Here's some weak Io-D from Tuesday afternoon.

LCP dominant narrow band S bursting 1833-2003 UTC from 16 to 24 MHz, vertex early arc. No modulation lanes evident.

Strip chart was pretty useless from thunderstorms and brief bursts of line noise. Nevertheless, the Io-D arc in LCP is visible.

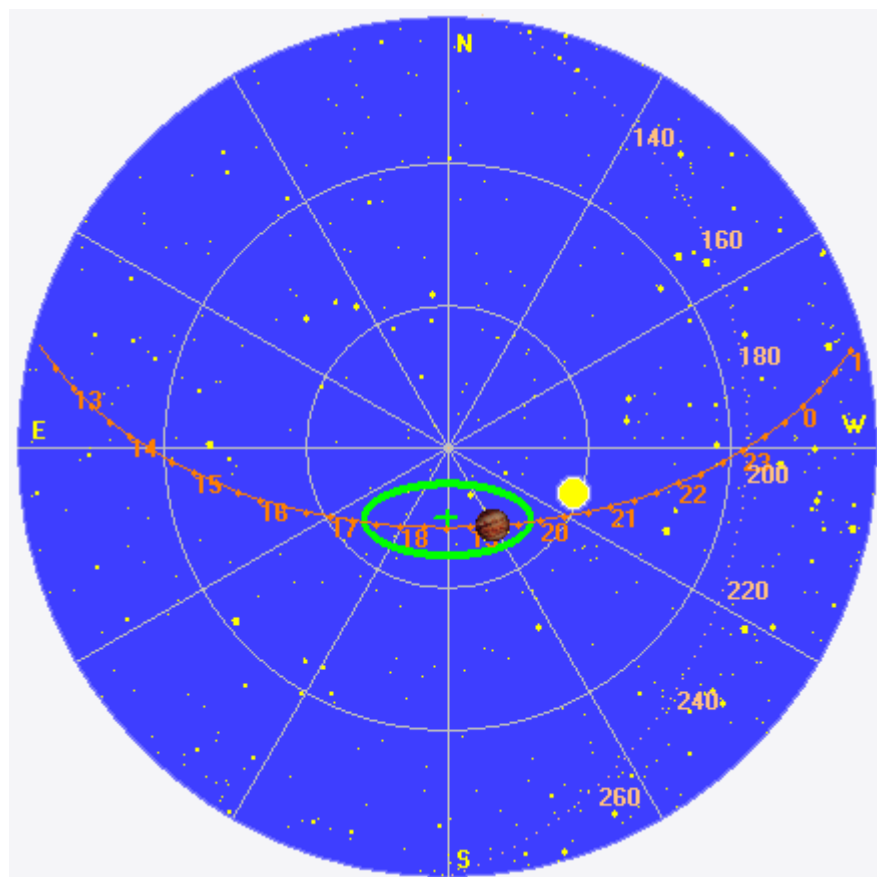
Jupiter was -3° to $+20^\circ$ off axis.

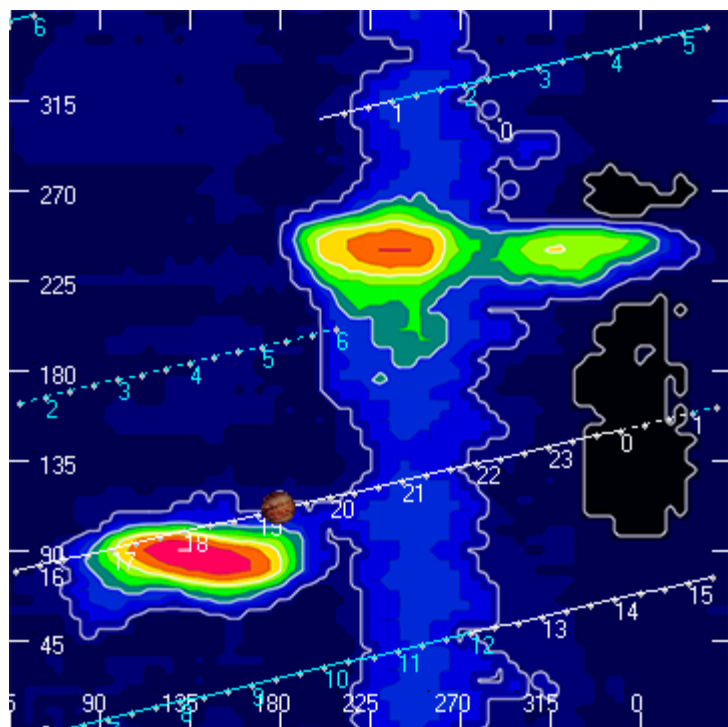
Jupiter was trailing the Sun by 17° .

