RCP dominant L bursting 1122-1210 UTC from 16 to 29 MHz, negative (non-Io-A) drift envelope, no modulation lanes visible.

LCP dominant L bursting 1106-1233 UTC from 16 to 21 MHz, negative (non-Io-C) drift envelope, no modulation lanes visible.

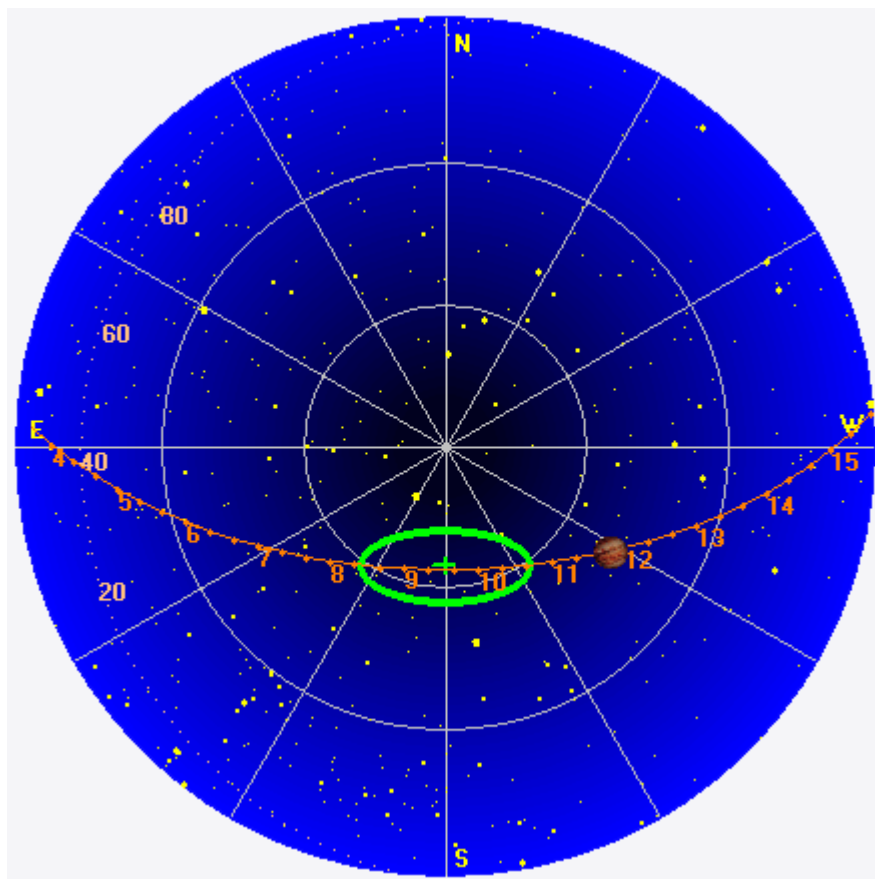
Jupiter was $+23^\circ$ to $+45^\circ$ off axis.

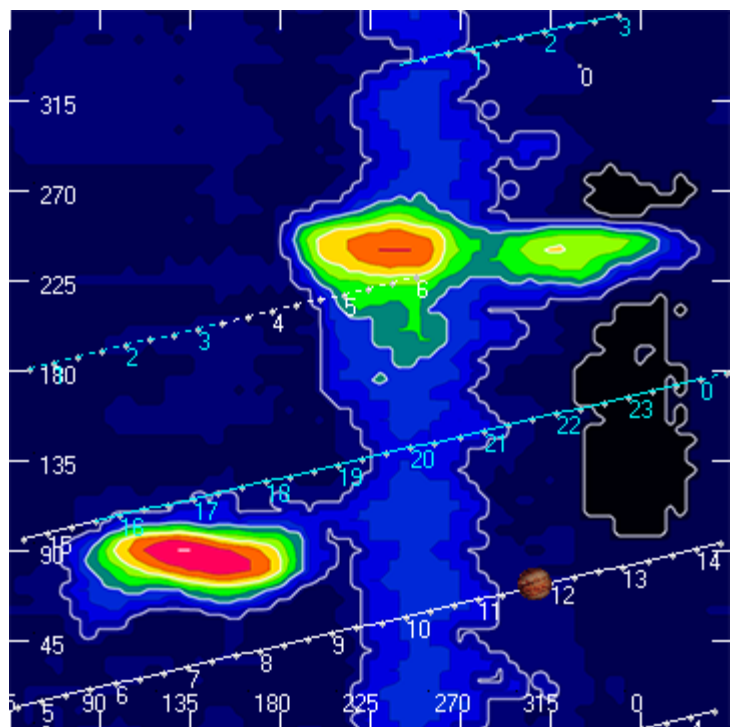
Jupiter was leading the Sun by 121° .

