The whole event was buried in band noise; only way to see it was with the polarization comparison trick.

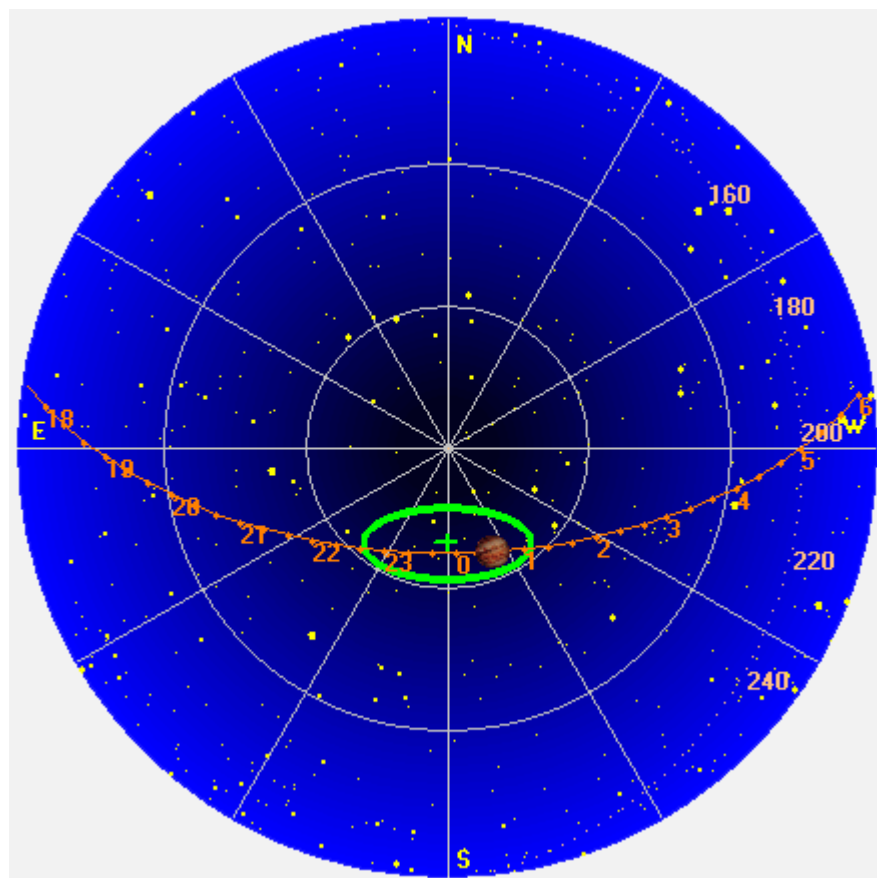
Jupiter was $+4^\circ$ to $+14^\circ$ off axis.

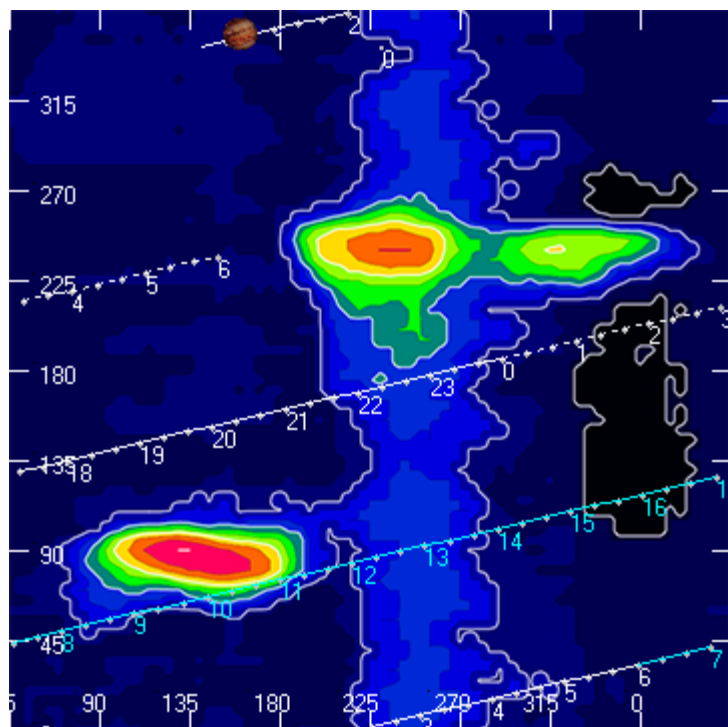
Jupiter was trailing the Sun by 94° .

