RCP dominant L bursting 0759-0924 UTC from 16 to 28 MHz, positive (non-Io-B) then negative (non-Io-A) drift envelope, no modulation lanes visible.

LCP dominant L bursting 0826-0921 UTC from 16 to 26 MHz, positive (non-Io-D) drift envelope, no modulation lanes visible.

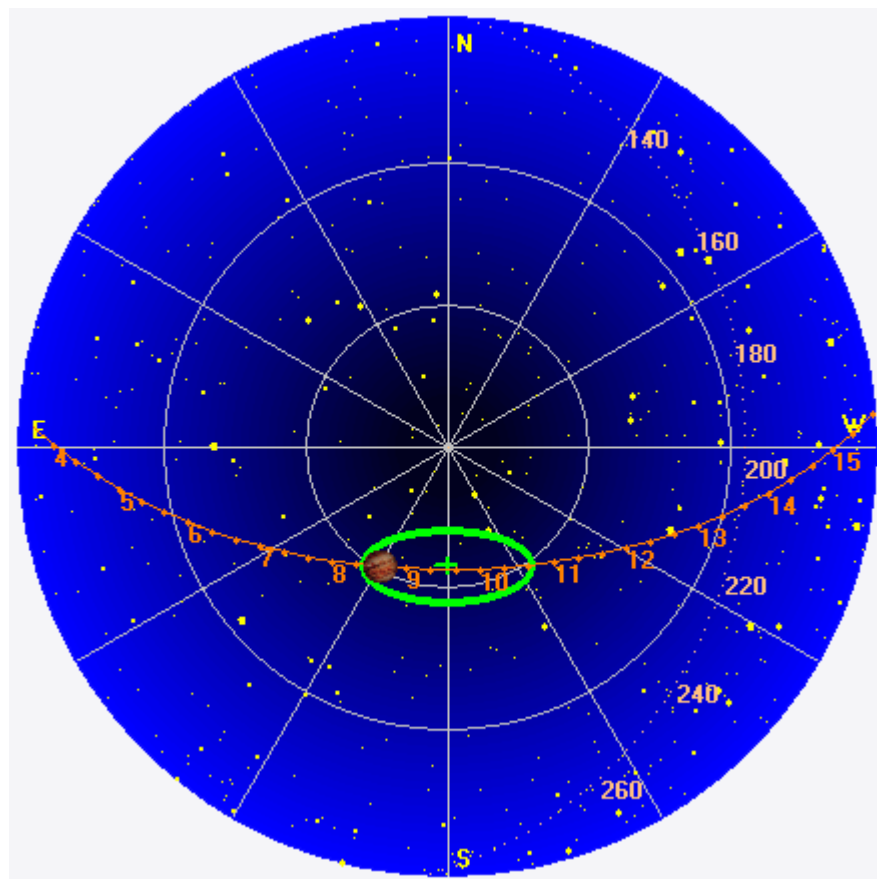
Jupiter was -24° to -3° off axis.

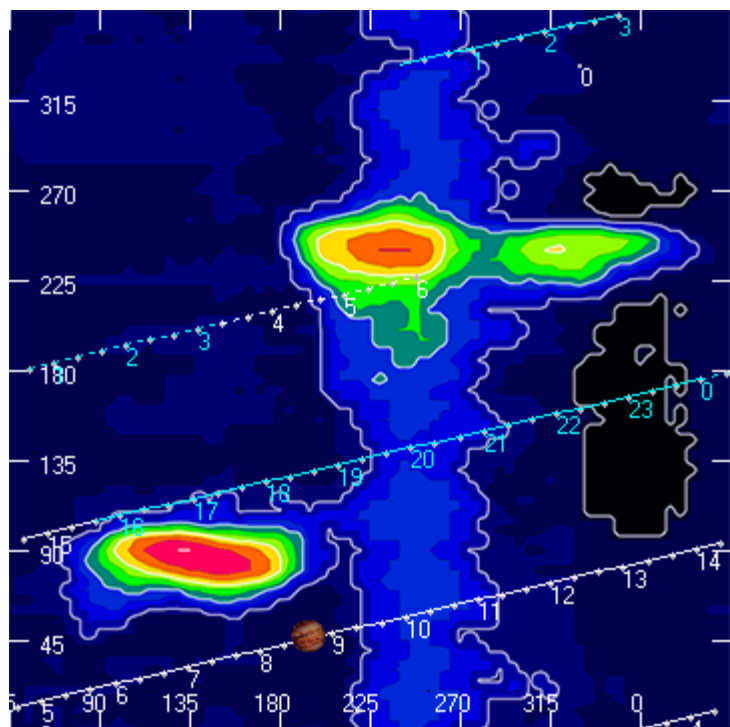
Jupiter was leading the Sun by 120° .