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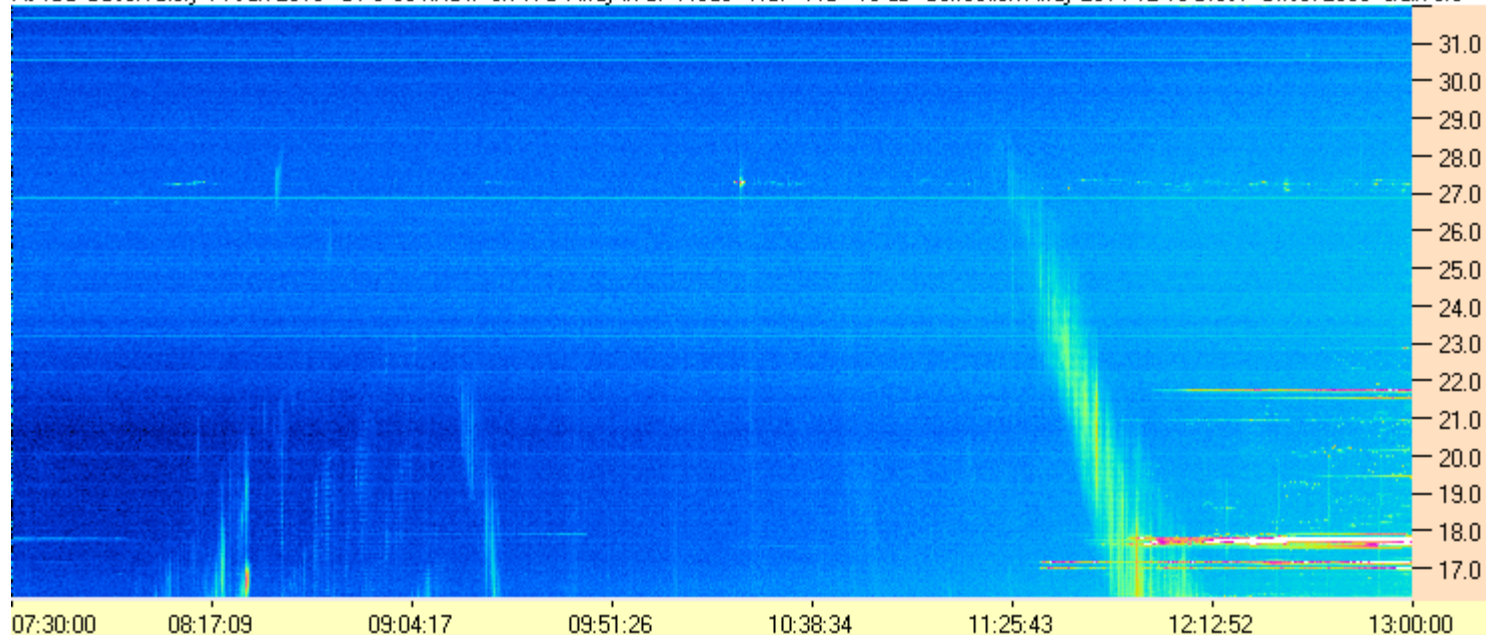