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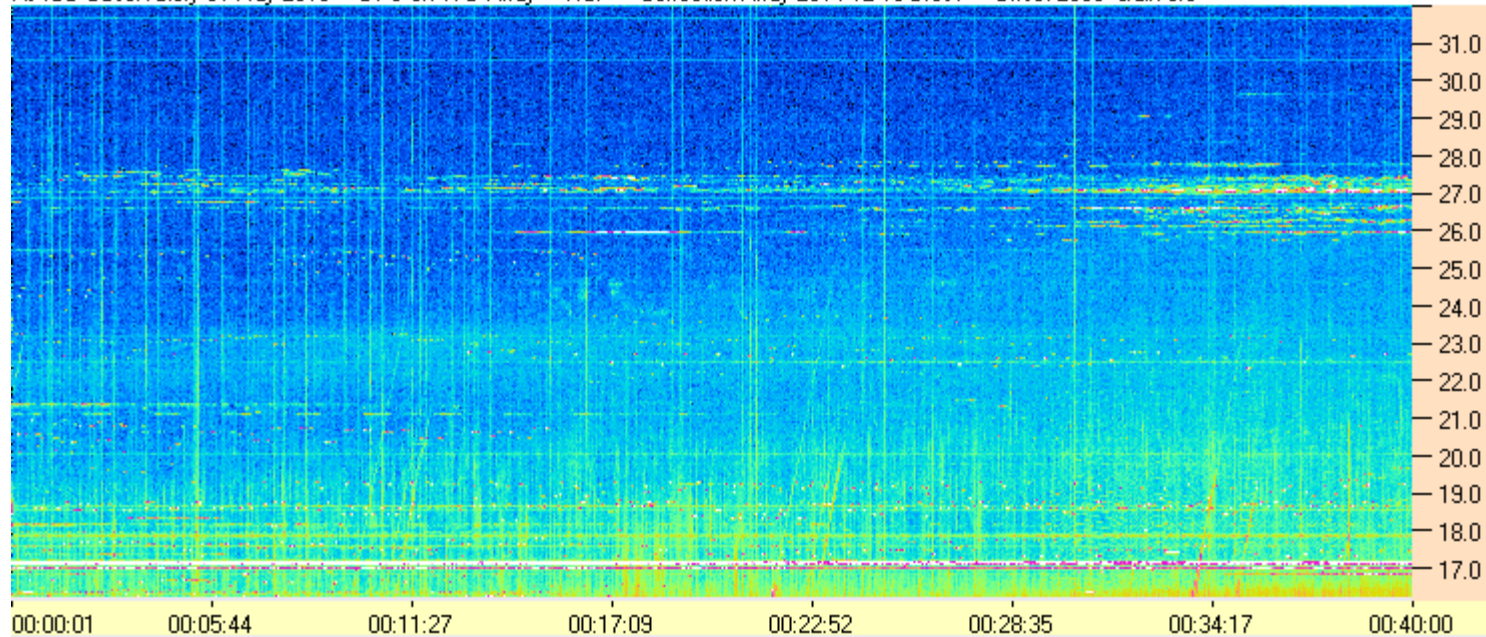