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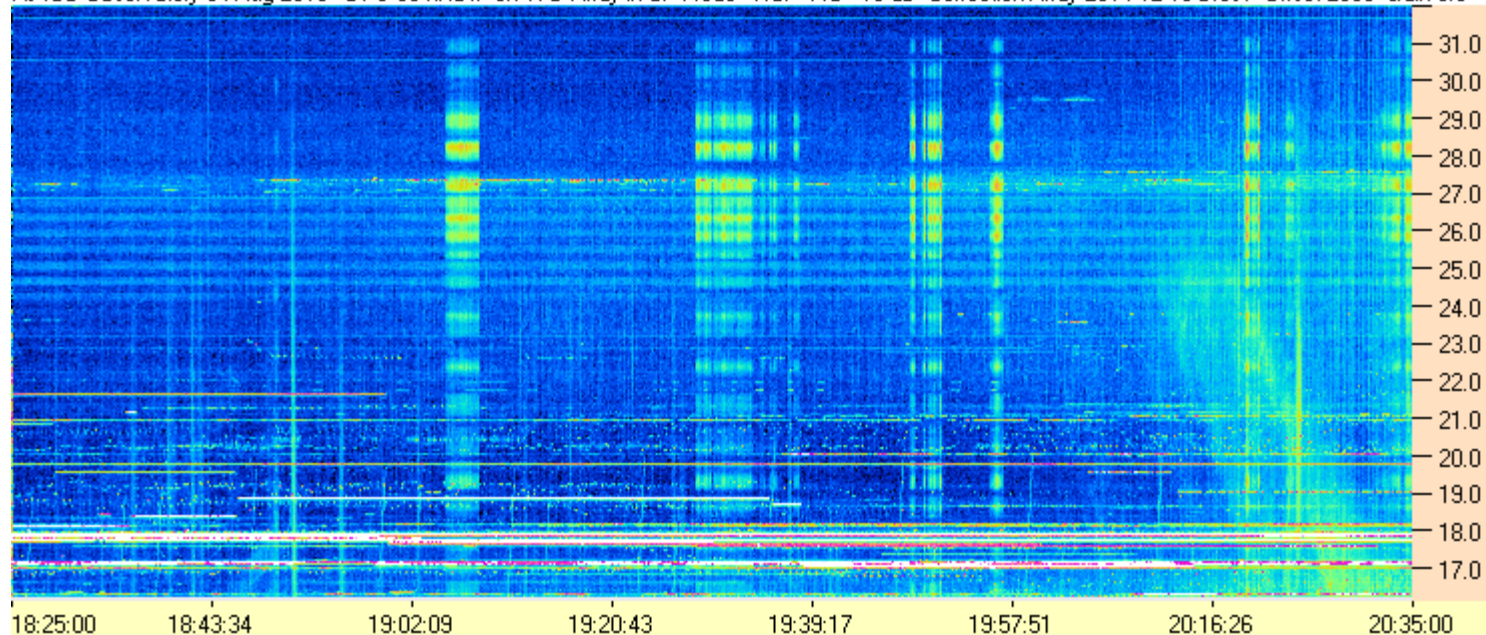