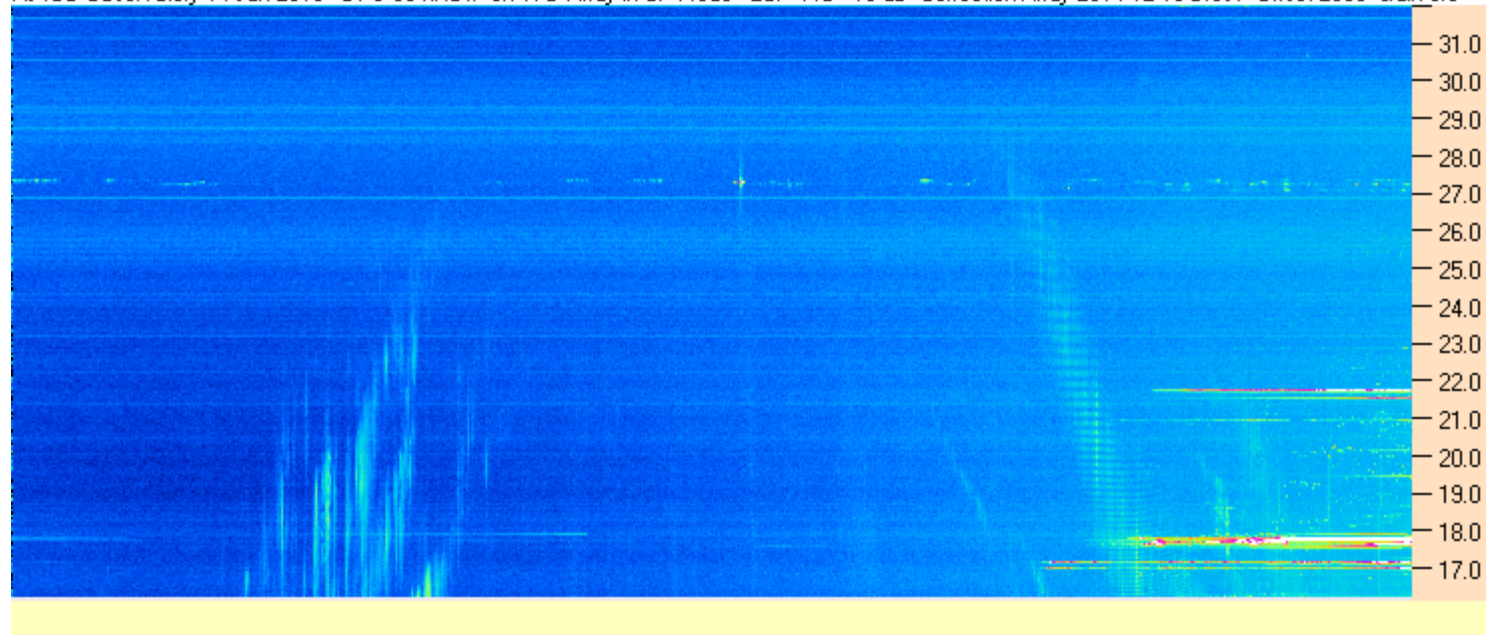




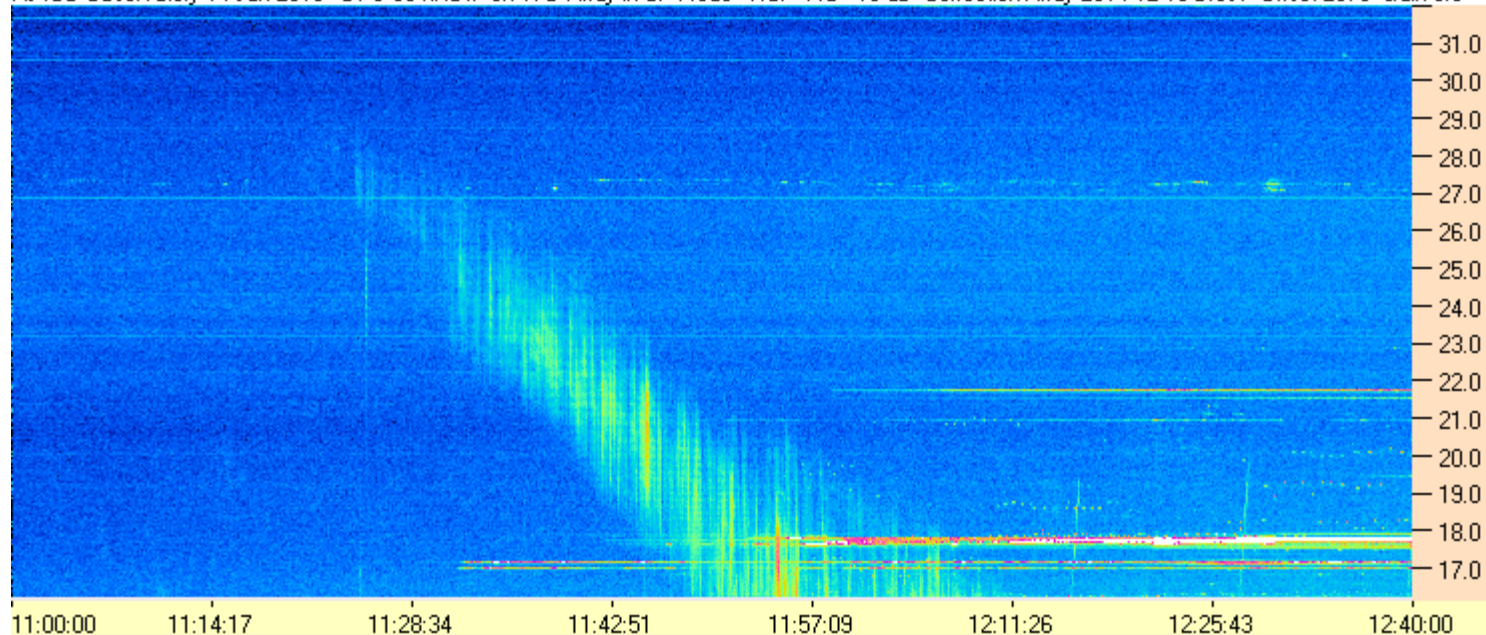