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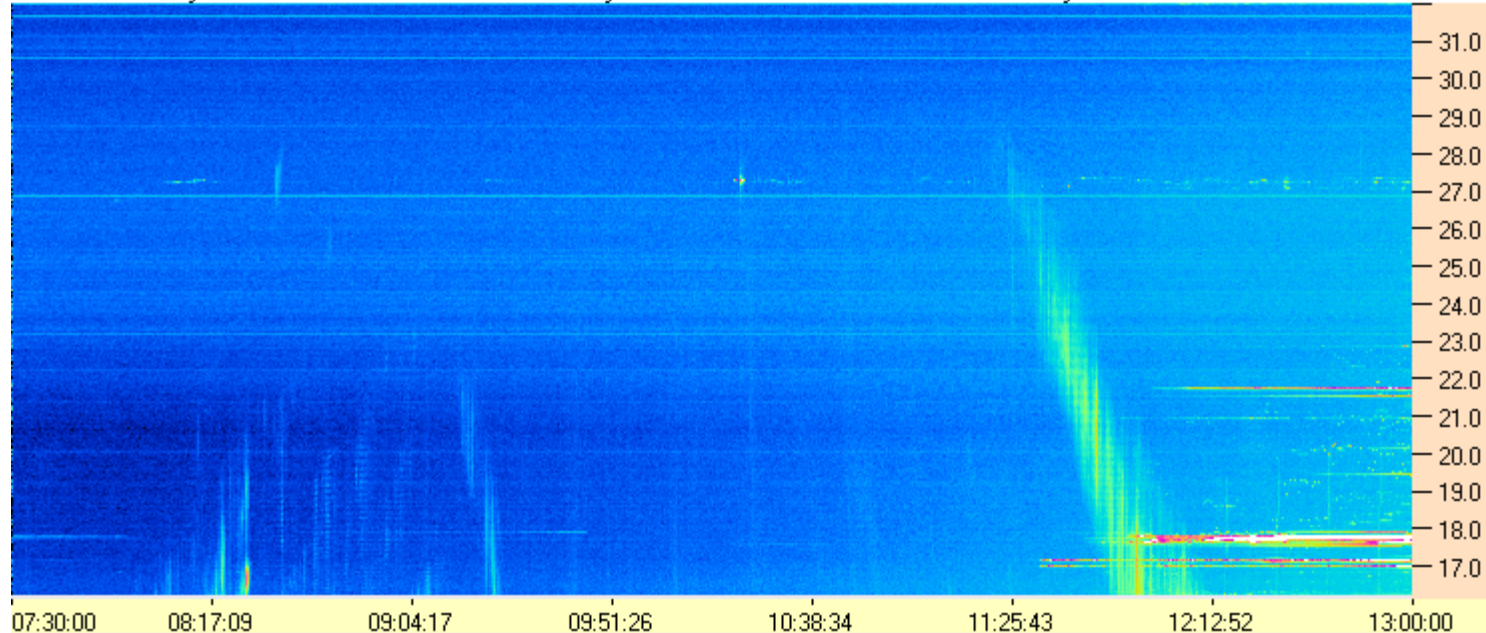