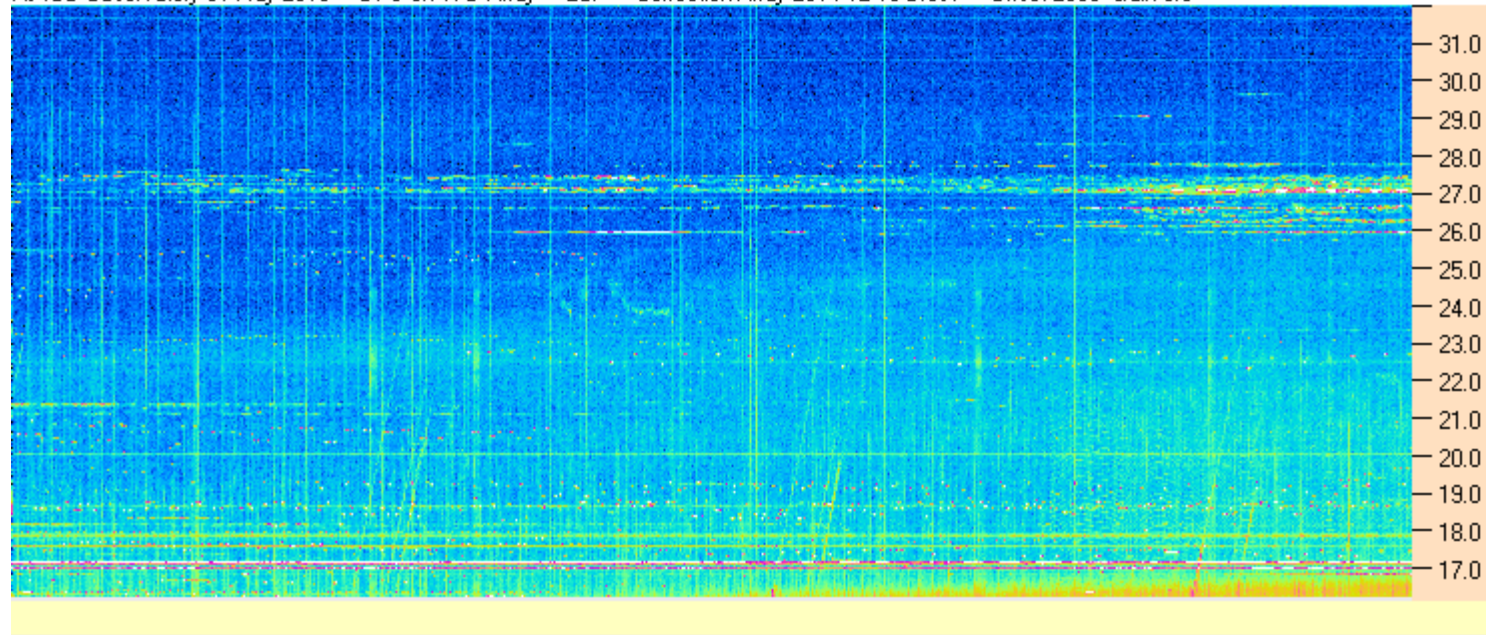




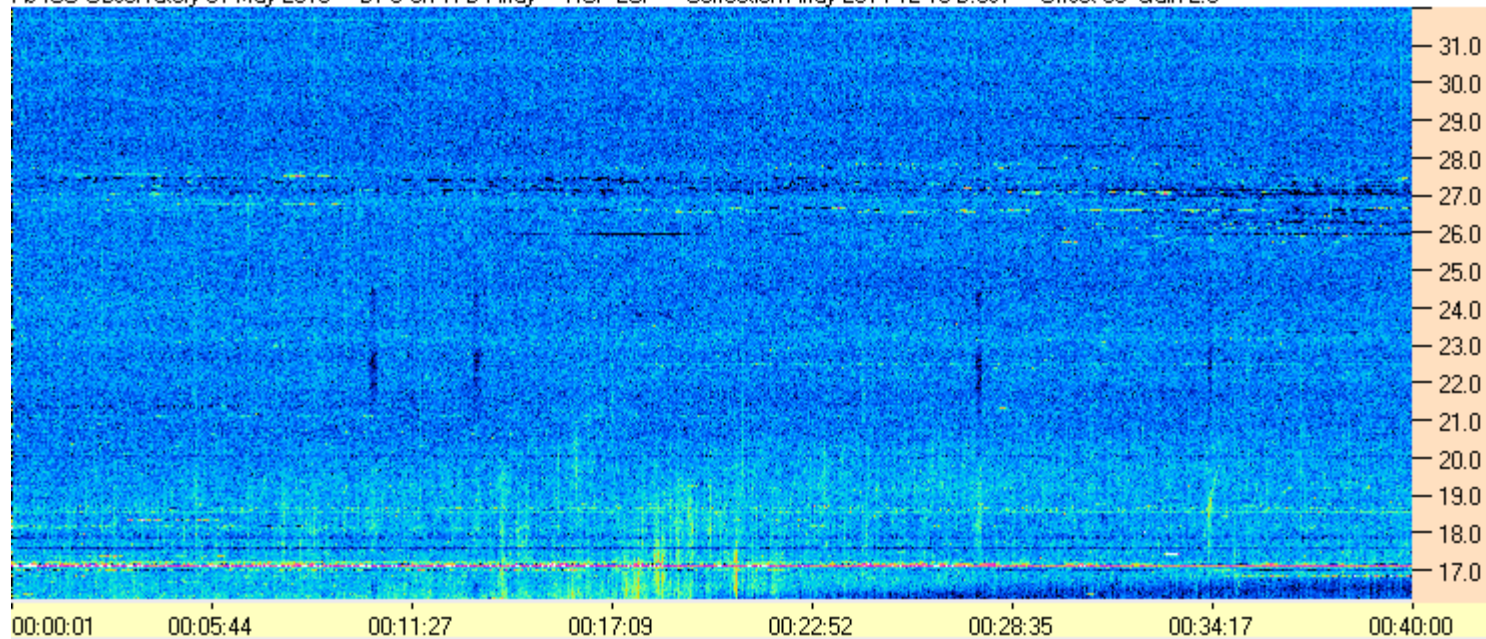
