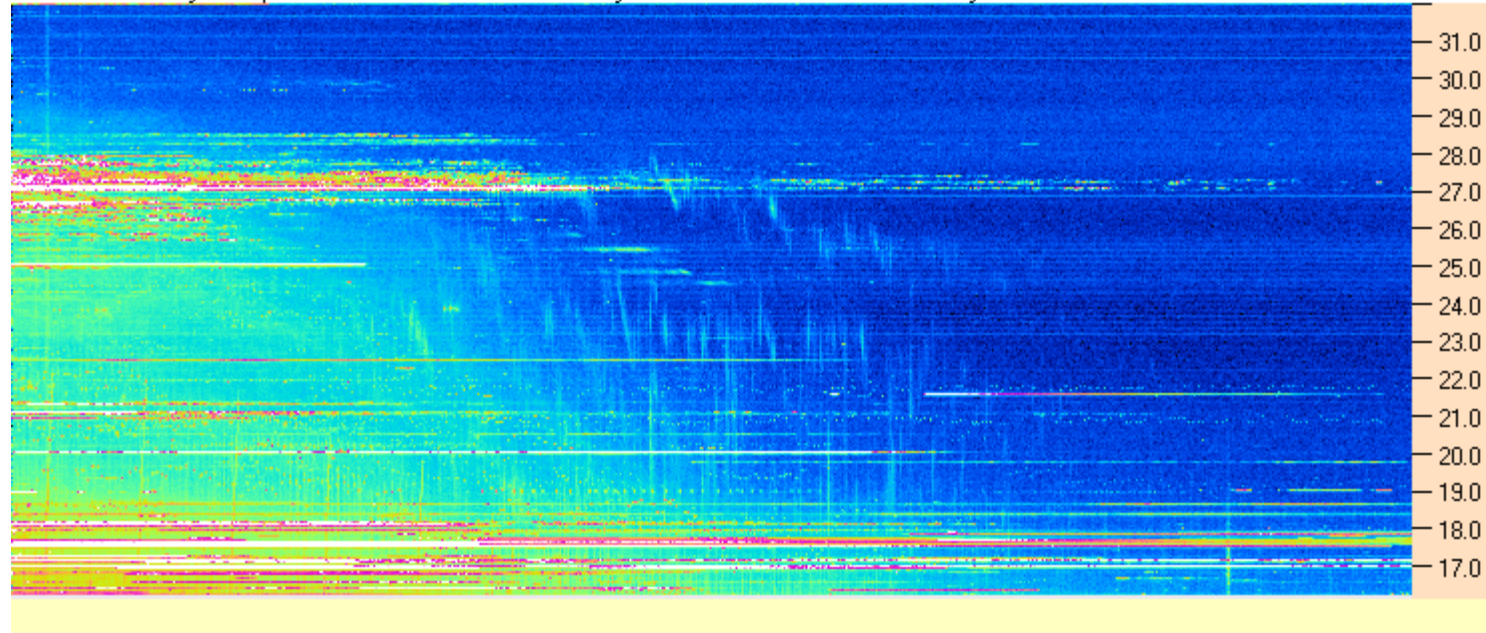