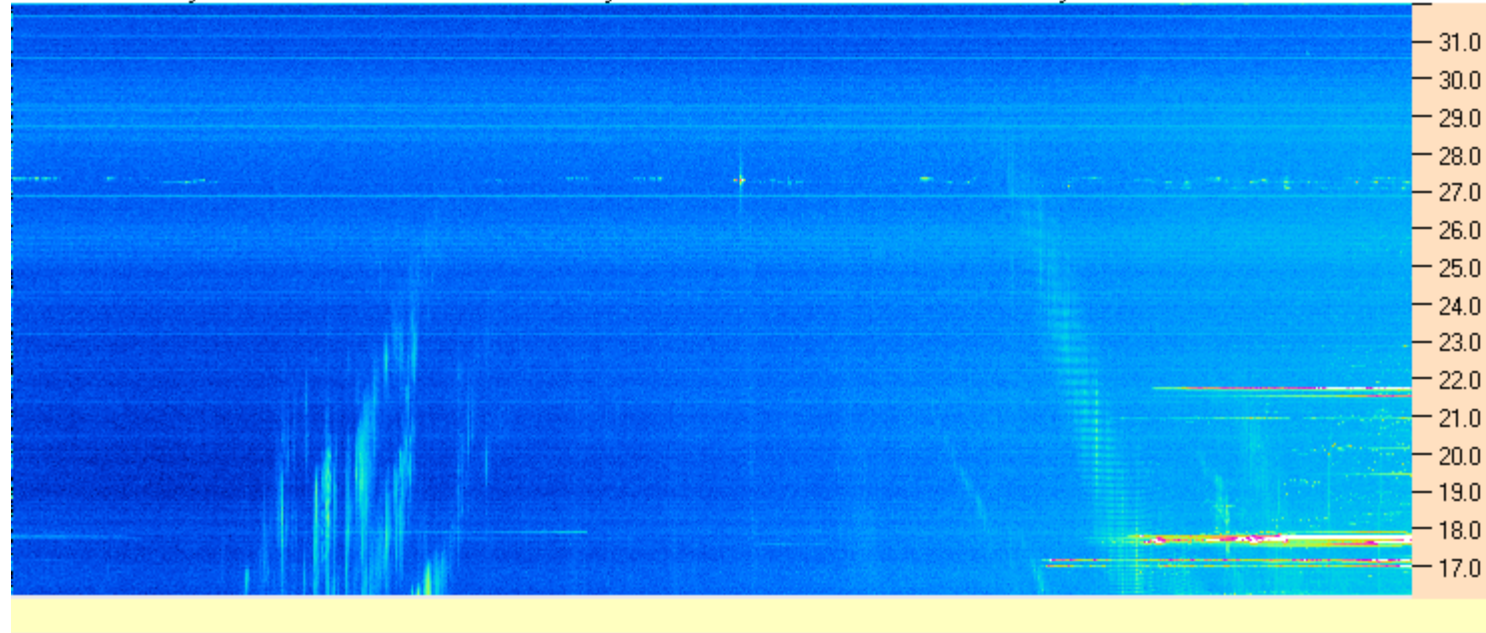




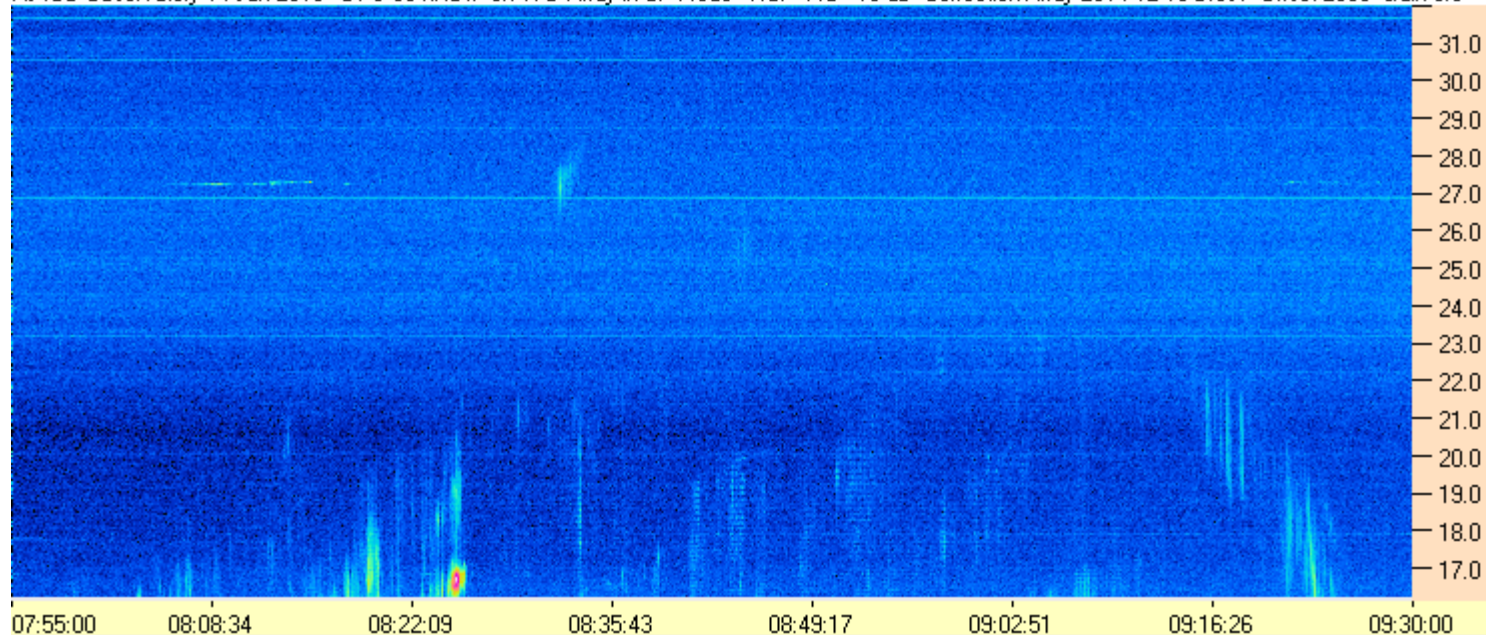
